#### One tool does it!

- Template rotates around a stationary anchor post to keep pattern centered and accurate
- Nothing under the quilt to hinder stitching operation
- No additional templates or tools required
- Continuous line stitching possible with less tie offs
- Move tool around and fasten in different areas to put designs just where you want them
- May also be used for marking specific or partial designs



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

#### Stitch your star!


Round ruler foot must be used on your sewing machine to create an accurate pattern.

Bring bobbin thread to top of quilt anywhere on stitching line. Press down gently on template to hold in place while you move the quilt and stitch in either direction to the end.

Stop with needle down and rotate template until the opposite end cradles the foot. Stitch from end to end, needle down and rotate template.

Repeat until star is completed.

To remove template from quilt, lift up and off anchor post.



When final design is completely stitched, remove stabilizer pin, then tilt front edge of anchor post down and move backwards and up until the prong is out of the fabric.



# Feeling adventurous?

Sprinkle a quilt with stars using fluorescent threads. The stars will glow in the dark when you turn out the lights.





#### Directions for using anchor post and stabilizer pin





stabilizer pin



Hold anchor post with the prong pointing down to the fabric. Lower post, piercing fabric with prong (does not need to go through all layers).

Gently rotate rear edge of anchor post back a little further than level, then bring back up to level and pull slightly forward in a scooping motion to seat prong.

The prong will be seated in the fabric underneath the post with the point of prong visible on top of fabric.

Insert stabilizer pin into fabric under anchor post prong, and then back up to top of fabric (see photo above). Both ends of stabilizer pin will be on top of fabric.

Adjust so that both ends of pin will be covered by the template and are away from foot and needle.

- A 1/8" thick anchor post is included with every free motion template
- All anchor posts are the same diameter and may be used with other rotating templates by TopAnchor Quilting Tools.
