Sections 14 to 16, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **Somerset Brewing Company Limited** is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 32A Somerset Street Frankton 3204, Hamilton and known as **"Good George Brewing & Dining Hall"**, for consumption on the premises to any person who is present on the premises and to allow the consumption of alcohol on the premises by any such person. The business to be conducted on the premises is that of a Tavern.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with the Act.

CONDITIONS: This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:

 Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 3.00am the following day; EXCEPT THAT on the Thursday before Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve and on the day before Anzac Day alcohol may only be sold between 8.00am and 12.00 midnight.
- (b) No alcohol may be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day to any person other than any person who is present on the premise for the purpose of dining.
- (c) The Licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol delivered from the premises stated in this licence, at any other premises, in the course of catering, for consumption there by people attending a reception, function or other social gathering promoted by any other person or association other than this licensee.
- (d) The area where alcohol is to be sold and consumed is described in the plan date stamped as received by the Hamilton District Licensing Committee on 7 September 2017 and no alcohol is to be taken out of this area.
- (e) The entire premises is undesignated.
- (f) A holder of a manager's certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is sold. If a duty manager is not present then there must be no alcohol sales and a notice displayed advising the public of this fact.
- (g) A manager's register (as required by s.232 of the Act) is to be maintained and available on site.
- (h) The licensee must not sell or supply alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons. The licensee must display appropriate signs at every point of sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to such persons.
- (i) The licensee must maintain and display a Host Responsibility Policy and ensure all staff receive training in their responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- (j) A range of low-alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks must be available at all times when open for the sale of alcohol.
- (k) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises is open for the sale of alcohol in accordance with the restaurant menu submitted with the application for this licence or variations of a similar range and standard.
- (I) Drinking water must be freely available for consumption on the premises at each dining table while the premises is open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
- (m) A telephone must be freely available for customers to call for transport and staff must assist if required. Telephone numbers for alternative forms of transport from the premises must be displayed.
- (n) The Licensee must ensure the following are displayed;
 - i) A sign to be seen from outside the principal entrance stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol.
 - ii) A copy of the original licence with all the conditions, just inside the principal entrance so persons entering can read it.

iii) A sign in a prominent place identifying the duty manager.
