The book of the covenant is originally mentioned in Exodus 24:7 where Moses takes it and reads it in the audience of people. This is also what Josiah did. That is important because by reading the book, the people were to make a choice to either enter into a covenant relationship (a promise) with God or to turn their backs on him. In Moses' case, all the people chose to make a covenant but in Josiah's case, he made the covenant and the people just agreed to stand by it.

The judgments that were going to take place on Israel and Judah were in the form of captivity by the nations around them. But even with this, they would eventually be allowed back into the land, when they were ready to serve God



Vv.20-23: War Among the Nations

The phrase "after all this" refers back to the Passover. Just as the Kings account does not record everything that Josiah did, the Chronicles account skips the purge that took place after the Passover had been completed. It does this in order to move directly to the very last period of time in Josiah's life when the kings of the nations around Judah were going to war.
