ELIZABETH CONNELL

1946 - 2012

The mighty South African dramatic soprano passed away at the age of 65 on 18th February from cancer. Liza, as she was known by all, was a founding member of the JS & RB Foundation Board, an audience favourite and great supporter of young singers - some may remember her 2010 Masterclass. Her remarkable international career began as a mezzo, later becoming one of the greatest sopranos of her generation. Specialising in Wagner, Strauss and Verdi, her favourite role was Ortrud in *Lohengrin*. After twenty triumphant seasons in Australia, Liza was planning to retire to her beloved Sydney at the end of 2012, and was to judge this year's Bel Canto Award with Richard Bonynge. Equally at home on the concert platform, her final concert was in Hastings, UK in November 2011

which can be seen on You tube. Liza touched the lives of many and will be greatly missed by all. Our thoughts are with Liza's extensive family and those who loved her.

THE JS & RB MUSIC STANDS



In 1983, Diana Heath commissioned Australian sculptor Mike Kitching to create two music stands to honour Sutherland and Bonynge. The stands have been in use by Opera Australia, but at Diana's request, are now on loan to the Foundation. Each stand has a beautifully mounted silver butterfly set within a heavy, tinted perspex

frame, the idea of the butterflies having been taken from a design on the writing paper Dame Joan was then using. The stands will make their Foundation debut at the concert performance of RODELINDA and be used at subsequent concerts. The Foundation is proud to be associated with such beautiful artworks, created to honour the Bonynges – a sentiment shared by every member of the Foundation.


