

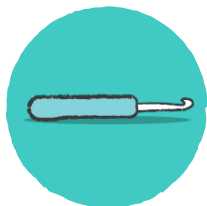
TINY ICE CREAM



THE
WOOBLES

SETUP

MATERIALS



4mm crochet hook



Stuffing



Tapestry needle



Scissors
(not included)

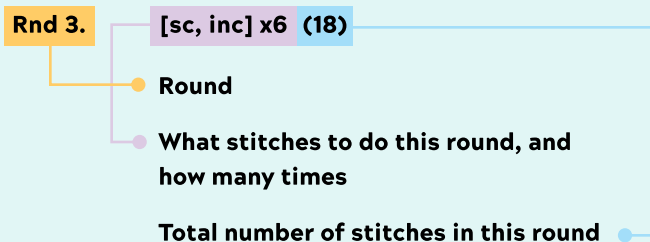


Purple medium-weight
yarn (5 yds)



Tan medium-weight
yarn (3 yds)

HOW TO READ A WOOBLES PATTERN



For round 3, repeat the pattern in the brackets 6 times. The pattern is: single crochet in 1 stitch, then increase stitch in the next stitch. Because an increase is actually 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch of the previous round, the total number of stitches in this round is 18.

ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in continuous rounds. Watch video tutorials at thewobles.com/tutorials

sc	single crochet
inc	increase (2 sc in the same hole)
blo	back loops only
dec	(invisible) decrease
rnd	round
sl st	slip stitch

PATTERN

SCOOP

With purple yarn.

Rnd 1. start 5 sc in a magic loop (5)

Rnd 2. 5 inc (10)

Rnds 3-4. 10 sc (10)

Rnd 5. 10 sc blo (10)

Stuff the piece with yarn scraps.

Rnd 6. 5 dec (5)

Fasten off leaving a long tail. Thread a needle with a tail; then use it to pull the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch. Pull tight to close the remaining gap.

To flatten the bottom of the scoop, pull the yarn tail through the middle bottom of the scoop.

Next, make the drips around the scoop. All stitches in these steps are done in the remaining front loops of round 5:

Step 1.

Sl st join the yarn to the first front loop of round 5, inserting the hook in the direction of the top of the scoop.

Step 2.

3 sc in the next stitch.

Step 3.

Sl st.

Step 4.

3 sc in the next stitch.

Step 5.

Repeat steps 3 and 4 for the remaining stitches in the round, until you have five drips total.

Step 6.

Sl st into the first stitch of round 5, where you first joined the yarn to the round.

Fasten off, leaving a tail.



CONE

With tan yarn.

- Rnd 1.** start 4 sc in a magic loop (4)
- Rnd 2.** [sc, inc] x 2 (6)
- Rnd 3.** 6 sc (6)
- Rnd 4.** [inc, 2 sc] x 2 (8)
- Rnd 5.** [3 sc, inc] x 2 (10)

Stuff the piece with yarn scraps, shaping it like a cone. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread a tapestry needle with the yarn tail. Attach the cone to the scoop under the drips, centered beneath the scoop, and hide the yarn tails.

Use the purple yarn tail to sew the drips to the cone if you desire. Otherwise, hide the yarn tails.
