Message from Roz Robinson

Cat Haven CEO

Hi Everyone,

Welcome to all our Members, Readers and Supporters

We end another year, and we are fully into kitten season, with litters arriving daily. Our last count of cats and kittens was 375 and one day alone saw the arrival of 96 cats and kittens.

As WA's only "Open Admission" Shelter, we have to deal with these sorts of numbers. What exactly does Open Admission mean? Simply, we never say no to any cat, no matter its condition, age, or temperament. Our doors are always open for intake, including Christmas Day. We provide afterhours amnesty condos for those owners who maybe too embarrassed to face surrendering their cat to staff and volunteers, or who can't get to Shenton Park in business hours.

Being Open Admission does put an enormous strain on our staff and volunteers, especially on very hot days, but we believe it is really important continue to be that place which never says "no" and where every cat does matter. Out intake for 2019 until the end of November was Incoming 7,380 (4,473 of these were strays) 622 fewer than last year and 5,842 adoptions, but still significant numbers. Despite this we are pleased to say we are maintaining our standard of zero euthanasia of healthy, treatable cats and kittens. At the time of writing this, we are fast approaching Christmas, when it is seen to be inappropriate to adopt out kittens due to the concern they will be returned in the New Year when they have grown out of

the "cute" phase. At Cat Haven, we haven't found this to be the case, in fact it is a great time to adopt when all the family are on holidays and there is time to bond with your new family member. All we ask that it's a well thought out decision taking on what is probably going to be a 15 year + commitment.

As we fast approach the end of another year, I just want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank everyone involved with Cat Haven for making sure we do continue to keep our doors open.

From all of our donors, fundraisers, foster carers, drivers, board members, volunteers and staff, without you we wouldn't exist.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Cat Haven.

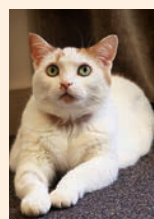

Cat Haven's Companion Cat Program

Cat Haven is Western Australia's premier cat welfare organisation, taking in over 8,500 stray, unwanted and surrendered cats and kittens every year. We are an open admission shelter which means we take in any cat, no matter how old, sick or feral. Cat Haven is a charity, relying heavily on donations and bequests as we have to raise 98% of our operating costs. We are committed to re-homing as many unwanted cats as possible and work hard to maintain our standard of zero euthanasia for treatable, re-homable cats entering the shelter. To help us re-home as many cats as possible, Cat Haven commenced a Companion Cat Adoption Program for mature cats in 2014. As older cats are often overlooked for adoption, they can remain at the shelter for many months, which can be detrimental to the cat's health and wellbeing. Our aim is to encourage Perth care facilities to adopt these older, more sedate cats to become a communal cat at the home. In turn, the cats will give companionship and joy to the residents.

What are the main benefits of having a companion cat in a care facility?

Studies have shown regular interaction with animals has a positive effect on mental health and also helps to combat feelings of loneliness, particularly in the aged community.

Are the cats easy to care for and how does Cat Haven help?

Any cat selected to be a companion cat will have had a full vet check done prior to being adopted into the facility. Cat Haven makes sure the cats are healthy, friendly and that the facility knows of any special requirements such as special dietary needs. Cat Haven Staff are available to answer any concerns and should the cat need to see a vet we will assist in making an appointment to see the onsite vet at the shelter. The cats selected for these facilities are generally older cats who only require lots of love, food, access to fresh water and lots of cosy spots to sleep.

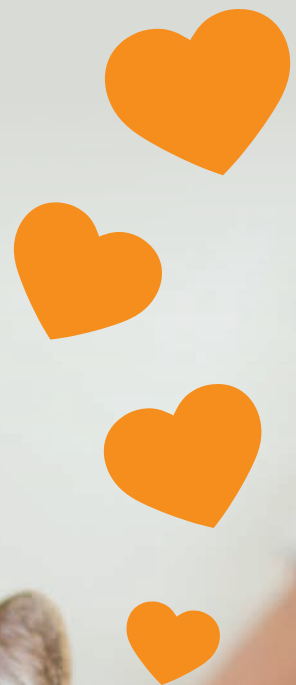


Does my cat LOVE ME

All domestic cats are born with the potential to form beautiful and everlasting bonds with the people in their lives. However, unlike our canine companions, cats have also retained their ability to hunt and survive a free roaming life independent of human care. This is quite unique to other domesticated animals and means that there are cats living a range of lifestyles around the world from a cherished family member living within the home, to feral cats which will avoid human contact at all costs.



So, do all cats want to be our pets?

It is vital to appreciate that every cat is an individual, and while many of us have already learnt that some cats are incredibly social and thrive on human contact, there are others that only want limited, short interactions, and some that want none at all. How friendly a cat may be will strongly depend on two factors. Firstly, it will depend on the cat's previous life experiences with humans especially those experiences that occurred during their early kitten hood period from 3-7 weeks of age, which is called the socialisation period.

Secondly, a cat's friendliness will also depend on their parents' genetics and temperament as this directly contributes to the cat's own temperament. The sociability of a cat will influence what sort of pet they can be, and it is important to respect that some cats are not suited to and may not cope well with living in certain types of households.

If you are looking at adopting a new cat for your home, it is important to discuss with the shelter what your home is like so that they can best pick a companion suitable for your needs. For example, a busy family household with young children would suit a confident, outgoing cat, whereas a quiet home with a single adult would be better suited for a shy, and less confident cat.

What are the benefits for a cat being a family pet?

Our cats are solely reliant on us to provide them all their important resources including a regular supply of fresh water and good quality food, and an enriched environment with opportunities to play, hide, perch up high, and hunt. We have a responsibility to preserve our native wildlife so in order to allow our cat to act out their predatory needs, we should provide them with toys to hunt in addition to using puzzle feeders so they can "hunt" their food.

We should provide our companion cats with the best preventative and medical health care to maintain their optimal health, and we also need to provide them with the opportunity for social interactions at a level that they choose and have control over.

What health benefits are there to owning a cat?

There has been recent growing scientific interest in determining the potential benefits of pets to people. Some of these numerous studies have looked at the benefits for dog and cat owners, and some studies have been conducted more specifically in cat owners. Areas that have been investigated have included what effects pet ownership has on the physical, mental and emotional health of people, including studies specifically on children, adults and the elderly.^{1, 2, 3}

The following health benefits have been found to be associated with cat ownership:

- lower heart rate;
- lower blood pressure, and therefore lower risk of cardiovascular disease; and
- Less reactivity and quicker recovery (as measured by heart rate and blood pressure) during simulated stress tests.

Cat ownership has also been shown to be related to a range of psychological and emotional benefits, including:

- feelings of enhanced social support, a feeling of belonging;
- reduced negative moods;
- decreased feelings of loneliness; and
- Increased self-esteem and feelings of self-worth.

So, does my cat love me?

Cats often get the reputation for being aloof and independent, but recent studies have investigated how cats respond and interact with their owners and confirmed that cats form secure bonds with their owners, meaning that the presence of the owner in an unknown situation gives them comfort.⁴ This research suggested that we may be underestimating a cat's social abilities and that in many cats it may parallel that of dogs. It is always important to remember that they are all individuals however and learn to read your own cat's body language and follow their lead on how they want to interact. Cats are the ultimate "control freaks" and if you let them always initiate their interactions, you will be well on your way to having one of the best friends you could ever ask for.

Common Foods that are toxic to Cats

The holidays are a time for lots of delicious foods that you might be tempted to share with your cat so it's important to know what's safe and what isn't for our feline friends.

Tiny little bits of lean cuts of meat will be fine, but here is a list of common foods to avoid giving to your cat:

- Meat that is cooked in or that has fat, stuffing or gravy in or on top of it.
- Onions are a big fat no-no. Onions are highly toxic to all cats and therefore they need to be avoided at all costs. Eating onions can result in anaemia and in bad cases can lead to death.
- Bacon is a high fat food, along with chestnuts and pate and they're not suitable to feed to cats.
- Be careful of chocolate! It is toxic for cats - not as severely as for dogs, but it can still cause problems such as vomiting, diarrhoea, extreme thirst and seizures.
- Potatoes, garlic, grapes, raisins, alcohol, milk and eggnog should all be avoided.

Remember to keep all foods covered and away from curious cats that might be lurking in the kitchen! Alternatively you easily could make your cat treats from scratch!

My role at Cat Haven is...
