2.2 Location


For maximum coverage and the reduction of interference, here are some guidelines you should consider where you place the base unit,

- Place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- Place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- Avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- Avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential of interference. Try moving the other appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.

Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the phone's signal range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors.







4.8 Find the Handset

- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and select PLAY
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

11.6 Delete a Voice memo

If you have recorded a voice memo, you can delete your message in choose play

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 2 in section 11.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and select VOICE MEMO.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY
 and select DELETE
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

12 TALKING function

The AD595 is capable of speaking the numbers that you press on the numeric keypad (Talk Keypad).

Using the handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select TLK DIGITS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select ON/OFF.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY To Valid.

13 ANSWERING MACHINE

Your telephone base includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 30 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

13.1 Switching Answering Machine On/Off

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▼/▲ to select ANS.SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and V / ▲ to select TAM ON / OFF.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▼/▲ to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

Note:

You can press the key **ANSWER ON** of the base to activate the answering machine.

13.2 Play Messages on TAM

If you have new messages, the handset display will show e.g. 2 NEW MESSAGE, which means you have 2 new messages. New messages are played first, and then are saved as old messages, until they are deleted. Old messages are played again after all new messages are played completely.

Using the base

Press the key / to start the playback of the message

Using the handset:

1) Press LEFT SOFTKEY $\textcircled{\blacksquare}$ and $\checkmark/\blacktriangle$ to select ANS. SYS.

2) Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to show PLAYBACK.

3) Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** (**b**) again to start message playback and the screen displays the date and hour of the message received.

4) During message playback, press ▼/▲ to adjust the message playback volume respectively.

NOTE: After new message is played, the new message will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.

5) Press LEFT SOFTKEY (■) and ▼/▲ to select STOP, FORWARD, PREVIOUS or DELETE to perform the following functions during message playback.

STOP: Stop the current message playback and return to the ANS. MACHINE menu.

FORWARD: Skip to play the next message. The date and hour information of the next message will display if there is next message.

PREVIOUS: Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date and hour information of the current message will display.

DELETE: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

6) Press **LEFT SOFTKEY (b**) to confirm the setting.

NOTE:

Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operation during message playback.

- Press 5 to stop message playback
- Press 4 to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning.
- Press 4 twice to skip backward to the previous message.
- Press 6 to skip to play next message.
- Press 2 to delete the current message playback.
- Press 8 to listen the message slowly
- Press ▲/▼ to adjust the playback volume.

13.3 Delete all Messages on TAM

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY → and / to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/ to select DEL OLD.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY again to confirm delete all old messages.

NOTE:

You cannot delete new messages, so you will need to play them before trying to delete.

13.4 Record Memos on TAM

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () and ▲▼to select MEMO.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to start memo recording after the beep and "RECORDING" will be displayed.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to stop memo recording and save the memo.
 OR

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (to stop memo recording without saving and go back to TAM menu.

13.5 TAM SETTING

13.5.1 Record your outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call.

If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (→ and) to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select TAM MSG.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select RECORD.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to start recording your personalized OGM after the beep and "RECORDING" will be displayed on the screen.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (m) to stop and save your personalized OGM. Your newly saved OGM will play automatically. Alternatively, press RIGHT SOFTKEY (m) to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

13.5.2 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (→ and) to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select TAM MSG.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select PLAY.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (a) to play your personalized OGM (if you have recorded a personalized OGM before) and "PLAYING ANNC "will be displayed on the screen.
- 6. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () to stop the OGM playback and return to the previous menu.

NOTE:

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

13.5.3 Delete a Personalized OGM (SET OGM to DEFAULT)

Using a handset:

- 1. Repeat Steps 1 to 3 in the section 14.5.2.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select DELETE.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 🐨 and RESET TO DEFAULT is displayed.

NOTE:

Your personalized OGM and return to previous menu and the pre-set OGM is restored automatically.

13.5.4 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after two to ten rings or TIME SAVER.

The TIME SAVER function answers calls after 6 ring signals, until the first new message has been registered then the answering machine switches to answering after approximately 2 rings. This is useful when using remote access; if you call up the answering machine and there is no reply after four rings that means there are no messages recorded and you can hang up before you are charged for the call.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and $\checkmark/\bigtriangledown$ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY \bigcirc and \checkmark to select SET TAM.

- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

13.5.5 Set the Recording Time of Incoming Message

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select RECORD TIME.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY (■) and ▲/▼ to select your desired recording time (Available options: 60S, 120S or 180S).
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (to confirm.

13.5.6 Set the talking TAM Language

You can choose the voice prompt language of the answering machine from a total of 4 languages(English, Deutsch, Français and Nederlands).

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press **MENU/OK** and **▲/▼** to select **TAM LANG**.
- 4. Press **MENU/OK** and ▲/▼ to select the desired voice prompt language for the answering machine and SOS message.
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm

13.5.7 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base. When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

Using a handset:

- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.

Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent other people from unauthorized access of your answering machine.

13.5.8.3 MSG ALERT function

Set this function to make the TAM beep every 10 seconds to remind you that there is a new message to listen to.

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (→ and ▲/ ▼ to select MSG ALERT.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY () and ▲/▼ to select ON or OFF to turn on or off the message alert function.
- 5. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (To confirm.

13.5.8.4 Remote Operations

You have the possibility to register up to 4 handsets, 3 doorbells and several alerters on the AD595 ULE. All the devices are already paired in the factory when sold as a pack, therefore you will not need to register this device. If you need to pair another doorbell or alerter, please read the user guide of your device.

14.1 SET DEVICE

Press MENU/OK \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/\lor to select SET DEVICES.

1.1 CHECK SIGNAL:

DOORBELL: Press **MENU/OK** (and on the doorbell button to check the quality of the signal.

1.2 DOORBELL:

This function is to be set:

CHIME: In this function, you can set the doorbell melody and volume when you press the doorbell button.

RECORD?: Set ON to record the conversation with the doorbell when you answer with the handset.

DBELL DVRT :

This function allows you to transfer the doorbell alert to another landline or mobile number if you are not going to be home.

DVRT MODE allows to set the function to be in manual, automatic or OFF.

PRESET NUM: allows you to enter the phone number for the diversion of the call when the doorbell is pressed.

14.2 DEVICES

In this section, you can check the following:

Press **MENU/OK** \bigcirc and \blacktriangle/ \lor to select **DEVICES**.

STATUS: This function will let you know if the device is activated to the base unit or not.

LOG: This function is to display the doorbell actions in a list (date/time etc)

RENAME: This function is to change the name of your device.
