**Easy-To-Teach:** Every lesson includes a host of activities to keep children's attention, including a group game, object lesson, interactive Bible story, memory verse activity, simple teaching skit, discussion guide, craft activity, word search, and coloring page.



# 28-Day Kindness Challenge

#### Week 1 - Witness: Seeing Christ's Love

Sunday: Read a Bible story about Jesus showing love. Discuss how Jesus showed love in the story.

Monday: Think about someone in your life who shows Jesus' love. How do they do it?

Tuesday: Look for examples of kindness in your community.

Wednesday: Think about a time when you felt loved. Share this experience with a friend or family member.

Thursday: Draw a picture of a Bible story where Jesus showed love.

Friday: Spend the day being extra observant of acts of love and kindness around you.

Saturday: Share with your Sunday school class or family the instances of love and kindness you observed this week.

#### Week 2 - Works: Demonstrating Christ's Love

Sunday: Do a surprise chore for a family member without them asking.

Monday: Write a thank you note to someone who has been kind to you.

Tuesday: Share a favorite toy or book with a friend.

Wednesday: Help prepare a meal at home and serve it with a smile.

Thursday: Make a handmade gift for a neighbor or friend.

Friday: Donate some of your old toys or clothes to a charity.

Saturday: Prepare a snack to bring to your children's ministry leader or pastor at church this weekend.

#### Week 3 - Word: Explaining Christ's Love

Sunday: Share a Bible story about Jesus' love with a friend who doesn't attend church.

Monday: Write a letter to a missionary or pastor explaining why Jesus' love is important to you.

Tuesday: Practice explaining Jesus' love to a family member.

Wednesday: Draw a comic strip that explains Jesus' love.

Thursday: Write a prayer that expresses your understanding of Jesus' love.

Friday: Share your favorite Bible verse about love with someone and explain why it's meaningful to you.

Saturday: Share with your Sunday school class or family how you explained Jesus' love to others this week.

#### Week 4 - Worship: Celebration of Christ's Love

Sunday: Write a song or poem that celebrates Jesus' love.

Monday: Create a piece of art that represents Jesus' love.

Tuesday: Spend time in prayer, thanking Jesus for His love.

Wednesday: Organize a small celebration with your family to celebrate Jesus' love.

Thursday: Share your song, poem, or artwork with your family.

Friday: Reflect on what you've learned about Jesus' love this month. How has it changed you?

Saturday: Have a time of prayer, thanking God for what you've learned during the kindness challenge.

**Make It Personal:** Use your creativity to find new ways to show kindness and share what you learn with the group. You can substitute your own ideas for any of our challenges!



















### Week 1 - Witness: Seeing Christ's Love

**Description:** This week, kids will learn to spot and appreciate Jesus' love in Bible stories and in their everyday lives. At the end of this lesson, you will introduce the 28-Day Kindness challenge and pass out the activities for this week.

Scripture Reference: 1 John 4:9-11

**Learning Objective:** By the end of this week, kids will be able to point out examples of Jesus' love in the Bible and in their daily lives.

Memory Verse: John 13:34

## Introduction & Group Game: Love Detective

"Good morning, everyone! I'm so thrilled to see all your shining faces here today. We're about to embark on a beautiful, exciting journey together. This journey is called 'Love Like Jesus.' Now, isn't that an interesting title? What do you think it means to *love like Jesus*? (allow for discussion)

Those are some great ideas. Over the next four weeks, we're going to dive deep into this concept and discover just how powerful Jesus' love is! At the end of today's lesson, I'll explain about our **28-Day Kindness Challenge** to help put what we learn into practice.

Today, our adventure starts as we learn about what it means to be a 'Witness,' which means seeing Jesus' love in action. We're going to be detectives this week, looking for clues and signs of His love in the Bible and in our everyday lives. Are you ready to become love-detectives?"

#### **Materials:**

$\hfill\square$ Small slips of paper with examples of kind actions
□ Pens
☐ Small bowl

**Preparation:** Here are some ideas to add to your "Love Detective" game, you can use as many as you like or even brainstorm your own. These actions can be written down on the small slips of paper and placed in the bowl.

- Holding the door open for someone. Discussion point: This is a simple act that shows respect and care for others, just like Jesus always respected everyone
   He met.
- Helping pick up dropped books or items. Discussion point: This act demonstrates noticing someone in need and choosing to help, reflecting Jesus' heart for helping those in need.
- Giving up your seat for someone else. Discussion point: Sacrificing our comfort for others shows love and is similar to how Jesus always put others before Himself.
- Helping a younger sibling tie their shoes. Discussion point: This is an act of
  patience and teaching, just as Jesus was patient with His disciples and taught
  them many things.
- Listening intently to someone without interrupting. Discussion point: Taking
  the time to truly listen shows that we value and care for the other person,
  similar to how Jesus always took the time to listen to people.
- Making a card for someone who's not feeling well. Discussion point: Creative
  acts of kindness can bring comfort and joy, just like Jesus brought comfort to
  many during His time on Earth.
- Comforting a friend who had a bad day. Discussion point: Providing
  emotional support and being there for someone in tough times mirrors Jesus'
  comforting nature.
- Returning a lost item you found to its owner. Discussion point: Honesty and doing the right thing is a direct reflection of Jesus' teachings about integrity.
- Inviting someone sitting alone to join your group. Discussion point: Including
  others and making them feel welcome and valued is an act of love, much like
  how Jesus included everyone, even those who were often left out.

#### **Game Instructions:**

- Divide the kids into pairs or small groups. Explain that they are now 'Love Detectives.'
- 2. Each group takes a turn to pick a slip of paper from the bowl.
- They have to act out the scene written on the paper without speaking, and the rest of the class must guess what act of love is being portrayed.
- 4. After each correct guess, have a brief discussion about how the act demonstrates love, linking it back to how Jesus showed love.
- 5. Rotate until all groups have had a turn and all acts of love have been acted out and discussed.
- 6. Wrap up the game with a brief discussion about how Jesus showed love in similar ways and that over the week, they'll be learning to spot such acts of love around them as part of the 'Witness' theme.

## Object Lesson: The Love Mirror

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Materials Needed:
☐ Mirror
□ Picture of Jesus (or a cross)
☐ Sticky notes
□ Pen
Teacher's Script: Can anyone tell me what this is? (Hold up the mirror and allow for
the children to respond.)
Of course, good job. It's a mirror. And what do mirrors do? (Pause for responses.)
That's right. Mirrors reflect. They show us what we look like, don't they?
Now, what if this mirror could show us what Jesus' love looks like? What do you think
we would see?" (Allow for responses. Some kids might mention kindness, sacrifice,
forgiveness, etc.)
Those are some great answers! To see Jesus' love, we often look at the things He
did, the way He lived, and the words He spoke. His entire life was a reflection of God's
love for us. If we look in our 'Jesus Love Mirror,' we might see kindness, compassion,
forgiveness, and so much more.
(Hold up the picture of Jesus or the cross.) This is our representation of Jesus' love."
(Place the picture or cross behind the mirror so that it is reflected in the mirror.)

Now, let's take these sticky notes. On each one, I want you to write down an example of Jesus' love that we can find in the Bible, something that you remember from the Bible stories about Jesus. It could be something like 'Jesus healed the sick,' 'Jesus forgave sins,' or 'Jesus fed the hungry.'

(Hand out sticky notes and pens. Once the kids have written their examples, ask them to come up and stick their notes around the mirror.)

As you can see, when we look at Jesus' life and actions in the Bible, our 'Love Mirror' is filled with acts of compassion, forgiveness, and kindness - this is how Jesus showed His love. And guess what? This week, we will be 'Love Detectives,' spotting these acts of love in our lives too. Not only in the Bible but also in our homes, in our schools, and our communities. Because Jesus' love is everywhere, and the more we learn to spot it, the more we can reflect it - just like this mirror.

Remember, the first step in loving like Jesus is witnessing His love, and that's what we're focusing on this week. Keep your detective eyes open, and let's see how much love we can spot together!"

## Bible Story: Witness: Seeing Christ's Love

**TEACHER:** Alright, everybody. It's time to open our Bibles! We will be looking at the book of 1 John, chapter 4, verses 9 to 11. Can someone help me find that passage?" (Allow a child to find the passage and show the others.)

"Great job! This passage tells us something very special about God's love. But before we read it, I want to tell you a story."

"The story I'm going to tell you happened a long, long time ago, but it's as true today as it was then. It's about a man who has done some wrong things. In fact, he had done so many wrong things that he was known as a sinner."

"Despite being a sinner, this man realized his mistakes and wanted to make things right. So, he decided to go to the temple to pray. Now, can you imagine how he might have felt? Nervous, scared, ashamed... After all, the temple was a holy place and he felt like he didn't belong there because of all the wrong things he had done."

"But guess what? Even though he was scared, he went to the temple anyway because he wanted to ask for God's forgiveness. At the same time, there was a very religious man, a Pharisee, praying in the temple as well. The Pharisee thanked God that he wasn't like other people – robbers, evildoers, adulterers – or even like this sinner."

"Can you see the difference between these two men? One admitted he was a sinner and asked for forgiveness, while the other thought he was better than everyone else."

"Now, let's look at our Bible passage to see what it tells us about God's love and forgiveness."

**READ: 1 John 4:9** 

"Wow! So, this verse tells us that God sent his son, Jesus, into the world so we might

live through him. Can someone tell me what that means?" (Encourage responses

and discussion.)

"Great thoughts! Now, let's continue our story."

"The sinner stood far off and would not even look up to heaven. He beat his chest

and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' He knew he had done wrong, but he

also knew about God's love and hoped for God's mercy."

"Now, Jesus was telling this story, and do you know what He said? He said that the

sinner, not the Pharisee, went home justified before God. The one who admitted his

mistakes and asked for forgiveness was the one who was forgiven. That's how much

God loves us!"

**READ: 1 John 4:10** 

"This verse says that love isn't about what we do for God but what He has done for

us. He sent Jesus to be the atonement for our sins. Isn't that incredible? God's love is

so deep and wide that it covers all of our mistakes when we come to Him."

"Now, let's go back to the story. When the sinner left the temple that day, do you

think he felt lighter, maybe even happier? Why?" (Encourage responses and

discussion.)

"Absolutely, because he had experienced God's love and forgiveness!"

#### **READ: 1 John 4:11**

"This last verse tells us that since God loved us so much, we should also love one another. So, in our story, what do you think the sinner might have done next? How could he show love to others?" (Encourage responses and discussion.)

"Fantastic ideas, everyone! Just like the man in the story, we've all done wrong things. But God's love is so big that He sent Jesus to take away our sins. And because of that, we can love others just like Jesus loves us!

This week, let's remember to be 'Love Detectives,' spotting examples of Jesus' love in the Bible and in our everyday lives.

## Memory Verse Activity: Verse Card Shuffle

#### **Materials Needed:**

Index cards (one per word from John 13:34) For larger groups you can create
several sets or have the children help prepare.
Marker

Preparation: Write each word from the verse on separate index cards. Shuffle them.

**Leader:** We have a special verse from John 13:34. It's about a commandment from Jesus. These cards have our verse, but they're mixed up! Can you help arrange them? Work with your teams to arrange the verse. Say it out loud once you think it's correct!"

**Directions:** Hand cards to kids. If there are extra kids, make teams. Offer hints if kids find it challenging. Encourage teamwork. After they get it right, all together, repeat the verse a few times.

## Teaching Skit: The Lost Dog's Love

This simple skit helps children relate the idea of witnessing Jesus' love to a real-life situation. It encourages them to act kindly and compassion, just as Jesus would. Plus, the humor keeps the story engaging and fun.

#### **Possible Props:**

Ball: For SUE and JIM to play catch with.
Puppet or Stuffed Animal: Representing ROSCOE, the lost dog. Opt for one
that's relatively large and clearly visible to the audience.
Picnic Basket: Carried by MOM, this should ideally be a traditional-looking
basket, making it clear that it contains food items for the picnic.
Assorted "Picnic Food" Items: These can be fake or real items such as
sandwiches, fruit, and a drink container. These are shared with ROSCOE during
the skit.
Park Bench or Blanket (optional): This could be placed on stage to enhance
the "local park" setting.

#### **Characters:**

- SUE, a young girl who loves animals
- JIM, Sue's older brother
- ROSCOE, the lost dog (a puppet or stuffed animal)
- MOM, Sue, and Jim's mother

(SCENE: A local park. SUE and JIM are playing catch.)

SUE: (Suddenly stops playing) JIM, look! There's a lost dog over there.

JIM: (Laughs) SUE, that's ROSCOE. He's always running around the neighborhood.

SUE: (Worried) But he looks scared and hungry. We should do something.

JIM: (Shrugs) Nah, someone else will care for him.

(MOM enters with a picnic basket.)

MOM: What's going on, you two?

SUE: (Pointing to ROSCOE) MOM, ROSCOE is lost and hungry, but JIM doesn't want to help!

MOM: Well, let's think about this. What would Jesus do in this situation?

JIM: (Thinks for a moment) Jesus would...probably help ROSCOE, right?

SUE: (Nods) Exactly! Just like we learned in today's lesson, Jesus showed love in all His actions.

JIM: (Smiles) OK, let's do it. Let's show Jesus' love to ROSCOE!

(They share their picnic food with ROSCOE, who wags his tail happily.)

MOM: (Smiling) Remember, showing kindness is one of the best ways to witness Jesus' love to others.

SUE: And it feels good too!

JIM: (Laughs) Especially when ROSCOE slobbers all over your sandwich!

(They all laugh as the curtain falls.)

(End of Skit)

## Discussion Questions & Prayer

**LEADER:** "Hi, everyone - I am so proud of you for paying close attention during our Bible lesson today. You did an amazing job! Now, let's dive a bit deeper into what we learned. I will ask some questions, and I want you to share your thoughts. There are no wrong answers here, okay? We're all here to learn together."

- "Can anyone tell me a moment in the Bible story today where you saw Jesus' love being shown?"
- 2. "What are some ways that you see Jesus' love in your everyday life?"
- 3. "Can you think of a time when you showed Jesus' love to someone else? What did you do?"
- 4. "How did it feel when you showed love to others? Do you think it made a difference to them?"

"Well done, everyone. I love hearing your thoughts and ideas. Now, let's take a moment to share any prayer requests. Remember, nothing is too big or too small for God." (Allow children to share their prayer requests.)

"Thank you for sharing. Let's pray together."

"Dear God, thank You for teaching us about Your love today. Help us to witness Your love every day in our lives and show it to others. Please be with us in this coming week and hear our prayers. We pray for [insert prayer requests]. Give us the courage and strength to love like Jesus. In Jesus' name, we pray.

Amen."

## The 28-Day Kindness Challenge: Introduction



## Craft Activity: Blooming with Compassion

#### **Supplies Needed:**

- □ Construction paper or card stock□ Paper plate
- ☐ Yarn, pipe cleaner, popsicle stick, or string
- ☐ Markers or crayons
- ☐ Scissors
- ☐ Glue or tape
- ☐ Other decorations (jewels, stickers, etc.)

#### **Procedure:**

- Cut out several pieces of paper or cardstock in petal shapes.
- Brainstorm ways of demonstrating compassion, and write them on the petals.
- Glue a circle or cupcake liner in the center of the plate, and attach the petals around it using glue or staples.
- Attach a popsicle stick "stem" to the
   bottom of the plate or a pipe cleaner or string to the top to hang it on display.


