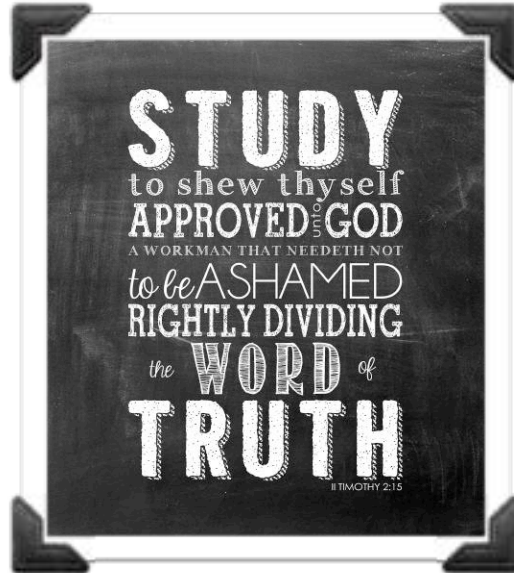

Be creative. You might want to make a diorama, poster or model. You can use anything you can think of (paint, clay, legos, etc.)!

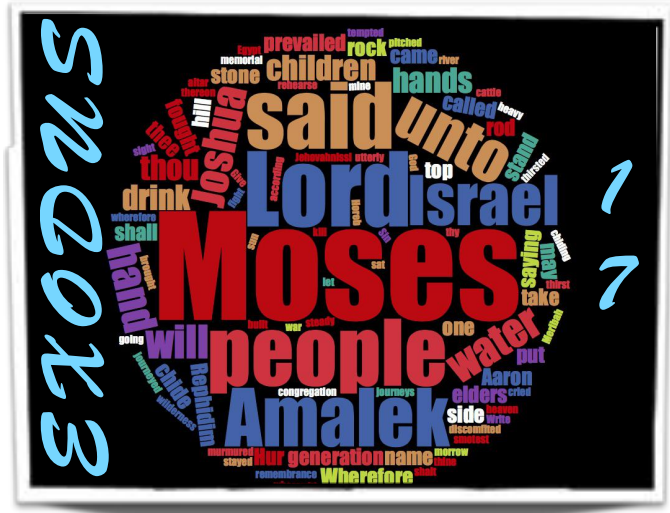

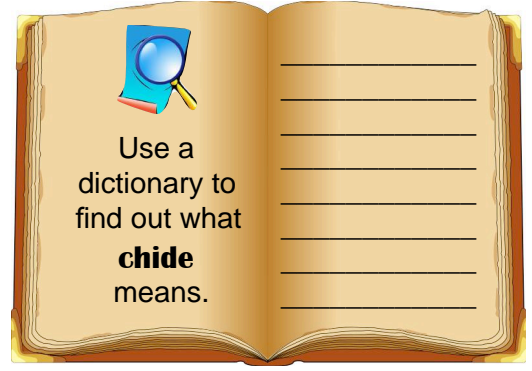
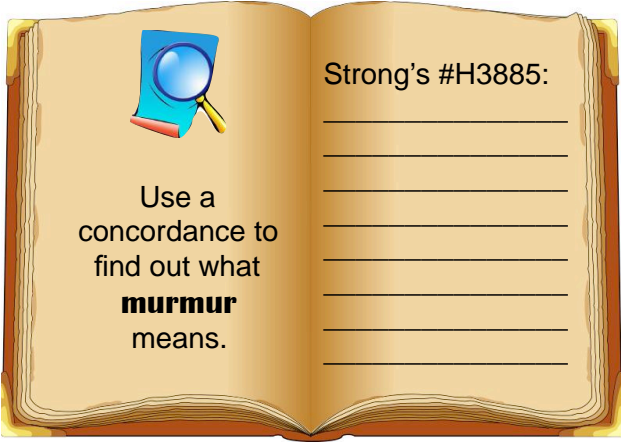
Our study of Joshua begins about 2 months after the children of Israel have left Egypt. At this point, they have crossed the Red Sea and are journeying through the wilderness, towards the promised land of Canaan. In Exodus 16, we learn that the people were complaining that Moses and Aaron had brought them into the wilderness to die of hunger. God responds by sending them quail and manna (bread from heaven) to eat. Exodus 17 begins with the Israelites complaining about leaving Egypt because of another problem.

A cubit is about 18 inches long or 1.5 feet. This means that 2,000 cubits was about 3,000 feet which is just over half a mile.

The people were to maintain a distance from the ark for symbolic reasons as well as practical ones. The ark was a symbol of God's presence among the people and because of His holiness, the people had to keep a distance. The ark is also a symbol of the Lord Jesus Christ who will lead spiritual Israel into the Kingdom of God.

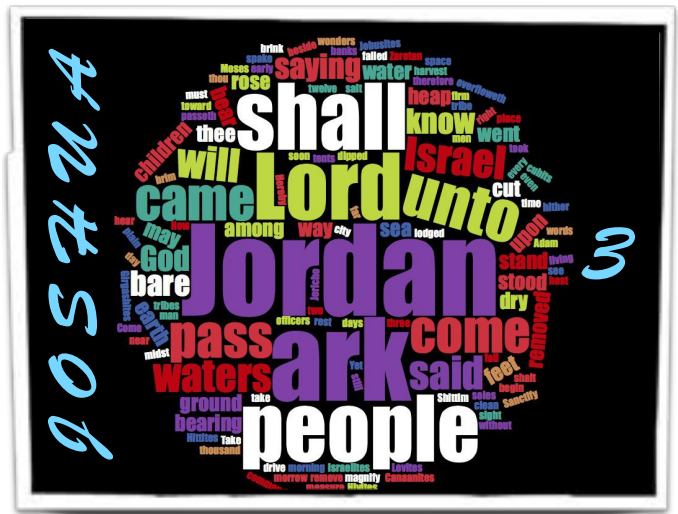
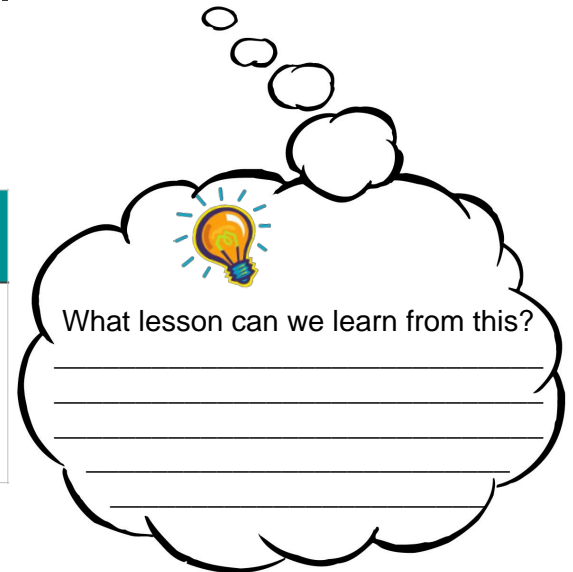
