



Thank you for purchase of the Clean Space Project ULV Fogger. We are confident that this fogger will do the work better than any other fogging product on the market because of it's strength and capacity. It is also the best value. Please be assured that we have tested and improved this fogger before we sent it out to you. There might be some water left in the tank from our test. No, it's not weird. You can just add your water-based solution and get to fogging. Free water! You're welcome.

Operating Instructions:

1. Take the CSP fogger out of box. It will not be as effective if you leave it in the box. Please don't mess with the black filter that is under the hose assembly, as it is essential to the operation.
2. Put on your mask, glasses, and gloves. Hazmat suits are not necessary. Those inflatable Sumo suits are hysterical, but they don't really accomplish anything. Your call.
3. Add NO MORE than 1.8 gallons of water-based disinfectant to the tank. Please don't overfill. It will get leaky and you will be upset and you will blame us and we'll be like we told you. Tighten the lid on the tank.
4. DO NOT USE ALCOHOL OR GAS IN THIS MACHINE. All CAPS mean we are serious about this. The fan gets hot by design. If you use alcohol, it might be a VERY bad experience, as in, it could explode. Explode=BAD,
5. Make sure that the valve on the handle is closed by tightening clockwise.
6. Plug the unit into an extension cord or wall socket.
7. Pick up the unit, keeping the tank level, and get comfortable. The shoulder strap helps with that. Use it.
8. Turn on the switch on the top of the handle. This starts the fan. It might seem loud to you, but it is the same as a vacuum cleaner, if you have ever used one of those.
9. Open up the valve on the handle to release the spray. Play around with it, as that is how you regulate the stream and droplet size. When you are done, turn it all the way clockwise to close the valve. Don't worry about leaks. They happen, and then they don't. Keep working.
10. Walk slowly through your space making sure to direct the mist towards every surface and "touch-point". Vertical surfaces need it as well. Don't use on plates or glassware, because no one wants to taste disinfectant. Give it 5-10 minutes to dry.



Things to Think About:

-Again, wear some PPE. PPE=mask, gloves, eyeglasses. Maybe long sleeves and a hat. Up to you. Wash your hands all the time. Don't make us tell you this again. Washing hands frequently should be part of your life. My 5-year old daughter sings the "ABC" song to the end EVERY time. Please do that, everywhere you are, because it's both funny and effective.

-Please don't overfill. Sometimes the two tubes on the top like to leak a tiny bit, or more. This usually happens when people overfill the tank. It can also happen when the nuts and washers get loose. If you hand-tighten the nuts back down, and have the right amount of liquid in the tank, you will be fine.

-Sometimes the unit will leak out of the hose or under the motor. Don't Freak Out (DFO). This is normal, and usually fixes itself after a few more uses. Make sure you run it after you turn off the valve. Turn off the valve all the way. DFO.

-After each use, it is best to empty the tank before storing the fogger. DFO about leaks. It happens with \$3,000 foggers, and it happens with ours.

-Use only water-based, diluted disinfectants. We highly recommend CP-64 because it is the most effective and the most affordable. When diluted properly, the cost is under one half of a US cent per square foot. One half of a cent. You can't complain about that.

-Don't use in a high temperature environment. Don't leave it in the sun. Don't yell at the fogger, or make fun of it. The fogger doesn't forget.

- If the machine turns on but the fog is weak, make sure
 - *that you have enough disinfectant in the tank.
 - *that the pipe isn't twisted or folded
 - *that the suction port is free from obstruction.
 - *that the tank cap is securely closed

6. If you do everything right and it still won't start, push the button on the cord. It is a bit sensitive on occasion, just like us.

7. If you are absolutely, positively sure that you have done everything right and it still won't work, give us a call. We are here to help you.
