

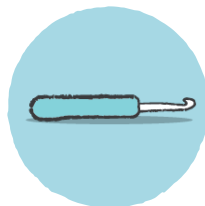

SETUP

MATERIALS



4mm crochet hook



Tapestry needle



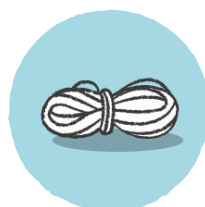
Stuffing



White medium-weight
yarn (7 yds)



Green medium-weight
yarn (1 yd)

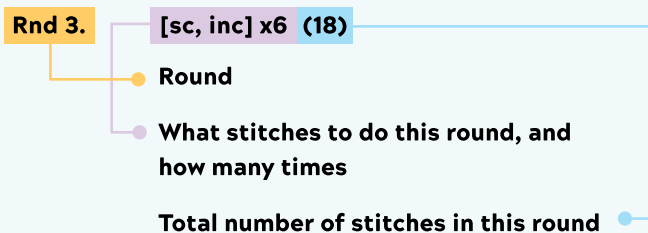


Orange medium-
weight
yarn (1 yd)



Scissors
(not included)

HOW TO READ A WOOBLES PATTERN



For round 3, repeat the pattern in the brackets 6 times. The pattern is: single crochet in 1 stitch, then increase stitch in the next stitch. Because an increase is actually 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch of the previous round, the total number of stitches in this round is 18.

ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in continuous rounds. Watch video tutorials at thewobles.com/tutorials

PATTERN

HEAD & BODY

With white yarn.

TIP Keep track of where you are by placing a stitch marker in the first stitch of the current round.

Rnd 1. start 5 sc in a magic loop (5)

Rnd 2. 5 inc (10)

Rnds 3-4. 10 sc (10)

Rnd 5. 5 dec (5)

TIP Your piece might start curling - that's totally normal. For a neater final look, push the middle of your piece until it curves the other way. This makes the "right side" face out. Then keep crocheting to the left. If you're a lefty, keep crocheting to the right.

Rnd 6. 5 inc (10)

Rnd 7. [4 sc, inc] x 2 (12)

Rnds 8-9. 12 sc (12)

Stuff the piece.

Rnd 10. 6 dec (6)

Fasten off leaving a long tail. Thread a needle with the tail; then use it to pull the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch. Pull tight to close the remaining gap.

SCARF

With green yarn.

Rnd 1. ch 24 (24)

Fasten off and tie the scarf around the middle of the snowman's body.

NOSE

With orange yarn.

Thread a needle with a forearm's length of yarn. Embroider a horizontal line centered on the head of the snowman:

Step 1.

Insert the needle into the body and pull it out between rounds 2 and 3. Leave at least a 4-inch yarn tail.

Step 2.

Insert the needle back into the body, one stitch over. Pull the needle out of the piece through the same hole it originally went in, so that both yarn tails are coming out of the same hole. Tie a knot with both tails and hide them.
