OFFICER AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

- The May Membership Minutes were approved as presented.
- **Vice President Latane Brown** announced meeting specifics for October and November.
- **VB Fund Cheryl Jordan** reported on the VBGC fund which currently has a balance in excess of \$101,000.
- **Hospitality Joan Stumborg** pointed out that you can still drop your recyclables as well as sign up for flower purchases and other Garden Club events at Joan's Booth.
- **FFF Chairs Katherine Richardson and Meredith Rutter** updated members on preparations for the FFF with a date change to October 1 and 2. Members may pick up at 3pm on Tuesday. Members were encouraged to follow @VBGC Fall Flower Festival on Instagram and be on the lookout for communications from committee chairs. Katherine thanked the leadership team.
- **Conservation Allison McDuffie** (standing in for Audrey Parrott) reported that our nominee, Maurice Cullen, won the Garden Club of America (GCA) Joan Abernathy Hull Award which recognizes people who have made a tremendous impact on educating young people about our natural world. - **Historic Garden Week Donna Haycox** reported that the GCV statewide 2018 Tour had a net profit of over \$636,000. This year's tour will be homes and gardens at the Cavalier Residences. Donna thanked all of her committee chairs and head hostesses and arrangers.
