However, there are times when a **bit more effort** is required.



Let's get your study started! Elijah the Tishbite Some stuff you need to know

"Every now and then, God has raised leaders who have done outstanding work in the cause of the Truth. Such were men like Noah, Abraham, Moses, David. Their influence lived on long after they had died. Even today the things they said or did, or the great promises that God made to them play a vital part in our salvation.

Elijah was one such man. He was the greatest of Israel's prophets, a man who stood up in a time of terrible wickedness to sternly rebuke the nation of

Israel for its folly. He set a wonderful example which still speaks to us today." -H.P. Mansfield

Elijah's name means

'Yahweh, He is God,' or 'Yahweh is the mighty or powerful one.' Like all names in the Bible, the *meaning of his name is very important*. In the days of Elijah, <u>Israel did not believe that Yahweh was the only God</u> and they had forgotten that only Yahweh had power.

"LORD" = "Yahweh"

The Name of our God. It means, "He Who Will Be"

God's name helps us to understand His purpose with us and with the earth.

Yahweh: He Who Will Be revealed to the world in a group of people when all the earth is filled with His glory.

Many Israelites began to think that the gods of the nations around them also had power and they had turned to gods like Ba'al



and Ashtoreth for help.
They believed that Yahweh did miracles like the 10 plagues their fathers saw in Egypt, and the god Ba'al controlled the weather which made the rain and fed the people.

that not only did Yahweh make the rain, but that Yahweh provided for them, and to show Israel that Yahweh was the only true God. His job would be difficult because the people had strayed so far from the worship of the one true God, but by his work for the truth many in Israel would again believe that Yahweh was the only true God.

Some Background Information

Elijah came to the ten tribes of Israel when King Ahab, their worst king ever, was ruling.

It is hard to believe that Israel could become so wicked, but each generation had gone further and further from Yahweh until in King Ahab's day it was illegal to worship Yahweh.

How did this happen?



About 150 years before Elijah came on the scene, all 12 tribes of Israel were ruled by a righteous king named **David**. He knew that Yahweh was the only true God, that only Yahweh had power, and he taught many people in Israel about Yahweh. His son **Solomon** started out right, but he had many wives who didn't believe that Yahweh was really the creator of the earth. His wives had many different gods, and Solomon allowed his wives to worship them. The people followed Solomon and his wives in the worship of all of these other gods.

During the reign of Solomon's son, Rehoboam, Yahweh divided the twelve tribes of Israel into two nations: the northern nation of Israel, which had ten tribes in it and the southern nation of Judah, which had two tribes.

Jeroboam became the king of the northern tribes of Israel, and he led Israel even further from Yahweh than Solomon had. He was such a wicked king that in the Bible he is known as, "Jeroboam, the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin."

Eventually God wiped out the whole family of Jeroboam because of their wickedness but, as we shall see, the kings that followed him were no better than he was. In fact, some were worse, a lot worse.

"Jeroboam,

How exactly did this wicked king make Israel to sin?

God had given the nation of Israel very specific ways they were to worship Him. One of those ways involved going to **Jerusalem** to the Temple to worship God. Once Jeroboam became king of the Northern ten tribes of Israel, he became obsessed with a fear that his power might be taken away from him and the people would once again join with Judah. He came up with a way for the people not to have to even go to Jerusalem, which was in Judah, to worship God! He built his own temples! He built two **golden calves**, and **shrines** to worship them - one in the far north of Israel, and one in the far south. He allowed people who knew **nothing** about God's word to become the **religious leaders** of the people. Jeroboam even played the part of the High Priest of this **false god worship** at times. Jeroboam, as the King of Israel, was *supposed* to lead the people.

He did lead the people - right into sin.

Elijah's Future Role



One the most *exciting* things about Elijah is that his work in convincing Israel that **Yahweh** - **He is God** is only partly finished. We are told that when Christ returns Elijah will be sent out to go *all over the world* to teach the Jews of the world about Yahweh.

He will finish the work he began over 3,000 years ago, and will help the Jews to believe in Yahweh just as Abraham, Isaac and Jacob did. He will lead them to the land of Israel, where they will become the servants of Christ in the Kingdom.

The Worst Kings of Israel 1kings 16

When we read through 1 Kings 16 we cannot help but see how *bad* things were in Israel in the the years before Ahab and Elijah came on the scene. Kings were murdered, idols were worshipped and half of Israel was at war with the other half of Israel. With all of this going on we are told that Omri, King of Israel, "did worse that all that were before him" and on top of that we are told that, "Ahab did more to provoke Yahweh God of Israel to anger than all of the kings of Israel that were before him." As you read through the chapter think of how Elijah must have felt as his people became increasingly wicked, and how Yahweh must have felt as His people forgot that He was the only true God.

When Ahab brought Jezebel from Zidon

to be his queen she worked very hard to teach the people of Israel about Ba'al, the god of her people. She taught the people that it was Ba'al that was in control of all things, that it was Ba'al that made the rain, that it was Ba'al that provided the crops and that it was Ba'al that gave them life. She taught them that they needed to worship Ba'al so that he would continue to provide for them. She taught them that Yahweh was not God but that Ba'al was God.

Then she tried to get rid of all worship of Yahweh.

Imagine how Yahweh, the real creator, real provider of rain and crops, and the real giver of life must have felt. What could he do to stop this powerful woman from destroying His people? What could He do to save His people from believing that Ba'al was the real God?

Yahweh sent one of the most powerful prophets Israel had ever seen. He sent **Elijah** to prove that **Yahweh**, **He is God.**

The drought in Israel had been going on for almost three and a half years, and the people would have begun to wonder if Ba'al really could bring rain and provide for them like they had always thought. No matter how often they prayed to Ba'al, the rains did not come. At the same time that Ahab, Jezebel and the prophets of Ba'al were praying to Ba'al for rain, Elijah was praying to Yahweh that the rains would *not* come, and the rains *did not* come! This was proof that Ba'al had no power, no might; that Ba'al was not even alive. He was nothing but wood and stone. It was now time for the people of Israel to be shown that Yahweh is the only true God.

Elijah's question about halting between two opinions shows that the people acted as though it was okay to worship both Yahweh and Ba'al. They had never really stopped worshipping Yahweh - they simply added Ba'al to their worship!

Think about a family situation:

- Your parents tell you to do things that you would **rather not do** and sometimes they won't let you do things that you **want to do**. You **know that they are right** and that what they say will **be the best for you but you would** rather have it your own way.
- Then imagine what it would be like if you had an additional set of parents that would allow you to do **what ever you wanted** to do. They would let you eat too many cookies and stay up too late. They would never make you do your homework or take your medicine. They didn't provide for you or care for you **but** they **did** let you do **anything you wanted to do**.

When these new parents came along you would always go to **them** to get permission because they **always let you do what you wanted** to do, the things your old parents would **never let you do**. But when it came to providing for you it was your old parents that took care of you, fed you, gave you a place to live and loved you.

It was a great deal for you because you could choose to obey these new parents instead of your old parents whenever you wanted to **but**...if you **kept disobeying** your first parents eventually they would do something about it - they would stop providing for you.


And soon you would have to decide **which** parents **you would obey**. You would have to make up your mind **which** parents **you would serve**.

The Still Small Voice 1 Kings 19

We can imagine the feeling that Elijah must have had as he came to Jezreel. The people had been so moved by the great miracles they had seen, that they had slain the prophets of Ba'al. Even Ahab seemed to have been converted by what he had seen. Elijah must have thought that Ahab would go back home to Jezebel and tell her about the power of Yahweh, and that she, too, would believe that Yahweh is God. *Or* he might have thought that Ahab would get rid of Jezebel, but that wasn't what happened at all!

When Ahab told Jezebel what had happened, she was *furious* and she set out to kill Elijah. Imagine Elijah's shock! Yahweh had made every step of Elijah's plan work out up to this point. All that remained was for Jezebel's prophets to be slain, and Israel would finally come back to Yahweh, the God of their fathers. However, Elijah's hopes were shattered when it became clear that Yahweh was not going to continue with Elijah's plan. Elijah was so depressed about this that he wanted to die.

Yahweh reached out to Elijah because he was so discouraged, to help him and to care for him. Elijah was shown that Yahweh had chosen a different path for the conversion of His people. He was assured that Yahweh was *still at work* in Israel and that He knew the people that were His.

Although the miracles of Elijah had had a great impact on Israel by making it possible for prophets to teach the people about Yahweh, Elijah finally understood that **results** were not going to come by more fire from heaven, but by **God's word** being taught in Israel.

Naboth's Part of Yahweh's Vineyard

One of the great gifts that Yahweh gave to His people Israel when they came up out of Egypt, was the promised land. A plot of the land was given to every family in Israel to use to grow crops on, and to live on. If my father had been given land to use in the days of Joshua, then his land would be passed on to me and I would in turn pass it down to my son. Since this continued from generation to generation, a plot of land would remain in the same family for hundreds of years. Because of this, the land had a very special meaning to many Israelites. To the faithful, it represented the promise that God had made to Abraham: that He would give Christ and all of Christ's servants the land forever in the kingdom. So Naboth viewed his land not just as a plot of land, but he looked at it as a symbol of the promised Kingdom to come. On the other hand, Ahab looked at it as just a plot of land, because he didn't really care about the kingdom of the future anyway.

Even though Ahab repented of his wickedness, he would soon turn away from Yahweh again. In the end he disobeyed Yahweh and listened instead to the advice of his prophets of Ba'al who encouraged him to go to battle against the Syrians, promising him victory.

If Ahab had learned that Yahweh was the only true God, he would have not have gone into this battle. But, just as Yahweh had said, he was killed in the battle and dogs licked up his blood.

The amazing miracles that Ahab had seen had not converted him, because he did not diligently look into the word of Yahweh for himself. Had he done so he could have been converted by the still small voice of the word of God.

After Ahab's death, his son Ahaziah became king. He had exactly the same problem as Ahab: he did not believe that Yahweh was the only true God. Like his father, he did not want to keep Yahweh's commands and so he sought other gods.

The mighty miracles of Yahweh were once again necessary to show the kings of Israel that Yahweh was a powerful God. This was important because at the same time Yahweh's prophets were teaching throughout the land and the still small voice was converting many.

Elijah's Mantle Passed To Elisha

After Yahweh showed Elijah that the people would only be converted by the still small voice of God, the focus of his work changed to the direct teaching of the people. Elijah, Elisha, and a growing group of men known as the "sons of the prophets" went out among the people to educate them about Yahweh and the kingdom that He had promised. In this way Elijah re-established the school of the prophets that had been set up many years earlier by Samuel. The school of the prophets had several different locations in Israel, and Elijah would travel on a circuit to visit these schools on a regular basis.

As the work of Elijah came to its conclusion, it was important that the work that he had started would continue. It was also important that Elisha be shown to be the one chosen by Yahweh to lead the schools of the prophets into the future.

We may wonder why Yahweh took Elijah away, rather that continuing to use him. We have the example of John the Baptist who was killed by Herod in the prime of his life. His death allowed the focus to come upon Christ and many of his disciples became the disciples of Christ. In the same way the work of Yahweh would now be led by Elisha.

Elijah's Letter to King Jehoram of Judah 2Chronicles 21

For most of his life Elijah worked in Israel and not in Judah, because his work was to fight against the wicked ways of Ahab and Jezebel. After he had been taken up in the whirlwind however, God directed him to write a letter to King Jehoram of Judah because the wickedness of Jezebel had spread to the throne of Judah. In fact the Queen of Judah was none other than the daughter of Jezebel and Ahab, Athaliah. King Jehoram had married Athaliah and soon all the wicked ways of Jezebel were spreading through the land of Judah.

It must have been an ominous moment in the court of Jehoram when the letter was read and everyone realized that Elijah was alive and well. It must have been particularly difficult for Athaliah who would have remembered the difficulties that Elijah had caused her mother Jezebel, especially when she heard the judgments that Yahweh would bring on Jehoram, his people, his children, his wives and his goods.

I Will Send You Elijah the Prophet Malachi 4

When you read about Elijah being taken up in a whirlwind you might have thought to yourself that that was a strange way for the story of Elijah to end. But his story does not end there, and it does not end with his letter to King Jehoram either. The work of Elijah was only just beginning at that point. The Bible tells us that Elijah will be sent to Israel again in the kingdom.

Malachi tells us that in the kingdom Elijah will be sent again to the children of Israel to teach Israel to be like their fathers. The "fathers" that Malachi is talking about are the men who are called the **fathers** of Israel: **Abraham**, **Isaac** and **Jacob**. These men believed in their hearts that Yahweh was the mighty one and that he alone was the ruler of the earth. They believed that Yahweh would send His son to set up a kingdom that would fill the earth and they believed that Yahweh would give eternal life to those believed with their whole heart.

Elijah's job in the kingdom will be to teach Israelites living all over the world about the kingdom and to invite them to be a part of it.

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The teachers in Israel did not know about the 1st and 2nd coming of Christ. Therefore, they said that Jesus *cannot* be the Christ (the anointed Messiah they were waiting for) because scripture plainly said that Elijah must first come and Elijah has not yet come. Because of this many people rejected him.

His disciples, too, had a difficult time understanding that Jesus was not going to set up the kingdom right then, but that he would come a second time, and *then* set up his kingdom. So Christ set out to show **Peter**, **James** and **John** that the rulers of the kingdom would not be mortal men but would be immortal. That he, Moses and Elijah would be raised from the dead and given life eternal.

Christ took them into a high mountain where they were able to see what it would be like when Christ, Moses and Elijah were given immortality. This great miracle is often referred to as the **transfiguration**.
