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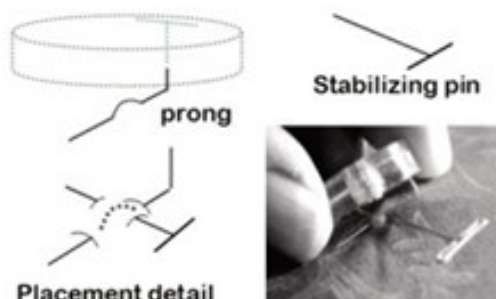

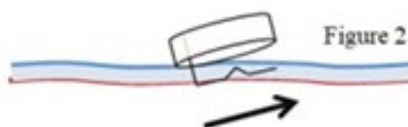
Directions for using anchor post and stabilizing pin



Hold anchor post with the prong pointing down to the fabric (Figure 1). Lower post, piercing fabric with prong (does not need to go through all layers).



Gently rotate rear edge of anchor post down & back a little further than level, then bring back up to level and pull slightly forward in a scooping motion to seat prong (Figure 2).



The prong will be seated in the fabric underneath the post with the point of prong visible on top of fabric.

Insert stabilizing pin into fabric under & across the anchor post prong, and then back up to top of fabric (see photo above). Both ends of stabilizing pin will be on top of fabric.

Adjust so that ends of pin & prong will be covered by the template and are away from quilting foot and needle. Place template over anchor post. Move template and fabric together for quilting.

Instructions

Position the template over the anchor post and lay flat against the quilt. The tops of the template and the anchor post will be even.

Rotate the template gently from side to side to make sure it moves easily across the quilt surface without putting stress on the anchor post or fabric.

Stitch your star!



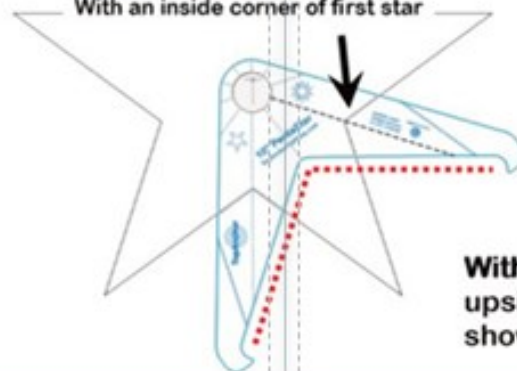
Bring bobbin thread to top of quilt anywhere on stitching line. Press template down gently to hold in place; move template and quilt together while stitching in either direction to notch. Stop in notch with needle still in quilt. Raise foot to rotate template to next position. (Take one or two stitches in each point to anchor the thread.)

Without moving quilt, rotate template until the other notch is cradled against quilting foot. Moving template & quilt together, stitch from notch to notch. With the needle down in the quilt, lift the presser foot and rotate the template again as before. Repeat until star is complete.

To remove template from quilt, lift template up and off anchor post; remove stabilizing pin, then tilt front edge of post down and move backwards and up until the prong is out of the fabric.

Without moving anchor post, make second star upside down over the first one. Line up template as shown in diagram.
