Message from Roz Robinson

Dear members and supporters

It doesn't seem that long ago I was writing the message for Cat Chat Christmas 2019, but how the world has changed during these last 12 months. Who would have envisaged this global pandemic and the unprecedented and precarious times we find ourselves living in?

At the start of the pandemic we had a very worrying period where we didn't know if we would have to close our doors, which would have been the first time in our almost 60 year history. The thought of what would happen to the stray and homeless cats of Perth if we weren't here to take them in was beyond distressing for all of us at the haven. It was a very stressful time but fortunately we were seen to be an essential service and continued as we have done for 59 years.

We had to cancel our Quiz Night, a major fundraising event for us. But we thank the State Government for providing a grant opportunity to cover the funds we weren't able to raise.

It has been an interesting year in other ways for us. We made some changes in how we operate and went to adoptions via appointment system in order to maintain social distancing by restricting the number of people in our adoption areas. This has proven to be a better model for adopting our cats out as we can spend quality time with each person getting to know a little about them and their life style. We also found that so many more people wanted a cat companion during lockdown for a variety of reasons such as working from home and feeling isolated and lonely. There was a little criticism from some sectors we shouldn't be adopting cats out for these reasons as they would come back as soon as people returned to work. But we felt it was still better to get a cat out of the shelter, and we are delighted to say none have been returned due to COVID. It is wonderful to know that people are discovering the benefits of having a cat, or two, in their lives.

A number of times we had fewer cats than homes available which was a wonderful situation to be in. We assisted other rescues, particularly those in the North West, by flying cats down to be rehomed at Cat Haven where they stood a much better chance.

This year also saw one of our Companion Cats, Captain Cat, joint winner of the RSPCA WA Animal Award for 2020 which:-

"Recognises an animal that has made a significant positive impact on the life of their owner, or a member/s of the community. This award celebrates the incredible bond and loyalty that can develop between humans and animals." Captain Cat, who is in his twilight years, has been in service for 5 years, bringing joy and happiness to humans in their twilight years and we can't think of a more worthy winner than this beautiful cat.

Cat Haven also won outstanding shelter of 2020 in the Jetpets annual national awards in October. This was the third year we had submitted an entry being a finalist in 2019. We believe this is a great honour, especially considering how many other shelters there are in Australia run by hardworking and dedicated staff and volunteers, just as Cat Haven is. It validates all the passion and hard work put in by our staff and volunteers to continually improve the quality of care we provide for our cats.

As this year draws to a close, we look back on our successes in such difficult times and know we couldn't have succeeded without the support of you- we thank you from the bottom of our hearts. We also thank all of our staff and volunteers who work so incredibly hard in rain, hail or shine.

I think this Christmas we will all be that little more grateful, and hoping you spend yours with the people who mean the most to you.

As we look towards 2021, our 60th year, we don't know what is ahead of us- but one thing is sure. Cat Haven will be here doing what we have done for the last 60 years, making sure every cat does matter.

Cat Haven were elated this year with the honour of being awarded as winner of JetPets Companion Animal Rescue Awards Outstanding Animal Shelter for 2020. Having been nominees the last 3 years, finalists in 2019 and the way the way this year has gone this is such a great achievement.



Judge, Tim Vasudeva said "I adopted my first ever cat from cat Haven 1994-95. At that stage, they were dealing with a lot of cats, but the facilities were relatively basic. Seeing the advances that Cat Haven has made in the last couple of decades, and particularly in recent years, the judges were extremely impressed with Cat Haven's approach to animal management from a medical and best-practice sheltering perspective. They deal with a significant number of cats as an open-intake shelter and have managed to get to a very low euthanasia rate and very high adoption rate by being really focused on length of stay and best-practice disease management, which is always difficult when it comes to cats. The judges were really happy with the advances that they have made, and very happy with the standard they are setting and the example they are providing for open intake shelters around Australia."

People love the warm summer air, cats do too!
With warmer weather coming soon, people will be spending more time outdoors and cats that are allowed outdoors may start to venture out further.
Although summer is a lovely time to be out and about in the sunshine, there are also many things to watch out for in your furry feline friend.

Fleas

Fleas are tiny wingless insects that are typically a light to dark brown colour. They typically infest cats and dogs but can sometimes bite humans as well. When we think of fleas, we usually picture an animal riddled with these ectoparasites when in reality, you might not even spot fleas on your furry friend. This is because fleas don't always live on cats (and dogs). Yes, you might see them crawling around on your cat if there is a heavy infestation but fleas like to jump onto cats to have a feed, then jump off and hide in the environment- this includes carpets, in between floorboards, your pet's bed, *YOUR* bed and sand pits to name a few.

It is very easy to assume that your cat is free from fleas if you are hardly able to find any crawling around. However, you may start becoming suspicious if your cat suddenly becomes itchy or if you start finding flea dirt (flea faeces). Flea allergy dermatitis (FAD) is a common condition in cats. It causes itching and hair loss usually around the base of the tail, but can develop around the neck and the head. FAD can be managed with corticosteroids but prevention of fleas is most important. Cats are extremely fastidious groomers and as a result ingest fleas as part of the process. This is part of the reason fleas are hardly ever seen on cats. Ingestion of fleas can result in the transmission of tapeworm and you will know your cat

has tapeworm if you find small white segments that look like grains of rice in their stool. Not only can fleas cause itching and transmit tapeworm, but it can also cause anaemia as fleas are able to consume 15 times their body weight in blood!

Once you find fleas in your home, it takes a lot of time and effort to get rid of them. This is why prevention is key. Make sure that you are staying on top of your cat's parasite control especially in the summer time when fleas become most prevalent. Remember that your cat doesn't have to be an adventurer to pick up a flea. Fleas (and flea eggs) can hide in your clothing after you have been out and hitch a ride into your home. A monthly spot-on is all it takes to prevent a big problem. Some common topical medications that are available at most vet clinics and pet stores are Advocate, Revolution and Bravecto. Treat all pets in your household (cats and dogs) as fleas can spread from one pet to another. If you find fleas on your furry companion, start by making sure all pets are treated. All bedding (pet's and human's) and carpets should be washed in hot water (or steam cleaned) and left in the sun to dry to remove fleas, larvae and eggs. Finally, vacuum every nook and cranny of the house, especially if you have floor boards, because fleas love hiding in small dark places.

Cat fight abscesses

Another common summer time condition is the cat fight abscess. Cats are territorial animals and if an intruder trespasses, a fight may ensue. Cats harbour a lot of bacteria in their mouths so a bite is sure to cause a lot of damage under the surface. An abscess is a large pocket of pus that can be quite painful. Most cats that develop these nasty swellings also develop other symptoms such as lethargy, decrease or loss of appetite and fever. A common behaviour owners will notice in their pet is hiding and an intolerance to being touched.

An abscess typically forms when a cat gets bitten by another cat, usually during a fight. When this happens, the skin heals over the bite wound within one to two days, leaving the bacteria deposited by the bite underneath to fester. The bacteria left in the tissues elicit a response from the body and pus starts to build up over a few days. Because the skin has healed over, the pus has nowhere to escape and instead develops into a large, hot swelling known as an abscess. Sometimes if bites are found early, an abscess may not have had time to form yet and you might find cellulitis- a firm, hot, red swelling. If cellulitis is found, antibiotics and pain relief are sometimes enough to treat it. If left untreated, cellulitis can develop into an abscess.

Once an abscess forms, surgery is generally required to lance and drain the built up fluid. After the material has been drained, the now empty pocket is flushed out with copious amounts of sterile saline and all dead or dying tissue is removed by a curette. This reduces the chance of re-infection from any remaining tissue. A drain may be placed in a new incision to facilitate drainage of any excess material that might build up over the next 2 to 3 days. The drain is then removed and the small incision remaining is left to heal on its own over a few days. In the days following surgery, your cat should receive pain relief and antibiotics to clear up any remaining infection. Cats are masters at hiding disease so some abscesses may not be obvious until they burst which can be extremely painful. If you find that your cat has a burst abscess, bring it to your vet for a full assessment.

Abscesses and infections are not the only things that can be transmitted in a cat bite. FIV and FeLV are viruses that can be transmitted through blood and saliva. Once a cat is infected with either of these viruses, it is incurable. Therefore, it is important to vaccinate your cat if it goes outdoors or gets into fights often. If your cat is unvaccinated, it should be tested for these viruses prior to vaccination.



Snake bites

Cats are natural born hunters and some can be very inquisitive. This does not bode well when it comes to encountering snakes. The summer months welcome lots of new visitors into the garden so it's always handy to know what to do if your cat is ever confronted by a slithery assailant.

The two most common snakes found in Perth are the Dugite (brown snake) and Tiger snake, both of which are venomous. A bite from either one can be fatal unless treated quickly. Cats are often bitten around the head and/or limbs. If you suspect that your cat has been bitten, it is imperative that

you stay calm and quickly bring it to the closest vet clinic. Try to restrain your cat on your way over as movement (such as walking) can cause an increase in heart rate which would accelerate the spread of venom through the system. Do not attempt to catch or kill the snake- you run the risk of getting bitten yourself and snakes are a protected species in Australia.



Symptoms of a snake bite include vomiting, drooling, weakness, panting, shaking, blood in the urine, pupil dilation and sensitivity to light. Some cats may also develop paralysis. Bite wounds are not always obvious, so don't assume your cat has not been attacked if you do not find a wound. When you arrive at the vet, a full assessment will be done. They will recommend several tests based on the history, clinical signs and physical exam to determine the severity of the envenomation and form a treatment plan. Complete blood counts, biochemistry profiles, blood smears and clotting times are some of the common tests performed when a snake bite is suspected.

Treatment of envenomation in cats depends on the severity of the attack. Antivenom (may) be administered to counter the snake's venom, but supportive care and time are necessary for a full recovery. Antivenom is a medication that counters the effects of snake venom. It is not a vaccination and does NOT protect your cat from future snake bites. If your cat gets bitten by another snake, it will likely need antivenom again as part of its treatment.

There are many things that you can do around your garden to reduce the chance of your cat coming into contact with a snake. Keeping the grass short and removing any loose shrubbery will help to prevent snakes from hiding in your garden and will also help you to spot them so that you can move away in a timely manner. Be sure to remove any food (e.g. birdseed) as this will attract rats- snakes love to feast on rats!





Cat Haven's CEO on how many cats she actually has at home...

Having worked at Cat Haven for 14 years, I often get asked how many cats do I have?

I suppose it is expected that working with these wonderful creatures every day, the temptation to adopt "just one more" gets the better of you from time to time. When in answer one cat - I get a bit of a bemused look and the comment "oh really – just one?" Why do I have just one cat-almost seems improper to admit to it. The reason is our one cat, Shipton, has reached the grand old age of 23 years and seems to still be going strong. We had planned to adopt an old cat when we arrived at Cat Haven back in 1997. We wanted a companion for our 5 month old Border collie puppy Shan. Somehow we left with two kittens, Shipton and his sister Tillman (Tilly)! Never quite figured that one out- but it was a decision we never regretted in taking two kittens.

The 3 of them provided us with so much joy over the years,

but Shipton was always at the top of the pack, and could floor a 35 kg dog with just one look! We were all a little apprehensive of Shipton and his fearless attitude. Over the years we lost Shan and then Tilly at 20. Shipton was on his own. He has relished being the only one. He is deaf (can't hear his own yowling!), a bit arthritic so has a number of steps located around the house to get on various sofas and beds, and is in stage 2 kidney failure, which we control via diet and the wonderful vets at Cat Haven. Apart from that, he is happy, loves to sit in the sun, tells you when it is time for bed each night, and loves a pat. We cannot disrupt the life of such an old soul in his twilight years by bringing another cat into the house. So yes, I only have one cat, and truly hope it remains this way for as long as possible, but treasure each day we have him.



Cat Haven Veterinary Clinic undergoes major renovations

During winter, our quieter season here at Cat Haven, our veterinary clinic underwent some major renovations. Our clinic was looking very old and needed updating as well as a few modifications to ensure we were compliant with our regulations, so we could continue performing much needed veterinarian work on the cats that come in to our care and we adopt out.

Demolition works started towards the end of July, which saw the old cages inside the clinic and the orange wall outside the entrance to the clinic removed.

Then whilst the builders worked on building our new extension, which was to become our new waiting room, it was time to make good the surfaces within the clinic - this was no easy task and it took 4 large pots of filler and a snow machine of sanding to get the walls right!

Once everything was ready and prepped the vinyl layer prepped the floor and lay the flooring, all vinyl had been kindly stored and donated by Armstrong Flooring.

Next it was time to undercoat the walls, which this along with the new flooring brought the clinic alive that everyone was very excited and couldn't wait to see the finished result.


