

- Work completely at front of machine. Fastens on top of the quilt where your work is always in sight
- No need to reach under quilt for fastening. Nothing under the quilt to hinder stitching operation
- No additional templates or tools required
- Move tool around and fasten in different areas to put design just where you want them
- Make additional Dahlia patterns over top of first for an easy to make yet complex pattern. Your friends will be jealous over how accurate it is!


Directions for using anchor post, wafer & stabilizing pin



Hold anchor post with the prong the fabric (Figure 1). Lower post, piercing fabric with prong.



Gently rotate rear edge of anchor post back a little further than level, then bring back up to level and pull slightly forward in a scooping motion to seat prong (Figure 2).




The prong will be seated in the fabric underneath the post with the point of prong visible on top of fabric.

Insert stabilizing pin into fabric under bend in anchor post prong, and then back up to top of fabric (see photo above). Both ends of stabilizing pin will be on top of fabric.

Adjust so that both ends of pin will be covered by the template and are away from hopping foot and needle.

Slide the wafer under the anchor post and over the prong and pin.




Instructions

USE WITH EXTENDED BASE OR TABLE

Position the template over the anchor post and lay flat against the fabric. The tops of the template and the anchor post will be even.

Rotate the template gently from side to side to make sure it moves easily across the fabric surface without putting stress on the anchor post or fabric.

Stitch your Dahlia!



Bring bobbin thread to top of quilt anywhere on stitching line. Press down gently on template to hold in place and stitch in either direction to end pivot point. Stitch in place one or two stitches to anchor the thread at each pivot point.


Stop in the pivot point with needle down and rotate template until the hopping foot is seated in the next pivot point. Stitch from pivot point to pivot point, stitch in place, needle down and rotate. Repeat until Dahlia pattern is completed.

To remove template from quilt, lift the template up and off anchor post; remove wafer and stabilizing pin, then tilt front edge of post down and move backwards and up until the prong is out of the fabric.


Make a super easy 12 petal dahlia!

Without moving anchor post, make another Dahlia pattern over the first one. Line up template as shown below.

After rotating template, stitch in either direction to next pivot point, rotate, continue around being sure to keep previous stitching lined up with markings on template.



After first pattern is completed, walk back to this point and needle down. Rotate template until it touches the hopping foot. Begin stitching next pattern. Stitch and rotate all the way around as before.



Hint - interesting design variety can be achieved by combining templates in different sizes and patterns. To assure accuracy, **don't move or reposition the anchor post until all stitching is complete.**
