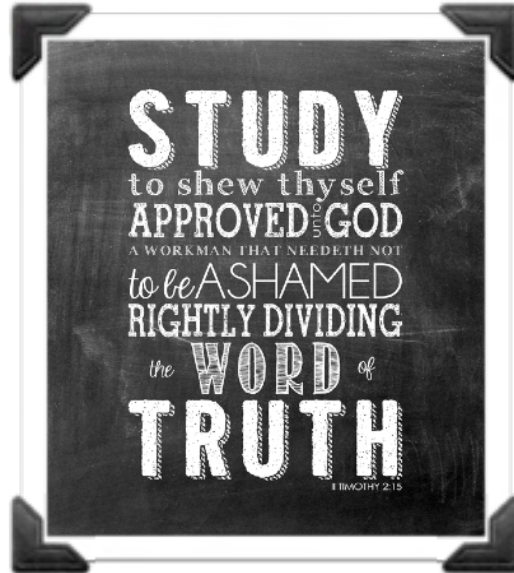

The 36th chapter of 2 Chronicles shows the punishment on Judah due to the wicked actions of the people. In this punishment, the capital city of Jerusalem is destroyed, the walls of the city are broken down, and many of the people of Judah are taken into captivity. Nehemiah was one of the first of his brethren to be taken by the Babylonians and was later sent to the city of Shushan in Persia. After he became the king's cup-bearer, we see that he is given the opportunity to travel back to Jerusalem to rebuild the wall and the temple. In the book of Nehemiah, we see the struggles that he faces while trying to rebuild Jerusalem. We can learn many things by looking at the example of Nehemiah while he continued to work for his people in Jerusalem.

The position of the cupbearer was one of great trust, confidence and honor. It was his responsibility to ensure that all the king’s drinks were free from poison. He lived in great comfort and wealth. Nehemiah’s spirituality is shown in his concern for Yahweh’s people when the report from Hanani came. In his position, he could have easily ignored the bad report. Instead, he prayed earnestly to God that He would grant Nehemiah the king’s mercy. This was needed because he was soon going to come before the king to request his leave to Jerusalem.

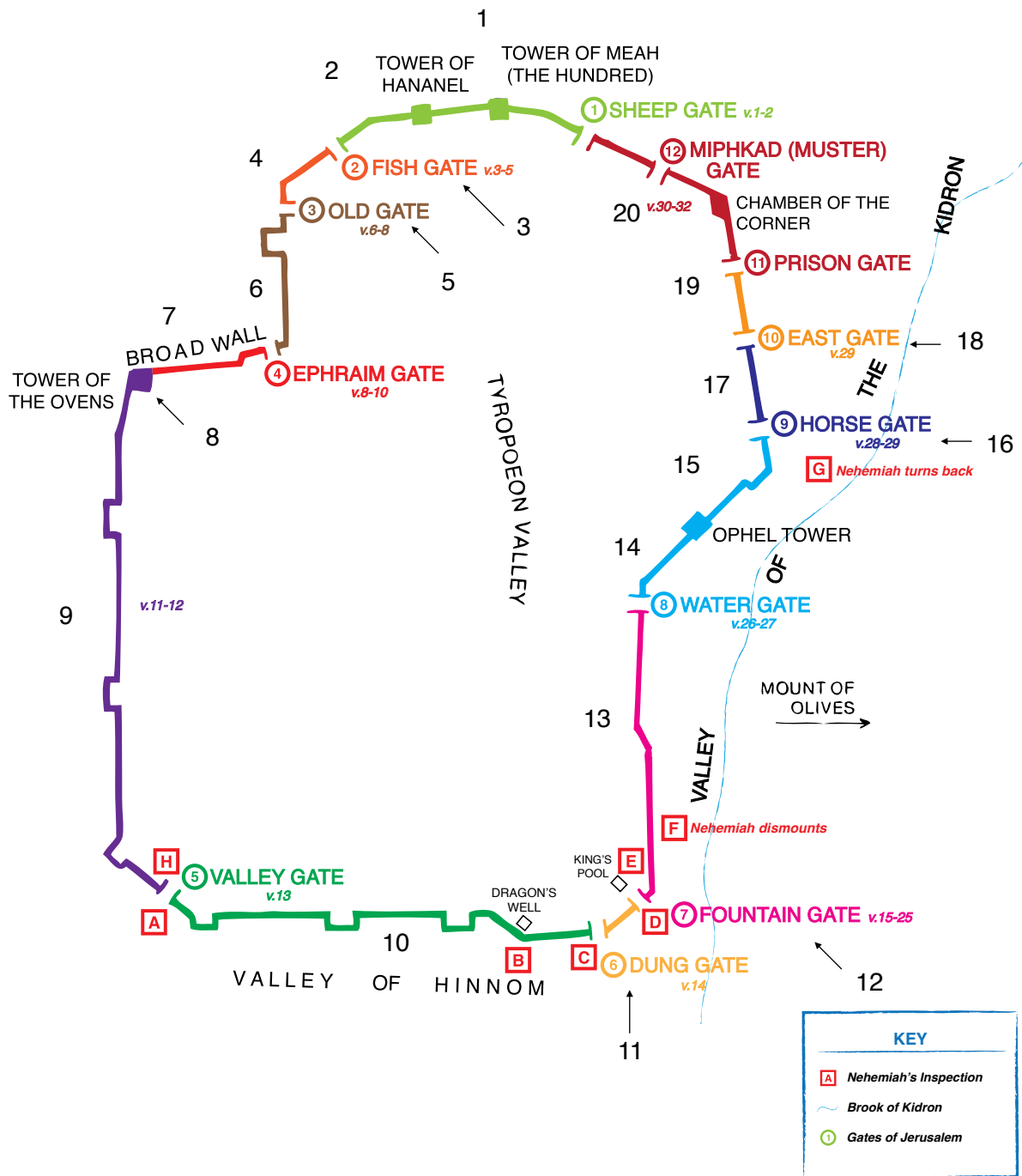
