PLANTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Your plants will grow best in full sun, can tolerate a few hours of shade, and prefer moist, well-drained soil containing loam, gravel, or sand. The best time to sow seeds in most places is when the fall wet season starts, but seeds can be sown in winter or early spring as well. Sow seeds directly onto bare soil (remove vegetation/ mulch if necessary) and firmly press seeds into soil (but do not bury them more than 1/8 inch).
