Strong's Concordance

(This one can be a bit tricky to use so be sure to follow these steps & ask for help!)

1. Look up the word in the main concordance (the front section) just like you would in a regular dictionary.
2. Use the location of the word in the Bible to link it up to the Strong's number in the main concordance.
3. Use the number to look up the reference in the Hebrew dictionary which is found behind the main concordance.
4. You may also search for where the words are found by looking up the word in the main concordance and looking at all the different occurrences!

When Pharaoh heard of this talent, Joseph was brought before him and served in the palace. Eventually he became second in command over Egypt and brought them through the time of famine. It is during this time that Jacob & his family come into Egypt and settle in Goshen.

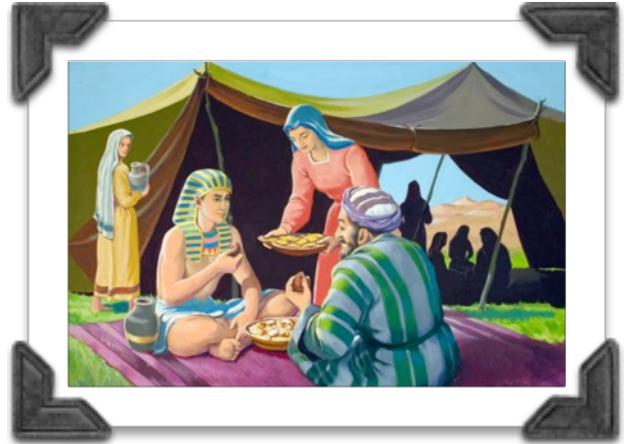

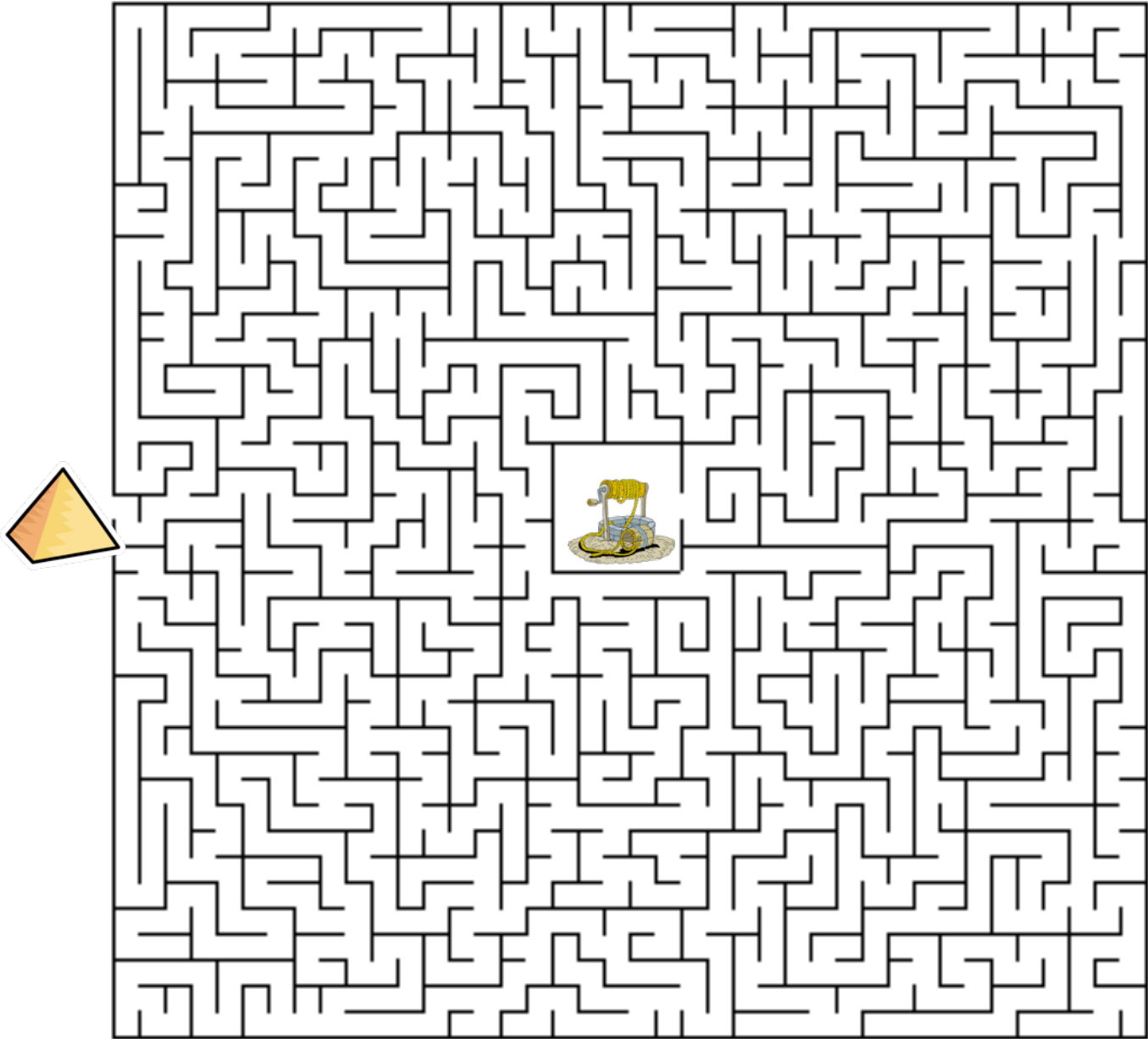

Jehovah is an incorrect translation of the Hebrew Strong #3068. It should be written as Yahweh. Interestingly, Yahweh had not yet revealed Himself to Israel, but He did provide Moses with an intimate knowledge of Himself. This knowledge would soon be passed on to the remainder of Yahweh's children if they would listen to the words of Moses.

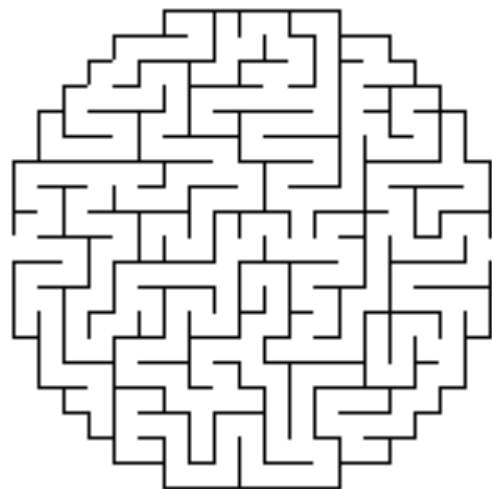

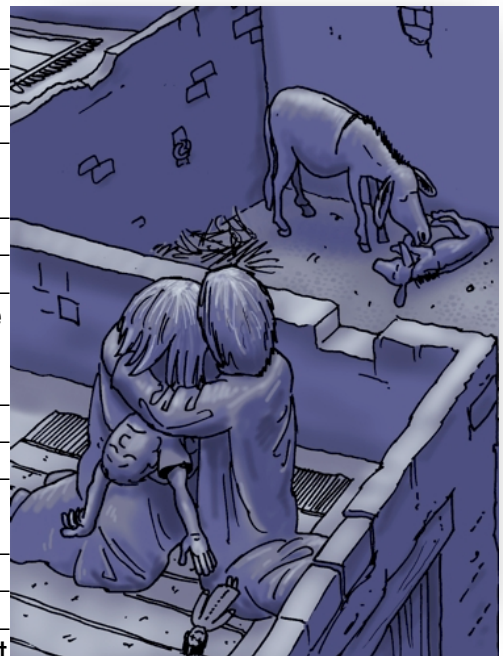

This must happen for us to partake in the memorial meal, which provides the covering for our sins, allowing us an opportunity for eternal life.

Only the circumcised servants who were bought with money were allowed to partake of the Passover meal. This showed their dedication to their master, in that they also desired to cut off the flesh, departing from its way, in order to follow Yahweh.

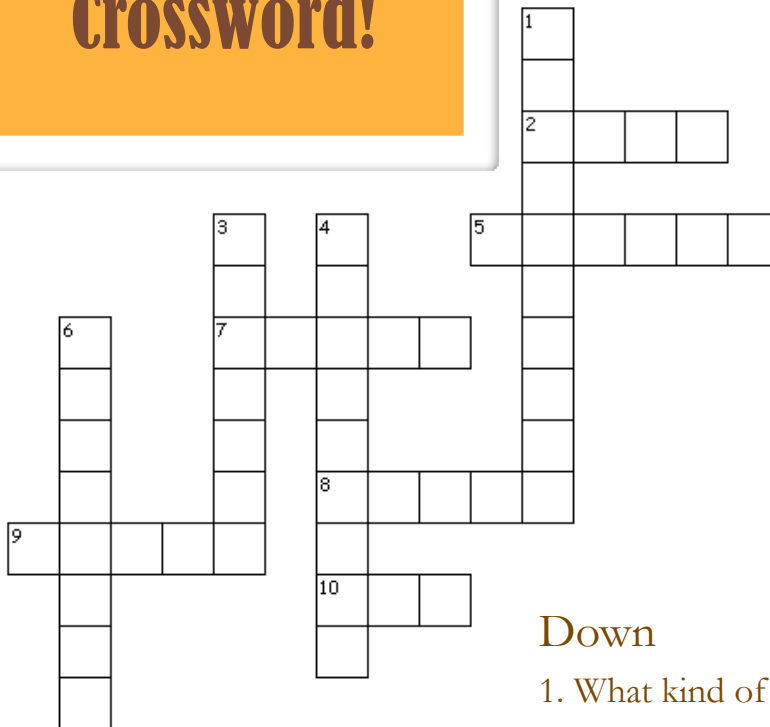

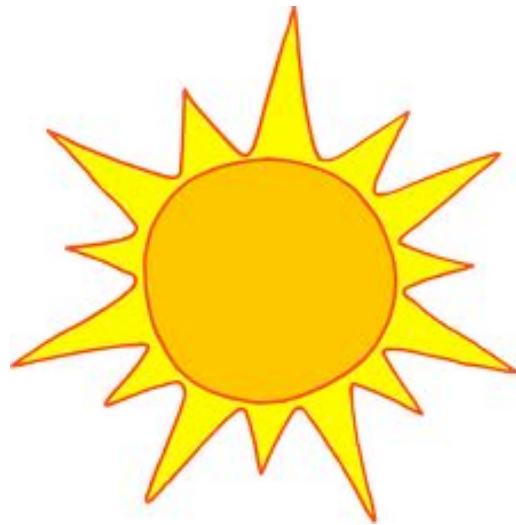

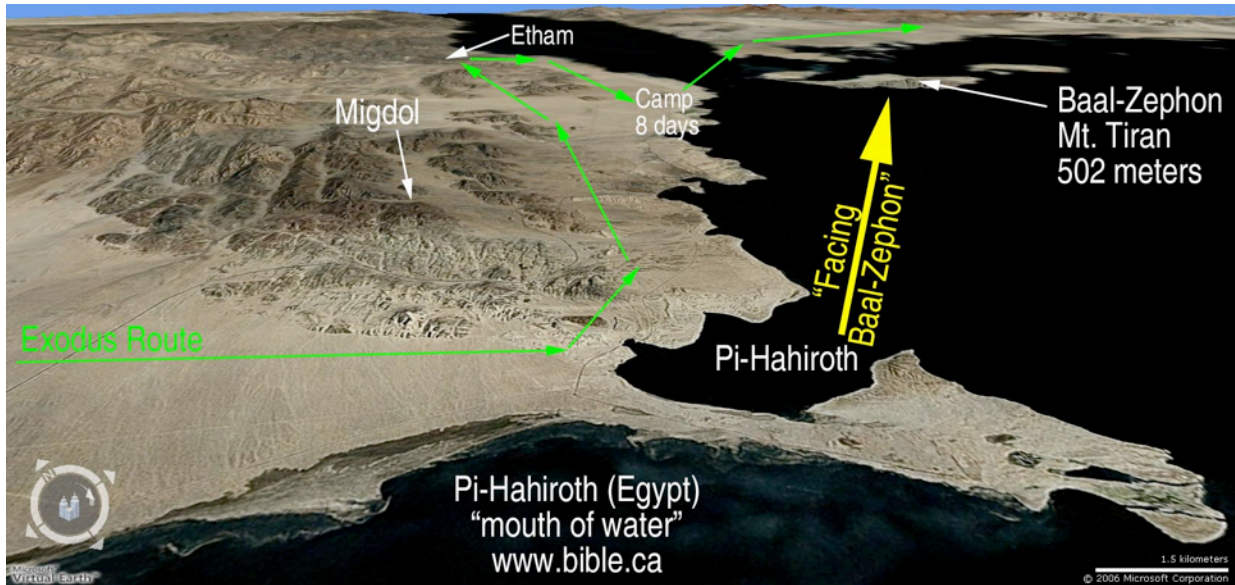
