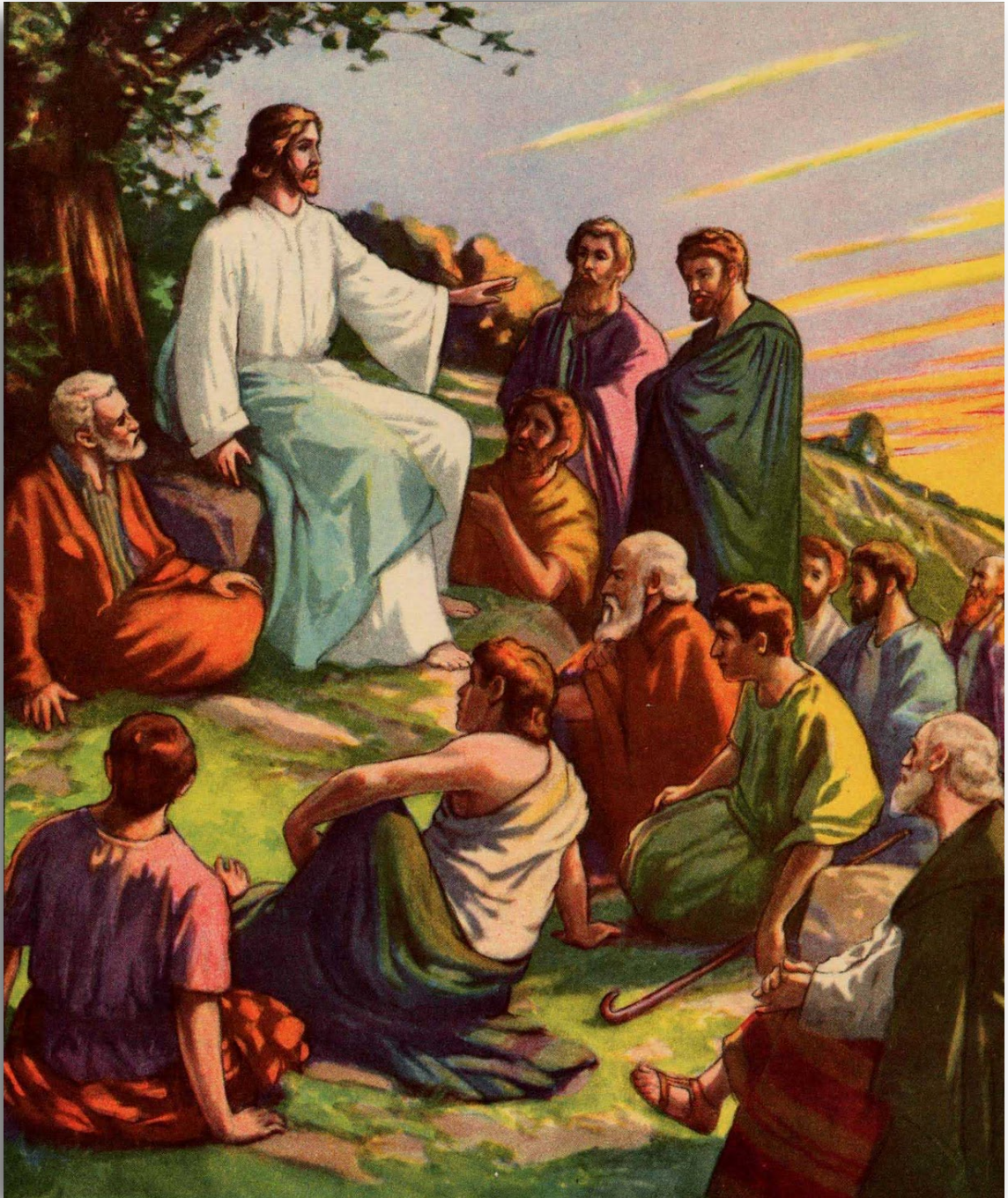

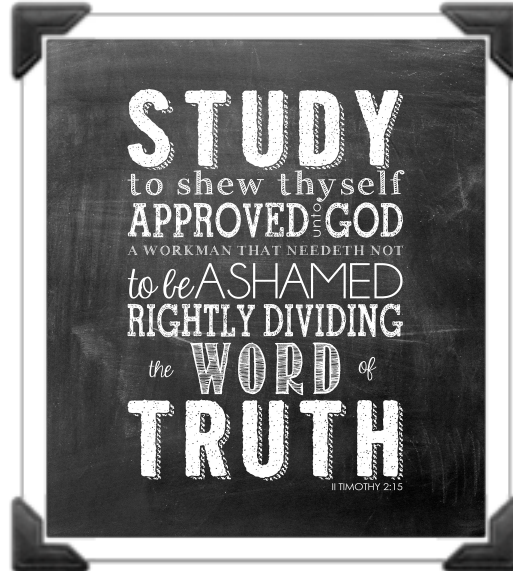

Introduction

THIS YEAR WE WILL BE BASING OUR STUDIES AROUND THE PARABLES OF CHRIST. THE PARABLES ARE SMALL STORIES, TOLD BY JESUS CHRIST. EACH OF THESE SHORT STORIES WERE BASED ON THE ROUTINE, DAILY TASKS, AND THE COMMON BELIEFS OF THE PEOPLE THAT HE WAS SPEAKING TO. PARABLES ALWAYS HAVE A DEEPER MEANING, WHICH IS USED TO TEACH A MORAL OR SPIRITUAL LESSON.

THE PARABLES ARE LOCATED IN THE GOSPELS OF MATTHEW, MARK & LUKE. IN MATTHEW 13:13-16 WE READ THAT CHRIST SPOKE IN PARABLES BECAUSE "THEY SEEING, SEE NOT; AND HEARING, THEY HEAR NOT, NEITHER DO THEY UNDERSTAND ... FOR THIS PEOPLE'S HEART IS WAXED GROSS, AND THEIR EARS ARE DULL OF HEARING, AND THEIR EYES THEY HAVE CLOSED ... BUT BLESSED ARE YOUR EYES, FOR THEY SEE: AND YOUR EARS, FOR THEY HEAR." IN OTHER WORDS, BECAUSE MOST PEOPLE THAT JESUS CHRIST SPOKE TO WERE HARD-HEARTED, HE SPOKE IN PARABLES, SO THAT IT WOULD ALLOW HIM AND HIS DISCIPLES TO SEE WHO WAS TRULY PAYING ATTENTION TO HIS WORDS.

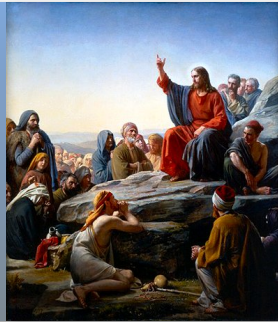
PARABLES ARE VERY IMPORTANT. THEY PROVIDED PEOPLE OF ALL GENERATIONS WITH INSIGHT ON HOW TO LIVE THEIR LIVES IN A WAY THAT IS PLEASING TO GOD. IF WE PAY ATTENTION TO THE PARABLES, WE WILL BECOME STRONGER SPIRITUALLY. THIS MAKES IT EASIER TO OVERCOME THE MIND/ THINKING OF THE FLESH.



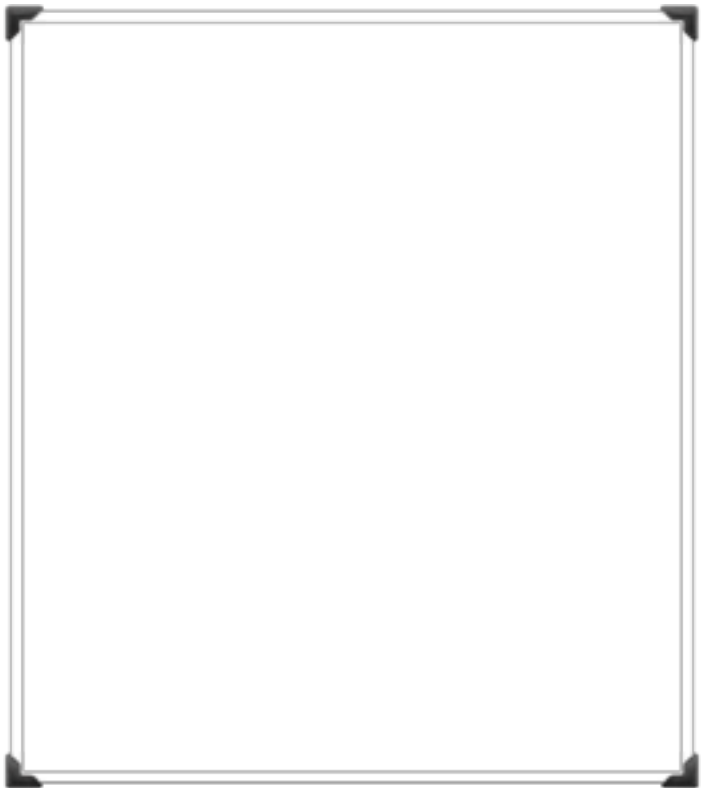
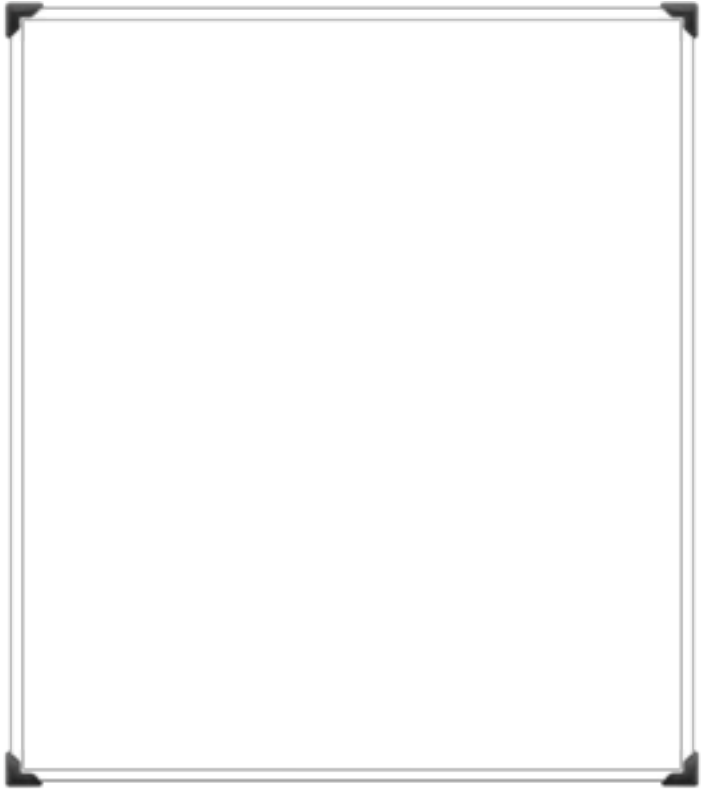
In this chapter, we read about how spiritual understanding is more important than physically seeing and hearing. The multitude's eyes and ears were spiritually closed because they made the choice to not follow Christ.

This is a decision that all people must make: we either follow Christ or we follow the things that are part of the world.

If we choose to follow Christ's commandments and listen to our Heavenly Father's word, we will be like the disciples who were able to both see with their eyes and hear with their ears.

This parable shows us the same thing that we are told in Revelation 3:15-16: it is better to be cold or hot instead of being lukewarm. The unjust steward chose to immerse himself in worldly things. He chose to be cold. If we want to follow God and be in His Kingdom, then we must follow Him ... we must be hot, doing what He says is right and living our lives to please Him. As it says in 1 Cor. 10:31, “...do ALL to the glory of God.”

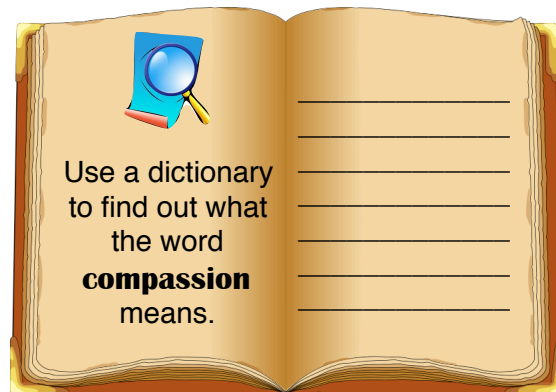
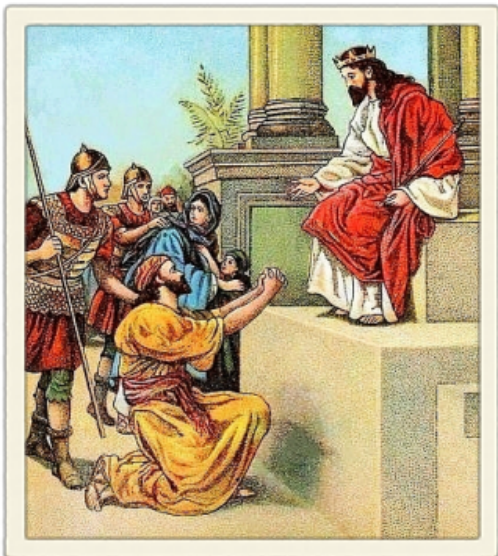

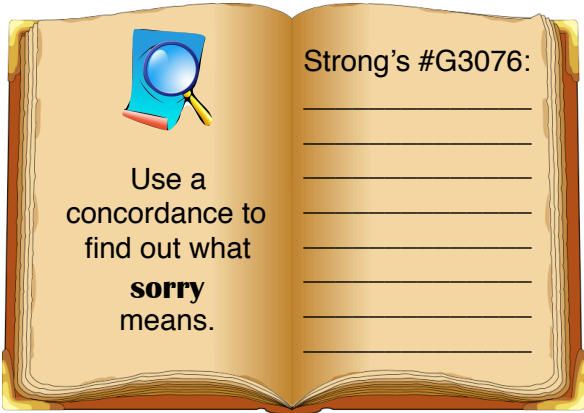
The value of 100 pence today is about \$2. This is nothing compared to the \$14,000,000 that this servant had owed his king in verse 24.

People often talk about God's grace and mercy and although they might seem to be the same thing, they are very different. Grace is undeserved kindness (something that God is giving us that we do not deserve). Mercy is when God withholds our punishment (when he forgives us for something we have done because we ask for forgiveness and repent even though we should be punished for our actions).

Tomentor: often referred to a jailer

The parable of the unforgiving servant reminds us that we must forgive others. The amount of sins that we are forgiven for, because we ask for our Heavenly Father's grace and mercy, is like \$14 million, compared to \$2 worth of sins that others have committed against us. We need to make sure that we immediately forgive others. When we do, after we plead with our God, we also can be forgiven.

THE TORMENTOR FOR US IS FAILING TO RECEIVE OUR HEAVENLY FATHER'S FORGIVENESS. WHEN THIS HAPPENS, WE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL OF OUR SINS. WE ARE ALSO RESPONSIBLE FOR FORGIVING OTHERS. IF WE DO NOT FORGIVE OTHERS THEIR SINS, THEN WE ARE GUARANTEED THAT WE WILL NOT BE IN THE KINGDOM.

A bag is a purse or other container that holds money. Every container that holds money can get old, but we are being commanded to get bags which don't get old.
