

How can I improve language development with the children in my care?

One way is to provide a language-rich environment: Surround children with language by labeling objects in the environment, using descriptive language, and exposing them to a variety of vocabulary

How do I increase sustained interactions with children diagnosed with Autism and who are non-verbal?

Use visual supports: Visual supports can aid communication and comprehension. Incorporate visual schedules, pictures, or symbols to help the child understand what activities or tasks are coming up. Visual supports can also be used to communicate choices and preferences, reducing frustration and promoting engagement.

How do engage children in meaningful communication in indoor and outdoor play situations?

Use visual supports: Visual supports, such as pictures, visual schedules, or cue cards, can aid communication and understanding. Use visual supports to demonstrate rules, provide choices, or prompt conversations. For instance, if playing outside, show a picture of different outdoor activities and ask the child to point to the one they want to do.

How do I encourage greater peer to peer interaction with all children in my care?

Encourage communication and active participation: Promote open communication among children by encouraging them to express their thoughts, ideas, and feelings. Create opportunities for group discussions, show-and-tell sessions, or collaborative projects where children can actively participate and share their perspectives.

How can I provide a rich tactile learning experience that is related to everyday items that can be extended at home creating better home and centre partnership?

Provide opportunities for cooperative play: Plan activities and games that require collaboration and teamwork. Engage children in group projects, building activities, or problem-solving tasks that encourage them to work together towards a common goal. Cooperative play helps build trust, communication skills, and a sense of camaraderie among the children.

How can our educators use TalkiPlay as a tool to target goals for specific children to assist with articulation and simple words?

Practice repetition and imitation: Encourage the child to repeat and imitate the target sounds or words presented in TalkiPlay. Use prompts, visual cues, or hand gestures to support their understanding and production. Gradually fade the prompts as the child gains confidence and proficiency.
