# SAMANTHA CLARKE

The soprano to watch!

For the past couple of years, Australian audiences have witnessed the rise of this young soprano from Perth. During the pandemic, the Foundation helped Samantha, like many others, by providing her with a \$10,000 grant to assist with her vocal development. Since that time, she has slowly risen to become "the" soprano of her generation to watch. Currently in Japan singing Fiordiligi in *Cosi fan tutte*, she recently revisited Violetta for Opera Australia, having debuted the role in 2022 for West Australian Opera. During the summer, she also sang the title role of *Theodora* in Sydney. In May, she takes part in the Mozartists Concert at Wigmore Hall in London and sings Countess in *Le nozze di Figaro* for Garsington Opera in the UK. Mahler's 8th Symphony and the Mozart Requiem follow in Perth, before she returns to Sydney as Cleopatra in Pinchgut Opera's production of Giulio Cesare. The Messiah for Adelaide Symphony Orchestra complete's Samantha's year so catch her where you can.

Following this, he is back to Vienna for a Salieri opera, *Cublai, gran kan de' Tartari*, then Stavanger, Norway for a concert followed by Achille in Gluck's *Iphigénie en Aulide*, and Carmina Burana in Italy. Here's hoping Australian audiences get to hear this remarkable young tenor in the near future!

Sadly, many similar organisations have closed down due to ageing members and younger generations not willing or able to commit to their ongoing presence.

Running any charity in today's climate is difficult - for the smaller boutique style arts charities, it is even harder. I was deeply saddened to hear late last year, that the Sydney Savage Club had to close its doors having supported so many young artists for decades, including the Foundation through its funding for the Megan Evans OAM Encouragement Award.

In saying this, I am delighted to reassure you that the JSRB Foundation is strong, and will continue for many more years thanks to the level of support we have received and careful investment of our Scholarship Fund with Paradice Investments.

We head into 2024 with the same dedication as ever, that is to support as many young artists as possible through the Bel Canto Award and Sydney International Song Prize. ### A word from JAMES YOUNG - bass baritone

2023 Richard Bonynge Award Winner and man on a mission!

"Things are going really very well in Germany since the competition. I have now received my roles for Wiesbaden and it is looking very promising. I am mainly doing small to medium sized roles, but with a lot of performances, I will also get to do my own liederabend. I feel like I have made some of the biggest progress in my singing in the past couple of months. I actually applied for a second masters at the Hochschule in Nuremberg on the advice of my professor. Now I can prepare the roles for Wiesbaden with my teachers over the coming months. They are: Fiorello in *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, Sciarrone in *Tosca*, Sparck in *Fantasio* from Offenbach (this is actually quite a big role which I am excited about), and a small role in *Le Grand Macabre* by Ligeti.

The other exciting news to share was that I recently got back from Houston, Texas after being invited to sing in the final five of the 'Houston Saengerbund Awards'. They had 175 entrants and I ended up getting third place. This was hugely affirming for me, because I was the only non-American in the final and some of the others are already singing lead roles at the Met.

Again, I am incredibly grateful to the competition, I didn't realise it perhaps at the time, but I wouldn't have been able to continue in Germany without having won second place and the Mozart award. Now I feel like I have the best chance possible of preparing the roles for Wiesbaden and impressing them enough to be kept on and/or gaining another contract or an agent after this one is finished. Thank you so much, I want to convey just how much the competition's support has meant for me. It is still the greatest experience of my life and greatest honour."

# Theodora by Handel

In February, Pinchgut Opera and Opera Australia presented this rarely done work by Handel in concert. Starring four JSRB Foundation alumni, it was wonderful to see and hear mezzo soprano, Helen Sherman back in Sydney performing the role of Irene. Our 2023 Sydney Int. Song Prize winner, tenor Michael Petruccelli was Septimius and David Greco sang Valens - all Pinchgut favourites performing along side Samantha Clarke in the title role. The performances were conducted by Erin Helyard in the Joan Sutherland Theatre of the Sydney Opera House.


### This year at Victorian Opera
