



How to host an RCX Tournament

So you're interested in hosting an RCX robotics tournament. Let me take a few minutes to describe the details of hosting. I'm going to go into a lot of the main points that are important for a well-run tournament.

How to host Responsibility (YOU)

- Host the event in a large space that can provide room for robot boards (min. of 2 but 4+ for larger tournaments) and a small amount of room for teams to "hang out" in the pit area. A gym/cafeteria combo or a large gym works well.
- Setup for the tournament the night before. Acquire or borrow tables. A very detailed list of resources are listed under the RCX Tournament "The Do List"
- Be the contact person for teams participating at your location. We will send you the list. The only type of questions you will answer will be about your event.
- All questions about rules prior to your tournament will be handled by us through our website.
- Work with us on finding higher-education partners to judge your regional contest. For example, in Northern KY we partner with the University of Cincinnati.

RCX Tournament Director (US)

- We supply the foundation for the tournament. We do this through our website with all of its resources and email. Resources include but not limited to; Q&A, description of tasks, score sheet, instructions for building the "playing pieces".
- For the KY state tournament we supply a traveling trophy for Elem, MS and HS.
