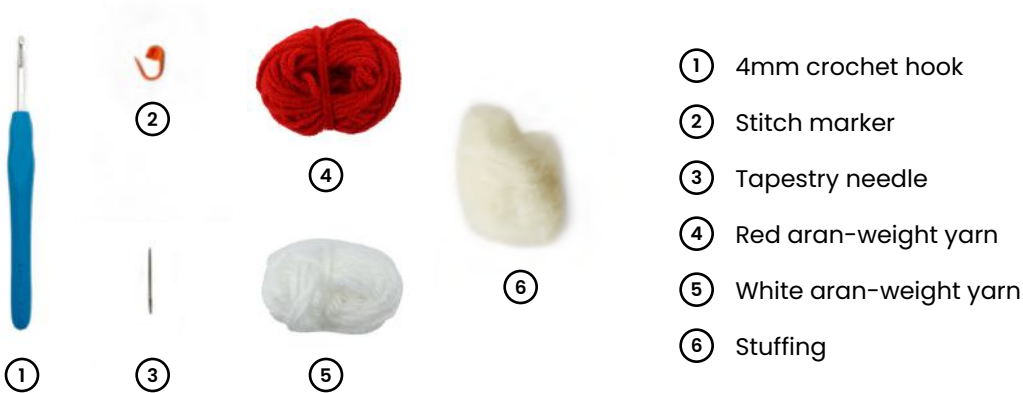
# FLOATIE

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# Setup

## Materials



- ① 4mm crochet hook
- ② Stitch marker
- ③ Tapestry needle
- ④ Red aran-weight yarn
- ⑤ White aran-weight yarn
- ⑥ Stuffing

## Abbreviations

This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in the round.

<u>ch</u>	chain
<u>sc</u>	single crochet
<u>rnd</u>	round

## Notes

### Stitch count

Your stitch count will be 8 throughout the whole piece. Since this is a skinny tube, we want to stuff the piece as we go. Use your scissors with the blades slightly open to push the stuffing through easier.

### Color changing

Do not fasten off each color until the very end. Once you change colors, leave the old yarn where it is, so that it's easy to pick up again when you switch back to that color.

## Floatie

Red & white yarn



Make a slip knot and chain 8. Insert your hook into the first chain we created (the furthest away from your hook) and make a slip stitch.

Be careful not to twist the chain!

☐ Round 1 in the back loops only of the chain, sc all the way around

☐ Round 2-5 8 sc

Change to white yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 6-9 8 sc

Change to red yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 10-15 8 sc

Change to white yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 16-19 8 sc

Change to red yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 20-25 8 sc

Change to white yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 26-29 8 sc

Change to red yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 30-35 8 sc

Change to white yarn, stuff.

☐ Round 36-39 8 sc

Fasten off and leave the white yarn tail for sewing the two ends together.

Tuck the red yarn tails inside the floatie.

Thread the white yarn tail through a yarn needle. Sew through the starting chain and through both loops of the last round we crocheted. Bury the tail and you're done!
