INTRODUCTION

This year, for the first time, we have determined to study a character in scripture. In the past, we have explored books or sections of books; but this time, the focus is on the life of a prophet of God. Elijah is an incredible character, living in times which, in many respects, are far different than our own. However, this study takes us to issues which are vitally important today as they were in the days of Elijah: simply, the issues of life and death! Our theme How long halt ye between two opinions? captures the spirit of this study. As Israel was warned, so we are warned. We need to be all for God, and only for God.

The workbook has been prepared by two brethren: Bro. Dan Cadieux and Bro. Dan Hodge. These brethren commenced their research in Elijah for this workbook over a year ago. We are thankful for their efforts which have culminated in this study tool in preparation for the 1995 Youth Conference. Several others contributed along the way in editing and compiling the work of the two brethren into one workbook. We would like especially to thank Sis. Carol Wilson and Sis. Karen Hodge for their efforts in this regard. As well, we would like to thank the artists who contributed pictures for the book: Sis. Sharon Abel, Sis. Mary Jane Abel, Sis. Laura Cooper, Sis. Margo Maier, Sis Carmel Payne and Sis. Martha Sales. Again, we would like to thank Bro. Jack Robinson for providing the tools to assist us in our studies.

The workbook is a guide for you to use in the study of Elijah. It contains 4 sections:

Section 1 (Light Blue)

This section is a series of discussion questions which you may work through to obtain an overview of the study. Beginning in 1 Kings 16 with two major characters, Ahab and Jezebel, through to the departure of Elijah before his successor, Elisha, in 2 Kings, these questions stimulate interest. These sections can be studied on your own, or may be useful to do in groups.

Sections 2-3 (White)

Section 2 and 3 guides you through a study of the pertinent chapters of this study in 1 and 2 Kings. A good balance has been maintained: looking up key words, determining what phrases signify, understanding the situation and relating the exhortation to ourselves.

Section 4 (Beige)

This section is a collection of study tools for your use:

(1) The text of 1Kings 17 to 2 Kings 2 is presented with Strong's numbers to eliminate the time looking these numbers up in Strong's concordance. With these numbers, you can proceed directly to the definitions in the back of Strong's concordance, and for a more detailed analysis, to a Greek concordance or lexicon linked to Strong's numbers.

(2) A list of the words occurring in 1 Kings 17 to 2 Kings 2 with the number of occurrences in this section of scripture and the chapter (C) and verse (V) of the first and second occurrences.

PREPARATION is key to the success of Youth Conference. The more you put into the study, the more you will get out of it, and the more you will have to offer when Youth Conference is here. Discussion groups are extremely rewarding when everyone has done their work ahead of time, so make a plan and stick to it. May God bless you in your study of His Word. If you leave it to the last minute, procrastinate, or underestimate the effort required, then you will not be properly prepared.

Read the Elijah several times and complete section 1 (the discussion questions) and section 2 (the background questions).

April - 1 Kings 17,18

May - 1 Kings 18,19,21

June - 2 Kings 1,2

July - Elijah in the Future and review.

August - more in-depth investigation of areas of interest. Consider other conclusions from study notes and other materials available to you.

We hope and pray that this workbook will help you to prepare for Youth Conference and, most importantly, assist you in your journey to the kingdom of God.

SECTION 1: DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1 KINGS 16:29-34

- 1. Elijah found himself prophesying during a period of extreme wickedness in Israel. In order to understand the level of wickedness during the reign of Ahab, follow the phrase "did worse/more evil/did evil above all that were before him". There is a progression beginning with the reign of Jeroboam.
 - a) Are we living in a similar time of wickedness?
 - b) How do we cope with the difficulties of holding fast to the truth?
 - c) Are we as successful at remaining separate from the world as Elijah, or do we succumb to the evil as Ahab did?
- 2. Ahab thought it a light thing to walk in the sins of Jeroboam to the extent that he took to wife Jezebel of Zidon. Jezebel was a Gentile woman who did not know the ways of God.
 - a) To what extent did Jezebel lead Ahab away from God?
 - b) There are many passages discussing the wisdom in marrying a person who fears and obeys God. Find some of those passages.

c) To what extent should these principles be put into practice in our lives?

d) Is it a good idea to marry someone who is unbaptised with the expectation of "bringing them into the truth"?

e) What problems can arise from such an arrangement?

f) What should be the first thing we look for in a partner?

1 KINGS 17

- 1. Elijah fully accepted the direction and guidance that he received from God. Elijah obeyed, without question, the commands to go to the brook Cherith to be fed by ravens and to go to Zarephath to be sustained by a widow woman. Many Israelites would have had difficulty in obeying these commands as you will learn from your study.
 - a) How often do we question the direction and guidance we receive from the Word of God?
 - b) Provide examples of passages that are difficult to apply to your life in the age in which we live.
 - c) What do we always have to remember when putting our trust in God?
 - d) What passages and biblical examples give us comfort and encouragement when trying to follow God's commands?

2.	no pe	valuable lesson was taught to Elijah at the brook Cherith. He was taught that rson is to be looked upon as unclean, neither Jew nor Gentile. This was a it lesson for Israelites to learn as is evident throughout the Bible.

 - b) Do we ask why God brought this upon us?
 - c) In what passages can we take comfort in times of tragedy?
 - d) How can we help others in times of trouble?
 - e) What biblical examples can we use as a source of encouragement for ourselves and others?

1 KINGS 18

- 1. "How long halt ye between two opinions?" was Elijah's cry to the people of Israel. Israel was hopping back and forth between Yahweh and Baal.
 - a) In our life, with all the requirements on our time, could we be accused of doing the same as the people of Israel?

- b) What type of service does God expect from us? Provide scriptural passages to support your answer.
- c) What sort of idols are a temptation for us and could distract us from serving God the way He wants? How can we overcome these temptations? Note what was done to the prophets of Baal.
- 2. The prophets of Baal spent all day calling upon Baal and even inflicted bodily damage and pain upon themselves with the hope that Baal would hear. They were very dedicated to Baal, and waited for him to respond. Although their efforts were in vain, their commitment is to be admired.
 - a) To what do we dedicate a large portion of our time and effort? Is all of our time and effort dedicated to God, or only what is left over when all else is done?
 - b) What sort of commitment and dedication does God expect from us? Find scriptural passages or examples that exhort us on those things which we should or should not spend our time doing, and the rewards or consequences associated with them.
- 3. On Mount Carmel Elijah's sacrifice was consumed by fire. As a result did Elijah seek glory from the people? No! His purpose was that Israel might know that Yahweh is God.
 - a) When doing something for a friend or when performing a function for your ecclesia or youth group, what is your motivation for doing it?

- b) Is the natural reaction of the flesh to give glory to someone else?
- c) Why does God require us to glorify Him and not to take the glory ourself? Provide scriptural passages to support your reasoning.

1 KINGS 19

- 1. Elijah decided to journey to Mount Horeb to speak to God because God was not acting in the manner that Elijah thought He should. Elijah thought that the children of Israel should be destroyed for not responding faithfully to God's call. Elijah was putting his own constraints on God's actions.
 - a) Do we ever fall into the trap of expecting God to act in a certain way and are then disappointed when it does not happen?
 - b) Do we question why God is allowing a situation to continue if it is obviously wrong?
 - c) Are we ever quick to judge someone's actions or lack of action? What sort of attitude should we have in these circumstances? Why? Provide scriptural support for your answer.
 - d) How could our attitude come back to "haunt" us one day?
- 2. While at Mount Horeb, Elijah was shown by God that his attitude was wrong. God then told Elijah to return and continue in his office as prophet to the people of Israel.

a)	Do we accept someone's criticism of our attitude?
b)	How do we usually react when someone tries to correct our reasoning or attitude?
c)	What sort of attitude does God expect us to have in these circumstances? If we realize that we were wrong as a result of someone's rebuke, how easy is it to go back to our "job" and continue with a new attitude?
d)	How can we approach someone who has an incorrect idea or attitude and try to correct it without offending them?

 - a) Detail the relationship that these two would have developed, and how it climaxed with the departing of Elijah in the whirlwind. Find other examples in scripture where a special bond was built between an older and a younger person.

b) Why are these bonds so important? What exhortation can we gain from them to use in our lives?

1 KINGS 16:29-34

- 29: And in the thirty and eighth year of Asa king of Judah began Ahab the son of Omri to reign over Israel: and Ahab the son of Omri reigned over Israel in Samaria twenty and two years.
- 30: And Ahab the son of Omri did evil in the sight of the LORD above all that were before him.
- And it came to pass, as if it has been a light thing for him to walk in the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, that he took to wife Jezebel the daughter of Ethbaal king of the Zidonians, and went and served Baal, and worshipped him.

- 13: And Elijah said unto her, Fear not; go and do as thou hast said: but make me thereof a little cake first, and bring it unto me, and after make for thee and for thy son.
- 14: For thus saith the LORD God of Israel, The barrel of meal shall not waste, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the LORD sendeth rain upon the earth.
- 15: And she went and did according to the saying of Elijah: and she, and her house, did eat many days.
- 16: And the barrel of meal wasted not, neither did the cruse of oil fail, according to the word of the LORD, which he spake by Elijah.

- 18: And she said unto Elijah, What have I to do with thee, O thou man of God? art thou come unto me to call my sin to remembrance, and to slay my son?
- 19: And he said unto her, Give me thy son. And he took him out of her bosom, and carried him up into a loft, where he abode, and laid him upon his own bed.
- 20: And he cried unto the LORD, and said, O LORD my God, hast thou also brought evil upon the widow with whom I sojourn, by slaying her son?

I KINGS 18

A) ELIJAH GOES TO MEET AHAB

- 1: And it came to pass after many days, that the word of the LORD came to Elijah in the third year, saying, Go, shew thyself unto Ahab; and I will send rain upon the earth.
- 2: And Elijah went to shew himself unto Ahab. And there was a sore famine in Samaria.
- 3: And Ahab called Obadiah, which was the governor of his house. (Now Obadiah feared the LORD greatly:
- 4: For it was so, when Jezebel cut off the prophets of the LORD, that Obadiah took an hundred prophets, and hid them by fifty in a cave, and fed them with bread and water.)
- 5: And Ahab said unto Obadiah, Go into the land, unto all fountains of water, and unto all brooks: peradventure we may find grass to save the horses and mules alive, that we lose not all the beasts.
- 6: So they divided the land between them to pass throughout it: Ahab went one way by himself, and Obadiah went another way by himself.
- 7: And as Obadiah was in the way, behold, Elijah met him: and he knew him, and fell on his face, and said, Art thou that my lord Elijah?
- 8: And he answered him, I am: go, tell thy lord, Behold, Elijah is here.
- 9: And he said, What have I sinned, that thou wouldest deliver thy servant into the hand of Ahab, to slay me?
- 10: As the LORD thy God liveth, there is no nation or kingdom, whither my lord hath not sent to seek thee: and when they said, He is not there; he took an oath of the kingdom and nation, that they found thee not.



A) Proposal and Rejection

- 2: And Ahab spake unto Naboth, saying, Give me thy vineyard, that I may have it for a garden of herbs, because it is near unto my house: and I will give thee for it a better vineyard than it; or, if it seem good to thee, I will give thee the worth of it in money.
- 3: And Naboth said to Ahab, The LORD forbid it me, that I should give the inheritance of my fathers unto thee.
- 4: And Ahab came into his house heavy and displeased because of the word which Naboth the Jezreelite had spoken to him: for he had said, I will not give thee the inheritance of my fathers. And he laid him down upon his bed, and turned away his face, and would eat no bread.

There is no specific time period given for the events about to transpire, but the background of this chapter shows that Ahab has conquered Samaria against the command of God. Ahab has allowed the king of Samaria, Benhadad, to be spared from death. (I Kings 20:42). Ahab was wanting to form political alliances, and to establish and expand his kingdom. But, as was so often the case with Ahab, God intervened and expressed his displeasure for the things which Ahab had done. (I Kings 20:42)

With all the evil influences around him, Naboth was able to maintain his integrity towards God's law.

Kings who are given over to pride like to have cities and monuments built as a remembrance of themselves. Ahab was no different to Nebuchadnezzar (Dan 4:30), and even King Solomon (Ecc. 2: 4-6). But Solomon was to realize that all this was "vanity and vexation of spirit". So also for us, the pursuit of physical pleasures will only bring us to our knees before our God. It is the spiritual buildings and vineyards that we should be nurturing in order for God to find us acceptable in that great day.

Note: Despite wrong motives, Ahab seemed to be quite reasonable in what he was offering to Naboth. It is interesting to ponder that God warned Israel about the consequences of wanting a fleshly king. (I Sam. 8:11-15)

Naboth had to be familiar with the laws of God in order to make the stand that he did. What can we learn from this great man?

- 5: But Jezebel his wife came to him, and said unto him, Why is thy spirit so sad, that thou eatest no bread?
- 6: And he said unto her, Because I spake unto Naboth the Jezreelite, and said unto him, Give me thy vineyard for money; or else, if it please thee, I will give thee another vineyard for it: and he answered, I will not give thee my vineyard.
- 7: And Jezebel his wife said unto him, Dost thou now govern the kingdom of Israel? Arise, and eat bread, and let thine heart be merry: I will give thee the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite.

God requires Truth in word and deed. Prov. 12:17-22

As we see in contrast to Ahab's weakness, Jezebel is a strong and determined character who is caught up in physically displaying her power and authority. Jezebel did not realize that it is the most High who ruleth in the kingdoms of men.

4. What is evidently the priority in life for Jezebel when she tells Ahab to "let thine heart be merry"?

Notice the confidence with which Jezebel tells Ahab that "I will give it thee". There is a boastful arrogance about the statement and Jezebel would have seen this as a chance to oppose God, not knowing how faithful Naboth was to his God.

6.	People in authority such as Jezebel have to be able to control themselves in order not to abuse their position. Jezebel was about to use her position to benefit herself, and to do what was evil in God's eyes. It is interesting to note that Ahab stands apart from the events transpiring under the command of Jezebel as if he was to escape blame. But God knows the thoughts and intents of the heart, and so Ahab would not go unpunished.

D) Hast thou found me O mine enemy

- 17: And the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying,
- 18: Arise, go down to meet Ahab king of Israel, which is in Samaria: behold, he is in the vineyard of Naboth, whither he is gone down to possess it.
- 19: And thou shalt speak unto him, saying, Thus saith the LORD, Hast thou killed, and also taken possession? And thou shalt speak unto him, saying, Thus saith the LORD, In the place where dogs licked the blood of Naboth shall dogs lick thy blood, even thine.

- 20: And Ahab said to Elijah, Hast thou found me, O mine enemy? And he answered, I have found thee: because thou hast sold thyself to work evil in the sight of the LORD.
- 21: Behold, I will bring evil upon thee, and will take away thy posterity, and will cut off from Ahab him that pisseth against the wall, and him that is shut up and left in Israel,
- And will make thine house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and like the house of Baasha the son of Ahijah, for the provocation wherewith thou hast provoked me to anger, and made Israel to sin.
- 23: And of Jezebel also spake the LORD, saying, The dogs shall eat Jezebel by the wall of Jezreel.
- 24: Him that dieth of Ahab in the city the dogs shall eat; and him that dieth in the field shall the fowls of the air eat.

It had been some time since Ahab had seen Elijah, and Ahab probably had put out of his mind those events which had taken place on Mt. Carmel. We have no record where Elijah was when the word of the LORD came to him, but it would have been soon after his calling of Elisha
