Since the last **Contact Sheet** I've had a busy month consuming photography. Having previously viewed FUTUREPROOF 2022 at **Stills**, for the first time since Covid, I travelled to Glasgow to view the **Street Level Photoworks** component of FUTUREPROOF, and enjoyed the in-person artist talks. Later in the month, I combined skiing on Carngorm with a visit to Inverness for the a **Northern Cell** meeting at Eden Court. There, I took in the **RPS Scotland Members Exhibition**, where **Douglas Thompson's** prints stood out, and I also visited **Matt Sillars's** excellent Duntelchaig show.

The three exhibitions at Edinburgh's City Art Centre continue to delight, and I've made repeated visits. I also attended the related Photography and Memory Symposium hosted by Napier University. The highlights for me were: Jenny Brownrigg – Glean; Michael Schoefield - Coastal Erosion, War Ruins; Sophie Gerrard - Drawn to the Land; Emile Shemilt - South Georgia -Whaling; Sarah M Lepson - Posthumous Photographs of Children; Ron O'Donnell - Old Edinburgh: New Ideas; and Norman McBeath - Box Rooms and Dark Rooms.

Edinburgh Photographic Society continued their series of high quality talks with **Patricia Macdonald** Telling Overstories- The work of the Aerographica Partnership.

Scottish Photographers North Report, January Meeting

This was our first face to face meeting in our new venue – the free community table at Eden Court Theatre. Eden Court is also host to the FLOW Photofest Exhibition Wall currently showing 'For the love of it". We were fortunate enough to hold our meeting whilst the RPS Scottish Touring Exhibition was on, featuring work of *Scottish Photographers North* members, Mairi Macaulay, Mike Tibbs and Alastair Cochrane. We also welcomed 3 new members, Caitlin Prentice, Duncan Overmeer and Rory Troup.



Peter Fenton returned to the group after a long absence and presented a handmade accordion book of images made near his home on the west coast. All taken with a phone camera, at maximum zoom, from a single spot each day looking out to sea, These combine to present a wonderful panoply of textures and patterns of the seascape. The book allows images to be juxtaposed in many different ways and the ability to constantly make and remake the sequence is endless.

Roddy McKenzie presented new work inspired by an Umberto Eco essay that discusses how culture conditions our response to colour: in this case the greenish/blue associated with Minerva's eyes. He explores this colour through portraits, intimate landscapes realised in muted colours and using paper with a translucent property.





Caitlin Prentice is a new member who specialises in Polaroids, experimenting with limited edition circular and coloured polaroids as well as standard issue. She showed a wide range of images from intimate photographs of her garden to the wider landscape around Dunbar. Her work is evocative and poetic, capturing small elements of scenes and capitalising on the way polaroids have irregular and distorted edges to emphasise the ephemeral. The second new member, **Duncan Overmeer**, is experimenting with film and pushing ISO to its limits to document 'behind the scenes' moments during performances at Eden Court Theatre. Duncan captures moments of stillness and preparation, such as technical staff playing chess to pass time, or the quiet concentration of stage hands moving scenery, using deeply crushed blacks, in a documentary style reminiscent of Picture Post.





Rory Troup, our third new member, works in both digital and film. Today he presented his work on urban and rural landscapes. Rory's images quietly show traces of people in unexpected ways, by the movement of a door screen in an image of a tumble-down building, or the way that forests show signs of management in the organisation of planting. Using a muted colour palette, his photographs are contemplative and beautifully composed.

David Buchanan, who travels up from Edinburgh regularly to attend presented ongoing work on the Anthropocene and the impact of people through landscape photography. This work has its genesis in a submission to the Street Level Open and is now expanding to encompass a range of David's landscape approaches from the picturesque to the documentary.



John Ferguson recapped on a busy year by looking through large scale prints he has exhibited throughout Moray. Working minimally, using blocks of colour or tone, John explores community and culture. Drawing inspiration from his solo travels internationally, he combines elements from a range of sources.





Matt Sillars showed excerpts from his hand printed series Duntelchaig,

and then asked the group for their views on his new digital series "The Curator's Hand'. He explores the way that access to society is controlled by those with privilege, through the metaphor of a curator's hand choosing what is to be seen as having value.

The community table at Eden Court worked out quite well and we hope to use the venue for the Meeting on the 11th March



Duntelchaig Matt Sillars

Jan 13th – Feb 28th

The southern shores of Loch Duntelchaig, in the Monadhliaths near Inverness, are bounded by surprisingly high cliffs. Over millennia, rock fall has created steep boulder strewn slopes and although the cliffs are the preserve of rock climbers, the landscape below is a complex weave of large boulders, bracken, moss, birch and rowan. In the shadow of the cliffs, little light penetrates directly, and there is a delicate sense of intimacy in the subdued light in the quite places which can be found nestling amongst the stones. This exhibition explores the landscape that lies only a few metres from the shoreline path and celebrates its textures and tones, in black and white.
