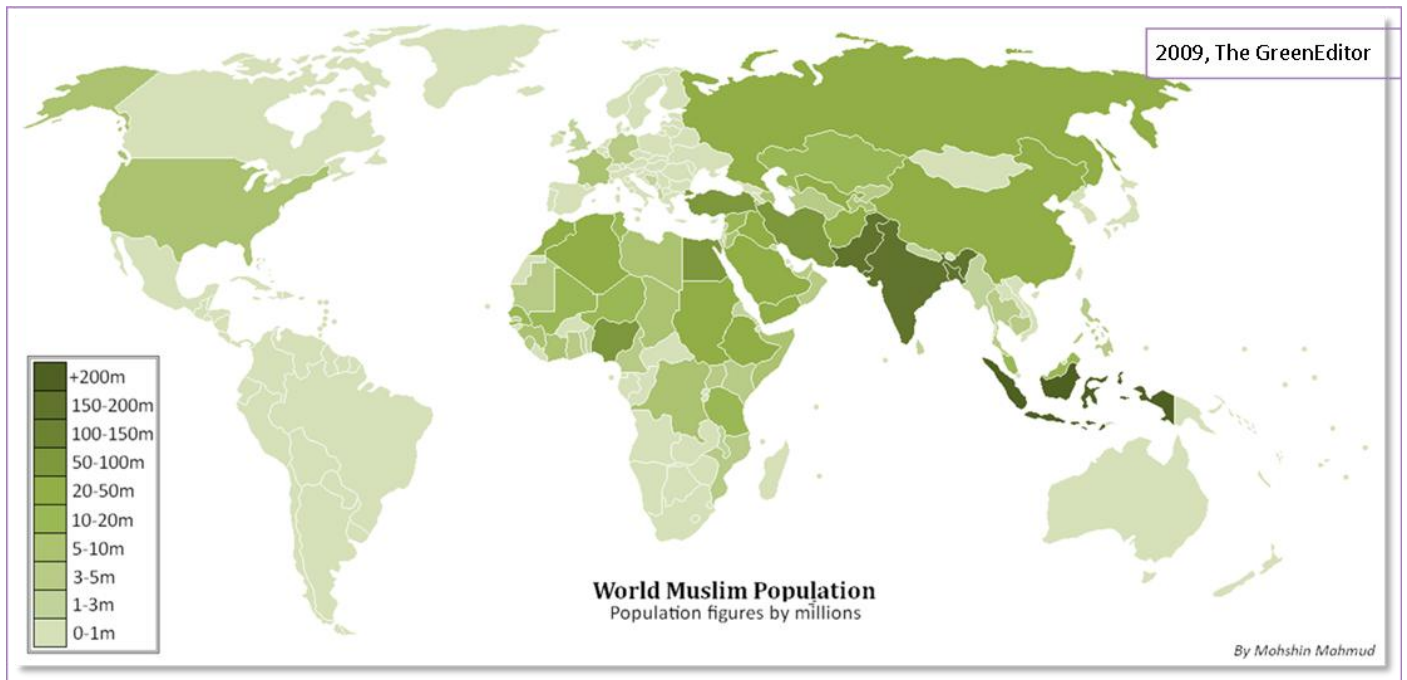

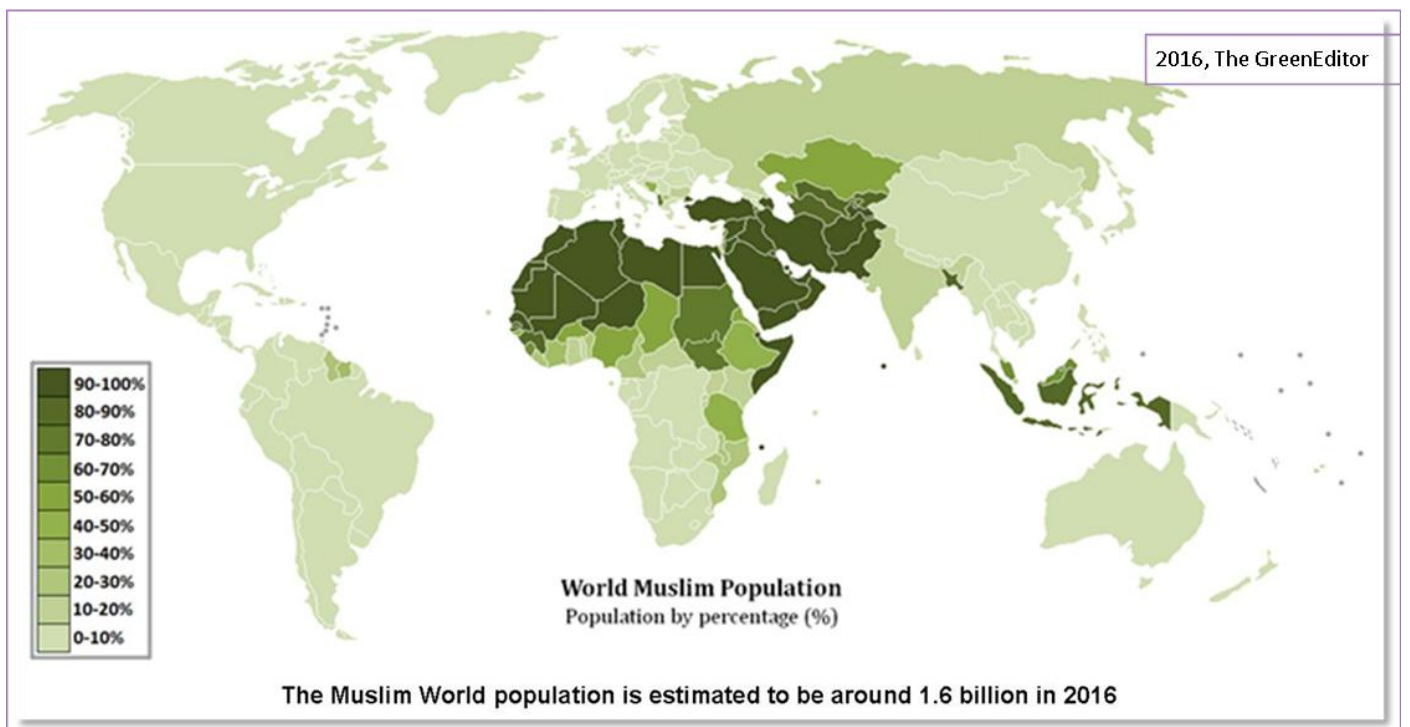
Muslim World Distribution

Map 1 is in terms of actual numbers in various countries:

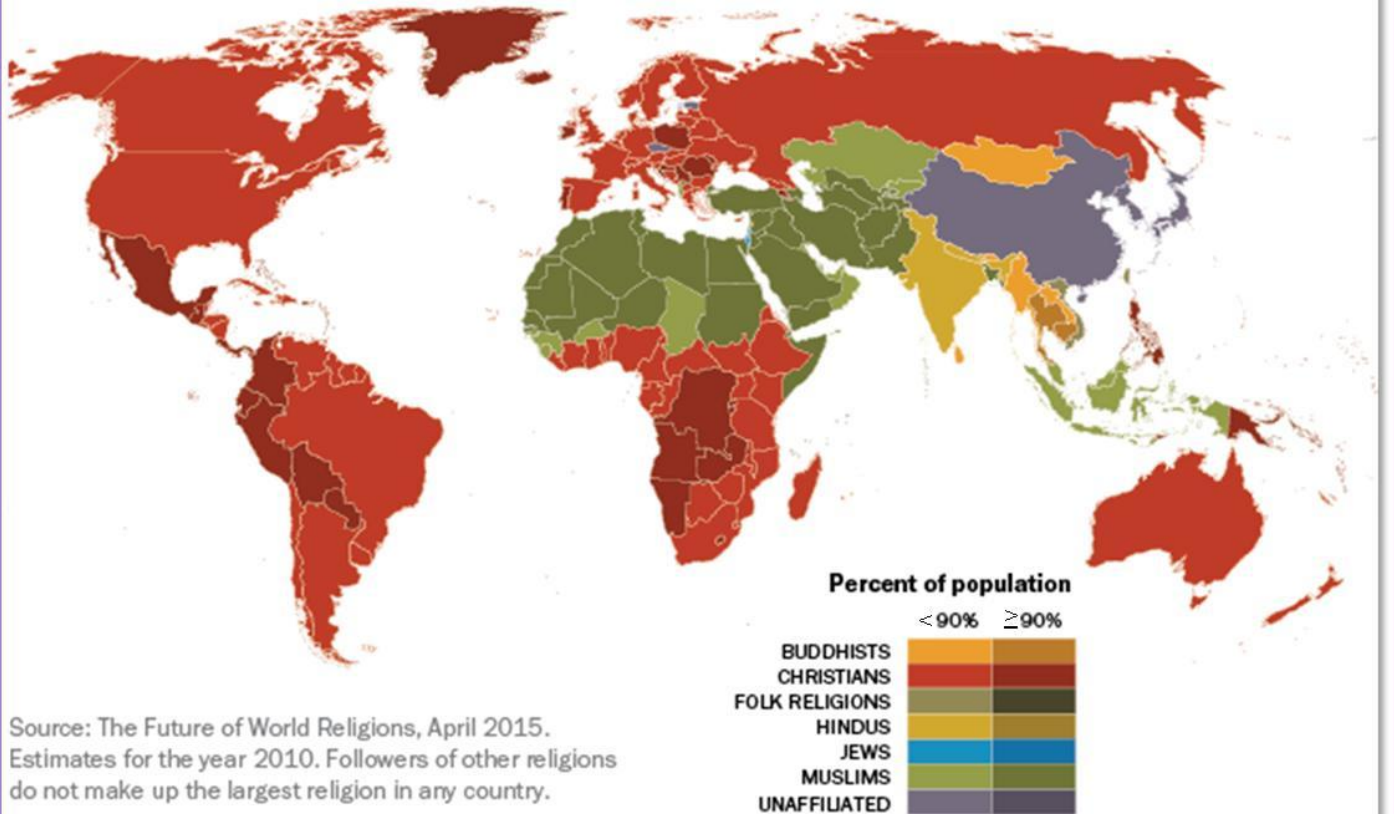


Map 2 shows Muslims by a percentage of a country's population:

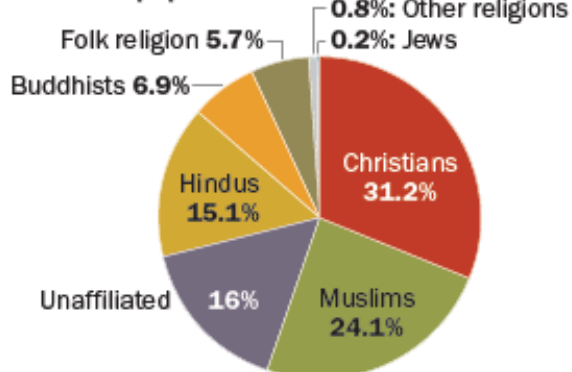

According to the Pew Research Center (USA) there were 50 Muslim-majority countries in 2010. Here is the situation in 2015 in terms of percentage of the world population:

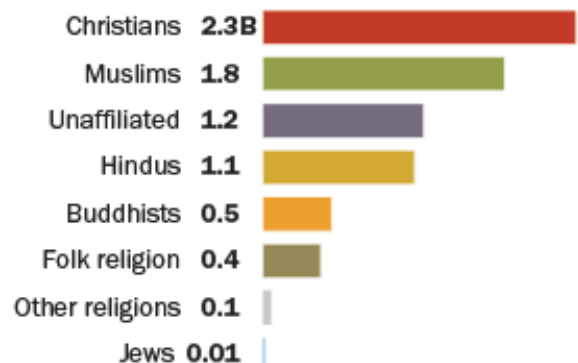
Here is a projection of the situation with respect to Islam in terms of population growth rate for 2015:

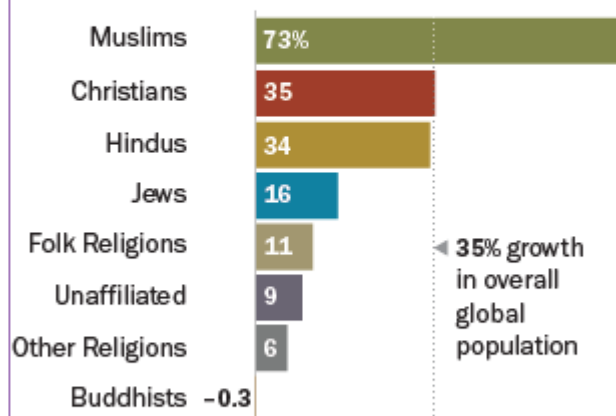
