LOLA-LOCA THE POLAR BEAR

Earth Day Edition

SETUP

MATERIALS



- 1. 4mm crochet hook
- 2. 10mm safety eyes
- 3. Tapestry needle
- 4. Stuffing
- **5.** White medium-weight yarn, 40 yds, with 3 stitch markers in it
- 6. Blue medium-weight yarn, 18 yds
- 7. Green medium-weight yarn, 1 yd
- 8. Scissors (not included)

ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in continuous rounds. Watch video tutorials at **thewoobles.com/tutorials**

ch chain

sc single crochet

inc increase (2 sc in the same hole)

dec (invisible) decreasedc double crochet stitch

rnd round

HOW TO READ A WOOBLES PATTERN

round total number of stitches in the round

Rnd 3. [sc, inc] \times 6 (18)

what stitches to do this round, and how many times

For round 3, repeat the pattern in the brackets 6 times. The pattern is: single crochet in 1 stitch, then increase stitch in the next stitch. Because an increase is actually 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch of the previous round, the total number of stitches in this round is 18.

PATTERN

HEAD & BODY

White yarn.

Rnd 1. Start 6 sc in a magic loop (6)

To keep track of where you are, use a stitch marker to mark the beginning of each round. Each time you start a new round, move the stitch marker to the first stitch of that round.

Start here if you're using the pre-made piece

Rnd 2. inc x 6 (12)

Rnd 3. [sc, inc] x 6 (18) Rnd 4. [inc, 2 sc] x 6 (24)

Rnd 5. 24 sc (24)

Your piece might start curling - that's totally normal. For a neater final look, push the middle of your piece until it curves the other way. This makes the "right side" face out. Then keep crocheting to the left. If you're a lefty, keep crocheting to the right.

Rnd 6. [5 sc, inc] x 4 (28)

Rnd 7-9. 28 sc (28)

Rnd 10. [6 sc, inc] x 4 (32)

Rnd 11-13. 32 sc (32)

Rnd 14. [2 sc, dec] x 8 (24)

Rnd 15. 24 sc (24)

Rnd 16. [sc, dec] x 8 (16)

Rnd 17. 16 sc (16)

Attach the eyes between rounds 7 & 8 with a 6-stitch space between them on the front of the head. If this amigurumi is for a baby or pet, embroider the eyes instead. Stuff the piece, shaping it like an egg.

Rnd 18. dec x 8 (8)

Fasten off leaving a long tail. Use needle to pull the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch. Pull tight to close the remaining gap.

EARS

White yarn. Make two.

Rnd 1. Start 4 sc in a magic loop (4)

Rnd 2. inc x 4 (8) Rnd 3. 8 sc (8)

Invisible fasten off, leaving a long tail. Use needle and tail to sew the ears onto the body, spanning rounds 4 to 6.

SNOUT

With white yarn.

Rnd 1. ch 4 (4)

Rnd 2. sc in the second st from the hook, sc, then 3 sc in the last st. Rotate the piece to work on the other side of the foundation chain. sc, inc,

sl st into the first sc of Rnd 2. (8)

Rnd 3. [2 sc, inc x 2] x 2 (12)

Rnd 4. 12 sc (12)

Invisible fasten off, leaving a long tail. Stuff lightly. Use needle and tail to sew the snout between the eyes, spanning rounds 8 to 10.

For nose, thread needle with arm's length of black yarn.

Step 1.

Insert needle on right of snout, and pull it out one stitch to the right of the snout's center. Leave a 6-inch tail.

Step 2.

Insert needle one stitch to the left of the snout's center, and pull it out in the spot it just came out of.


Step 3.

Repeat step 2 as many times as you'd like.

Step 4.

When you're happy with the nose, insert the needle one more time on the left side of the nose. Pull it out where the yarn tail is. Tie both tails together, and hide them.









SCARF

White blue and green yarn.

Row 1. (green yarn) ch 4 (4)

Row 2. dc in the third ch from the hook, dc (2)
Row 3. ch 2 and turn, dc in the third stitch from

the hook, dc (2)

Rows 4-5. (switch to blue yarn) ch 2 and turn, dc in

the third stitch from the hook, dc (2)

Rows 6-7. (switch to green yarn) ch 2 and turn, dc

in the third stitch from the hook, dc (2)

Rows 8-23. Repeat rows 4-7 four more times.

Rows 24-25. Repeat rows 4-5.

Fasten off and weave in tail.
