Welcome to 2022 and the first Cat Chat of the year which as usual, has some really good stories of the work which has happened here since our September 2021 edition.


Thank you to everyone who came along to our 60th Birthday morning tea and made it special. We had a number of speakers including members of parliament and our Patron, former Attornev General Michael Mischin, all sav a few words and there was a unanimous theme through all their speeches- that Cat Haven had served the community tirelessly for the last 60 years. We reflected on the huge advances made during the last 60 years in cat welfare in WA and envisaged what cat welfare would have been like without Cat Haven over this time. We are proud of our achievements but realise our work isn't over until every cat is a wanted cat.

It was wonderful to see so many old, familiar faces who have been supporters of us for so long, as well as many of our volunteers - the morning tea was rounded off by kitten cuddles.

We enter our third year of Covid and like the majority of businesses we too have been affected. Our biggest concern is having a situation where all staff have to isolate at oncethe shelter couldn't operate. We have split our staff into two teams who never cross over, and have put some additional measures into place to minimize foot traffic through the site. The vast majority of our customers have been more than happy to comply and we thank you for that.

## **Message from The Chair - Rob Orton**

Firstly, thank you for your ongoing support of Cat Haven - whether through your adoptions, fostering, volunteering efforts on grounds/events, or as an avid cat lover.

Whilst this is a new year, it would be remiss to not reflect on 2021 and the achievements of Cat Haven against a backdrop of challenges and uncertainties.

Kitten season seemed unending with persistently high intakes even during traditionally quiet times. Throw in an occasional lockdown and ever-changing restrictions, it made for anything but a normal year however, as Cat Haven has continually demonstrated, resilience and adaptability saw us through and showed we could rise to any challenge.

It is sometimes easy to forget the good news and success stories. We celebrated our 60th birthday - a legacy and a mission in 1961 which remains the same today in that Every Cat Matters and we continue to rescue cats from the perils of the streets. We developed our 2022-2024 Strategic Summary which if you have not read, I would encourage. We were also recipients of a major State Government grant that will see us shortly commence construction of a new dental room and reconfiguration of the reception/shop area to create a private bereavement space for members of the public. We can also be extremely proud of our nation-leading zero euthanasia rate for rehomeable cats.

As a Board we have focused our attention on developing plans to ensure Cat Haven can be supported to remain nimble and flexible. This has included the investment in our IT infrastructure to improve reliability and harmonise systems to increase productivity. I am also pleased to announce that separate to the new dental and bereavement space, we will be purchasing a demountable multi-purpose building which will be installed outside the cottage.



This will provide additional staff amenity space along with a dedicated meeting area. The Board will also be creating a new working group to look at the wider redevelopment of the site and how that will look over the years to come.

Financially, Cat Haven is well positioned although we do continue to rely on bequests as a considerable revenue stream. Whilst we continue to lobby the State Government for greater funding given the pivotal role we play in the community (~2% of our annual revenue is from Government grants), we have recently moved to diversify our income stream by moving some funds into a managed investment fund. This is a prudent move considering the very low deposit interest rate returns and we have selected a conservative and responsible fund manager who has vast experience with the not-for-profit sector.

I appreciate there may be some uncertainty and angst around COVID-19 and what that will mean for our operations. A great deal of planning has gone into the preparations and there has been a tremendous response from our staff and volunteers as well as the public who are adjusting to our new control measures.



I am encouraged through discussions in my personal life that Cat Haven is instantly recognised and synonymous with cat welfare, however many do not realise the extent of the services we provide to the community nor our non-for-profit status. Over the course of this year we will be making some adjustments to better support Roz and her exceptional advocacy work as well as getting the Cat Haven brand and message out into the community further.

Thank you once again for your support and I wish everyone a safe and prosperous start to 2022.

## **Could Something Lurking in Your** Kitchen be **Dangerous?**

With the Easter holidays fast approaching, the shops and cupboards are starting to fill with Easter eggs, hot cross buns and other delicious treats! Although super tasty, these yummy foods pose some very serious threats to the health of our pet cats. Detailed below are some of the most dangerous foods that can be found in most kitchens to remind us all to be vigilant as to what we are leaving around our feline companions over the holidays.

#### **Chocolate**

Chocolate contains the ingredients caffeine and theobromine which are both highly toxic to cats. Even small quantities of these ingredients can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, rapid heart rate, tremors and seizures. The higher the cocoa percentage in the chocolate, the higher the contents of both of these toxic substances. Even chocolate chips in cakes, biscuits or other foods containing chocolate can cause a potential risk.

#### **Grapes and raisins**

Ingestion of grapes and raisins can lead to acute kidney failure and even lifelong kidney problems. Despite advances in veterinary medicine, there is still very little known as to why grapes and raisins can cause such devastating side effects. Unlike some other foods, there is no known toxic dose quantity and even one single grape can cause injury to a cats kidneys.

#### Onions, garlic, leek & scallions

Despite being packed full of flavour, onions (and other vegetables in the same family) are also packed full of disulphides and thiosulphates which are extremely dangerous to cats. These substances lead to the destruction of red blood cells (known as Heinz Body Anaemia) and cause weakness, increased heart rate, difficulties breathing, thirst, pale gums, collapse and even death if left untreated.

#### Raw dough

As yeast ferments from the dough rising, gas is naturally expelled which causes severe pain and distension in the stomach. The bloating can even cause the stomach to twist on itself which requires emergency, lifesaving surgery. During fermentation, alcohol is also produced as a by-product which causes more problems of its own (see below).

#### **Alcohol**

Alcohol of any kind can cause gastrointestinal upsets such as vomiting and diarrhoea as well as neurological symptoms including respiratory depression, incoordination and coma. Whether spirits, beer or wine, all forms of alcohol are dangerous to cats.

#### **Xylitol (artificial sweetener)**

Xylitol is one of the most common artificial sweeteners used in most gums, breath fresheners, lollies and even some coffee and tea sweeteners. Xylitol causes a sudden release of insulin, dropping the cat's blood sugar levels to a dangerous low and results in weakness, incoordination, collapse, seizure and sometimes death. Despite treatment, some pets sadly end up with lifelong liver issues.







#### Milk & dairy

Cats do not have the digestive enzyme know as lactase that is responsible for breaking down and metabolising lactose, the main ingredient in milk and dairy products which leads to vomiting and diarrhoea. Whilst the side effects of ingesting these food items are less harmful the some others, it can be very uncomfortable for the cat to go through and in severe cases can cause dehydration.

#### **Coconut products**

Though small amounts of coconut based foods are unlikely to cause harm, milk and flesh of coconut contains high amounts of oil which can cause diarrhoea and dehydration. Coconut water should also be avoided as it is high in potassium and can affect the kidneys.

If you suspect your cat has ingested anything dangerous or harmful, be sure to contact your local veterinary hospital as soon as possible for further instructions.

## Catholic Homes St Vincent residents knitted cosy blankets for the scared cats and kittens.

The lovely residents at Catholic Homes St Vincent spent hours knitting blankets for the cats at Cat Haven. We use these to make the cats feel comfortable and cosy in their condos while in the shelter then send the blanket home with them once they find a new family.

Cat Haven's wonderful volunteer Mardi took her Maine Coon Lincoln and some rescue kittens along to play with the residents and talk about how much we appreciate the blankets.







Cat Haven's long-term valued volunteer and experienced foster carer Colleen, helps us in the thick of kitten season hand-rearing orphaned kittens from as young as a day old. The beautiful babies pictured were one of these litters, when stray kittens are hand reared like this, they are often very cuddly, sociable kittens and are very affectionate when meeting new people.

Colleen took the cute Finn pictured here to St Georges Aged Care Centre in Bayswater to meet the residents and brighten their days with some kitten cuddles. Who wouldn't love this?!



## A few words spoken by Michael Mischin at our Birthday...


Special Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen, thank you for finding the time to join with us this morning to celebrate the Society and Haven's 60th anniversary.

Of course, none of this would have been possible were it not for the compassion, energy and efforts of Hilda Cockram and the other 11 founders of the Cat Welfare Society.

The first I had heard of Hilda was in an article in the March 2016 edition of our Society's newsletter 'CatChat', which reproduced a 1961 newspaper story by the well-known columnist Athol Thomas in the Daily News headlined 'The Alley Cat and the Good Samaritan'.

It told of the numerous stray and abandoned cats and kittens around the Northbridge area at the time, and how for some 12 years Hilda – an old age pensioner – had been helping them. She would travel by taxi every second night, throughout the year, carrying bags of mincemeat weighing 40lb – 18kg – to feed the strays in lane ways from the early hours of the morning to dawn, an exercise that would cost about £20 per week – about \$550 now.



The accounts of people poisoning the food and water she would painstakingly and lovingly put out; kicking over tins of food and water; and even the padlocking of taps so she could not draw the small amounts of water from them – are the least of the cruelties recounted in the article.

I won't repeat them – those who are interested can read the article or my speech of 29 June 2016 – except to mention the brute who used a kitten as a football.





In the article, she asks the reporter, with tears in her eyes, "Why do they do it?"

Apart from sadistic desire to harm those animals over whom they had power, they did it to bully her – to destroy her spirit by harming those towards which she showed love and compassion.

They were not Perth's proudest days. But she was not deterred.

She also asked in the article "Where will it all end? I'm getting old and can't carry on much longer."

But she knew others were also doing their bit, and had already gathered interest from likeminded Samaritans.

And on 29 June 1961 there took place a meeting of a dozen cat-lovers at the Boans Reception Hall in Perth – the first meeting of "a society for the protection of our cats, the solving of the problems of strays and dumped kittens" – what would become the Cat Welfare Society.

Hilda died in 1992. Hilda will have seen the Society grown and mature. But Hilda hasn't seen the fall in euthanasia rates from the 70% of a decade ago, to zero in the case of well cats capable of being re-homed. She hasn't seen the passage of the Cat Act 2011 – something she saw the need for all those years ago, and which I am proud the Barnett Government of which I was part achieved.

I feel that if Hilda were here today, she might still have tears in her eyes – but tears of pride in the work of the Society; of relief that the Perth that she knew then has become more enlightened towards our companion animals; and of gratitude for the work of those who have carried on her legacy.

For whether or not they know it, the staff and volunteers of the Society channel her compassion, her dedication, and her love – and all reflect our humanity, and the better angels of our nature.

I began with an anecdote and so shall end with one.

It was once the tradition, that had been going on for some 25 years by the time it was first reported, at the Government House near Poona in India – a sort of unofficial oral addition to the standing orders – to the effect that any cat passing out of the front door was to be regarded as His Excellency the Governor, and to be saluted accordingly.

The reason was that Sir Robert Grant, Governor of Bombay, died there in 1838 and about the time of his death a cat was seen to leave the house by the front door and walk up and down a particular path, as it had been the Governor's habit to do after sunset.

A Hindu sentry had observed this and mentioned it to others of his faith and, after consultation with priests about the transmigration of souls, it was decided that the spirit of the deceased Governor had entered into one of the house pets. As it was difficult to fix on a particular cat, it was decided that every cat passing out from the main entrance after dark was to be treated with due respect and proper vice-regal honours.

I am not suggesting that we go that far here at the Haven.

But I rather fancy the idea that every cat and kitten that leaves this place, in the company of some member of a family that is to give it its 'forever home', embodies the spirit and carries within it a part of the soul of every volunteer and member of staff and supporter of the Cat Haven – now and since that fateful Thursday, on 29 June 1961, when Hilda Cockram, her two daughters Wendy and Betsy, and nine others held the first meeting of the Cat Welfare Society at the Boans Reception Hall.

I thank you again for joining with us to celebrate this birthday and for your support so that, unlike the Cat in the Wet Wild Woods, our stray and homeless cats won't always have to walk alone.

## **Emergency Boarding**

Picture this, you've found yourself in a hard position getting evicted from your home, with nowhere to go and the pressure of finding a new home, the last thing you can think of is having to surrender you best friend. This is why Cat Haven created our Emergency Boarding program to provide support and look after cats until their owners is back on their feet.

With homelessness being the largest reason Cat Haven finds cats coming into its care they change to we are also supporting any emergency situation, domestic violence, hospital stays and mental health treatments to name a few. For these pet owners the bond and companionship they share with their cat is a lifetime.

Cat Haven provides three weeks fee free to anyone in an emergency situation where they cannot care for their cat. Following this we charge the significantly reduced rate of \$10 per day and provide payment plans to support pet owners in need. We currently have over 28 cats under this program with some of the cats being in care for over 9 months. With no help from the government to cover the cost of this program, Cat Haven relies on the support of donors and foster carers to keep this program running.

#### How can you help?

#### 1) Become a foster carer:

We currently need foster carers to look after the Emergency Boarding cats, the shelter runs are only temporary home for a month or two and if the cats need to be looked after for an extended time foster care is the only option. Our foster team provides all the bedding, food, veterinary care, enrichment tools, bowls and bedding needed.

#### 2) Donate:

If you can't foster, please consider donating to Emergency Boarding through our website. The only way Cat Haven can keep this program running is with your support. With the cost to look after 1 cat per day being approximately \$25 per day, with some cats needing additional vet treatments and medication or special diets this cost adds up very quickly.

One day, she happened to mention her back ground of 40 years in IT, and from there Brenda took on a new role in volunteering.

She has spent hundreds of hours with IT matters on-site taking us through the process of finding a new IT contractor who could meet our ever increasing needs, got us a new phone system installed, built us a new website, created an online shop, organised security cameras and completed grant submissions.

She is now on her second term on the Board of Management, chairing Sub-Committees to name but a few of her achievements and yet she still manages to find time to foster cats!
