

What is the purpose of this book?

This workbook will help you to begin studying the book of Paul in order to prepare yourself for the week at Kid's Camp. This year we will see, through our studies of Paul, that God will provide "Salvation unto the ends of the earth" (Acts 13:47).

What if I don't understand something in the workbook?

Don't worry about it - there is ALWAYS more to learn! Nobody can understand everything their first time through. If you don't understand something, try rereading the passage or using another version of the Bible. Remember, this book was created using the King James version of the Bible, so that should be your primary source of information. If you are still stuck, ask your parents or aunts & uncles. You can also write down any questions you have and ask someone at camp!

What do I do when I finish my workbook?

When you have finished your book, go back through and make sure everything is clearly written and answered thoroughly. Don't forget to bring your work to camp and turn it into your counselor. There will be a prize awarded at camp for the best workbook!

Before You Begin...

Plan

- * You should be able to complete the workbook with time to spare by working on it for about 20 minutes per day.
- **★ Count the number of days from now until the week before camp**
- ★ Now, divide that by the number of pages in your book
- * That is the minimum number of pages you need to do per day!
- * Example: If there are 60 days until the week before camp, and there are 60 pages: 60 ÷ 60 = 1. The minimum you need to do in order to complete your workbook one week before camp is 1 page per day.

- **Strong's Concordance:** This one can be a bit tricky, so read carefully and ask for help!
 - * Step 1: Look up the word in the main concordance (the front section) just like you would do in a regular dictionary.
 - * Step 2: Use the location of the word in the Bible to link it up to the Strong's number in the main concordance.
- *Step 3: Use the number to look up the reference in the Greek dictionary which is found behind the main concordance.
- *HINT: You can also search for where words are found by looking up the word in the main concordance and looking at all the different occurrences!
- ****Bible Dictionary**: This one is pretty easy! It's used just like a regular dictionary or encyclopedia. All you have to do is look up the subject ~ everything is listed in alphabetical order!



Method of Study

It's always best to have an organized method of doing any type of studying. We suggest starting with a prayer asking for God's guidance as you study His word. Once you do that, you can follow the steps outlined below.



Read the passage completely, without stopping.



Learn the passage by carefully reading it in small sections. The general questions in the workbook will be asked directly from these sections.



Look into It! Investigate what you have read by looking up the meanings of names and places as well as other instances in the Bible that may help you to understand what is happening in Paul's life. This is where your resource books will come in handy!



Mark It! These questions ask that you mark something in your Bible so that you can remember it later. You will be given the information to mark, as well as where to mark it - don't forget to underline the word in your Bible so you know what your note is referring to. It is also helpful to have lined paper to put behind your page to help you write in a straight line.



Think about It! These questions require some extra thought about the passage to help you find the lesson God is trying to teach us.



Map It! Mark Cities & Routes on the maps provided.



Bonus! The bonus questions are a little harder to answer because you need to dig deeper into other parts of Scripture or find out some history. Reference books are handy for these.





Saul was a man that grew up at the feet of a person named Gamaliel. Here he learned the ways of Judaism and became a devout Pharisee. Although he was born in Rome, he wound up spending most of his days in Jerusalem so that he could learn the Jewish ways. We don't hear about Saul until the faithful follower of Christ, Stephen, is stoned. When this happened, all the people who witnessed Stephen's death laid down their coats at the feet of Saul. This meant that it was Saul taking responsibility, by agreeing with the death of Stephen. After this happened, Saul continued on with his persecution of the Christians. He went into the ecclesia that was in Jerusalem and persecuted them so much that many of the believers had to leave. Many decided to move to other places throughout Judaea and Samaria.



PAUL'S FIRST MISSIONARY JOURNEY

In the 12th chapter of Romans, we read that Saul and Barnabas returned from Jerusalem. We see that it is most likely that they returned to Antioch. Before they left Jerusalem, though, they joined up with John Mark, who was another disciple of Christ.

It is important to remember that there are two places that are referred to as Antioch: Antioch in Syria and Antioch in Pisidia. The Syrian Antioch is about 16 miles from the Mediterranean, about 300 miles north of Jerusalem. This was a central point for the missionary journeys to begin and end. Antioch Pisidia was a city in the extreme north of Pisidia, east of Ephesus.



Summary of Paul's exhortation in Acts 13:16-41 (Questions 50-53)

Paul exhorted the people in order to help them understand what was going to happen to them if they did not change from their wicked ways. Throughout Israel's history, the Jews went back and forth from being help captive by foreign nations, to being delivered by God. Paul shows the people in the temple the examples of Israel's deliverance from Egypt. After this, they wandered in the wilderness because of their sins before God brought them into the promised land. Then God delivered them into the hands of different nations. This went back and forth throughout all the Judges (450 years) until Israel turned on God and



wanted a human king. Saul became king but was wicked so God delivered them from him by giving them David as a new king.

Fortunately, David was a man after God's own heart. It was through his lineage that Christ would be born. The people did not listen to John (who preached the coming of Christ) nor did they listen to Christ. They also did not believe that Christ was the Messiah and that through him our sins could be forgiven. The law could not make anyone just or righteous, but Christ can. Paul wanted the people to believe that.

If they didn't believe though, they would be delivered, just like their ancestors, into the hands of a different nation. God would make Rome the nation that would overrun Jerusalem for their unbelief and for their wickedness. And so Paul exhorted the people to believe and change from their wicked ways, or destruction would come upon them.

Acts 23:34-26:32 & Summary "Tried in Caesarea"

SUMMARY While Paul was in Caesarea, we learn that he was tried by three different men. Iheir names were Felix (23:32-24:26), Festus (24:27-25:22) and King Agrippa (25:23-26:32). Both Felix and Festus were the governors in the region, while Agrippa was the King. It is amazing that while being tried by each of these men, we see that Paul continues in exhartation to them and to those assembled in the trial. While exharting Felix, Paul reminds him of the writings in the law and in the prophets. In fact it was through his belief in these things that he was able to have a hope toward God and have faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, that through his death and resurrection, he in turn could hope to be resurrected to inherit the promises given to Abraham, Isaac and David. Even though Felix had an understanding of this way (religion), he kept him with hopes that he would get money from him, in order to be released (Acts 24:26). Meanwhile, Felix lost his position and Festus became the governor. We see that Festus wanted to please the Jews, and so he offered to send Paul back to Jerusalem (Acts 25:9), knowing that the Jews would then kill him. This in turn caused Paul to appeal to Caesar, and thus travel to Rome. Prior to travelling to Rome though, we read that King Agrippa came into Caesarea and that Festus wanted King Agrippa to meet Paul (Acts 25:13-22). Thus finally, Paul was able to meet with King Agrippa and provide exhortation to him. It was in this exhartation that Paul recapped the beginning of his life as a dedicated Pharisee, his conversion on the road to Damascus, and the faith and works of his dedication and belief in Christ, which ultimately culminated in the resurrection of the dead that was to be preached to all the world, both Jew and Gentile alike. It was on this note that King Agrippa interrupted Paul saying that "much learning had made Paul crazy" (Acts 26:24). Thus Paul ends his preaching stating that King Agrippa did indeed believe in the Prophets. In fact out of this preaching effort to King Agrippa, we see that Agrippa was almost persuaded to be a Christian (Acts 26:28). The only reason why Paul remained a prisoner after this time was because he had requested to be delivered to Caesar, and therefore he had to be taken to Rome.


PAUL'S SECOND MISSIONARY JOURNEY
