General Instructions



Baby Quilt Approximately 50" x 50"

Liberty Tana Lawn Strips

All of the necessary Liberty Tana Lawn is included in your kit to complete the Pippi Baby Quilt Top!

In your quilt kit box, you will receive a jelly roll, containing (25) 2.5" strips.

Please note, we suggest keeping your fabrics in the order that they are wound in the jelly roll. This will help you keep your strips in gradient order.

Additional Fabric Requirements:

Fabric: 44 in / 112 cm	3.25 yd / 3 m
Fabric: 54 in / 136 cm	3.25 yd / 3 m
Binding	
Fabric: 44 in / 112 cm	.5 yd / .5 m
Fabric: 54 in / 136 cm	.5 yd / .5 m

Additional Supplies & Notions

- Rotary cutter, cutting mat, and quilting ruler
- Sewing machine
- Iron and ironing board
- Scissors
- Thread for piecing (we like Aurifil 50 wt cotton thread)
- \bullet Good sewing machine needles (we like Schmetz Microtex Sharp 70/10 needles)
- Batting (for final quilt assembly)
- Pins or Wonderclips (we like Clover Extra Fine Patchwork Pins)

Seam Allowance

Use a ¼ inch seam allowance.

The Pippi is a quick and fun quilt to make!

Gradient

Your strips have been ordered in a color gradient. We suggest keeping your you strips in the order that they arrive in the jelly rolls.

Steps

1) Trim off the selvages

Using a rotary cutter, mat, and quilting ruler, remove all selvages from the strips.

2) Sew together 5 strips

Starting with the first strip in your jelly roll, sew together 5 rows, lining up the strips to be square at the edge.

TIP: Switch directions every other row when sewing together the long seams. This will help eliminate any waves and will help keep your quilt straight.

Repeat for groups of 5 strips until you have sewn all of the strips together (5 groups total).

Quilt Top Assembly

3) Press

Press each section, making sure that the seam allowances are pressed in the same direction for easy ironing.

4) Trim

Trim each section to 52" inches wide (or less if any of your strips are narrower).

5) Sew together all of the sections

Being careful to keep your colors in order, sew together the groups of strips.

6) Final Press

Now that all of the sections are sewn together, press the entire quilt top, making sure all of the seam allowances are pressed in the same direction.

7) Final trim

Give your quilt top a final trim to 50.5" x 50.5".

Your Quilt Top is Complete! Finish your quilt as desired. Enjoy!
