



Expand Your Views!

With a simple twist or turn of its flexible coil, the Adventure Scope's camera can open up new worlds to observe and investigate. The camera's 27-inch lead and bright LED lights will let you easily see into small dark spaces. Study the habits of insects, worms and other tiny creatures by peeking into holes and stumps. The Adventure Scope gives you the freedom to explore more!

Getting Started:

The device requires three(3) AAA batteries, which are not included. To install the batteries, loosen the screw that secures the cover to the battery compartment, which is located in the device's handle.





Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (ni-cad, ni-mh, etc.) batteries. Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged. Once the cover is removed, insert the batteries following the polarity (+)(-) inside the fitted battery compartment. Do not force a battery into place with the polarity reversed because this can damage the device. Insert the battery compartment, replace the battery door and secure the cover in place.

Please note: Battery compartment fits only one way. DO NOT force the battery compartment inside the device's handle. See Figure 1.

Operating:

To power on the digital viewer screen, simply hold the trigger down. When you are done observing, let the trigger go and the device will turn off. Use care when adjusting the flexible coil. Do not grab or twist the tip of the scope.

WARNING: Do not submerge camera or screen in water.

Cleaning Instructions

To clean the camera lens and viewing screen on this device, only use a soft, lint-free cloth like a microfiber cloth. Do not apply excess pressure to the cloth to avoid scratching the lens/screen. To remove more stubborn dirt, moisten the cleaning cloth with an eyeglass-cleaning solution and wipe these areas gently being careful to avoid excess pressure. Protect this device from dust and moisture.
