

Message from our CEO Roz Robinson

Hi Everyone

We are well into winter now with heavy rains and cold nights - it's ideal weather to snuggle up with a cat or two in front of a warm fire!

We are hoping the cooler weather will see a reduction to the constant high numbers of cats we have had on site for so long now.

In our last edition of Cat Chat, I mentioned we were starting our renovations on the upgrade to our reception and the establishment of bereavement rooms, no upgrades have taken place since the building was constructed in the early 1980s. It was small and not fit for purpose for the number of adoptions we are now doing, nor a secluded place for owners to surrender their cats in private.

I am delighted to say, with assistance from a State Government Election promise grant, it is completed thanks to our builder Peter Colli, who delivered a great job, and on time. I would also like to thank all of you for your continued support throughout this time continuing to shop and adopt from us.

A big thanks also goes out to our staff and volunteers who have had to endure less than comfortable work facilities for the last three months. Please come down and shop at our new upgraded retail one stop cat shop at the same time help us fund the essential community work we do.

During May, we had a visit from the (then) Premier Mark McGowan, Minister for Local Government John Carey, Local Member Dr Katrina Stratton, and Maylands Member Lisa Baker to announce a doubling of our annual funding from \$75,000 pa to \$150,000pa for the next 4 years. Our initial grant had remained static at \$75,000 since its inception 11 years ago and we are truly grateful to the State Government for recognising the need for an increase was overdue. We still need to raise around 95% of our operating costs, so we still need your support as much as ever.

There has been a positive announcement in regard to a change to the Residential Tenancies Act which will come into effect from 2024 which prevents landlords denying a rental simply because of pet ownership. Daily we are still seeing cats being brought in for surrender because of lack of rentals which will allow them their cats. We do hope this change will see less people suffering the loss of a much loved family member and having to surrender to us.

As always, we are so grateful for your loyal support and ongoing passion for cat welfare in WA.

Message from The Chair - Rob Orton

Where has the year gone? As we enter the second half of the year, I want to take a moment to express my gratitude for your unwavering support and commitment to the cats of Western Australia. Your dedication allows us to continue making a significant difference in the lives of countless cats in need.

The passing of April saw the end of our financial year with a modest operating profit being realised. Underpinning this result was another strong year of bequests (~20% of revenue) but this also highlights their unpredictable nature and that we must diversify our revenue streams. With the opening of the new and expanded retail space, we look forward to welcoming you into Cat Haven as your one-stop-shop for all your cat supplies, gifts, and other goodies. By shopping local with us you will not just help the cats directly but will be getting the best products and advice.

We continue to see a steadily increasing number of owner surrenders with by far the most common reason being due to new rentals precluding pet ownership. This is a heartbreaking decision for people to be faced with – a home or keeping their beloved cat(s). Whilst we welcome the State Government's proposed changes to the Rental Tenancy Act, we expect to see elevated owner surrenders especially with the parallel cost of living crisis.

Did you know the most common colour of cat coming into Cat Haven is tabby? Or that over three quarters of incoming cats are not desexed? Or that some of our foster parents have cared for over 30 cats in the last 12 months.

With the assistance of an experienced data analytics volunteer, we have been able to crunch the numbers for the first time to get invaluable insights including geographic origins. This will allow us to actively investigate problem areas, supported by real data, including advocacy directly with those local governments who do not use us as their Cat Management Facility. This data will also support our submission to the State Government next year as part of the statutory Cat Act review.

Volunteers are the backbone of Cat Haven and we could not operate as we do without you. There are so many ways you can assist us whether on-site, from home or on the road. Head over to our website for more details on roles. We will be launching a volunteers survey shortly. This vital feedback will ensure we can continue to recognise, value, and be the best place to give back to the community.

Our Annual General Meeting will be held on 10th September this year and applications are open for Board nomination. Further details on the AGM and nominations are available on our website under About Cat Haven.

In the second half of this year, we have planned several exciting initiatives, including fundraising events, volunteer training programs, and enhanced advocacy campaigns. We encourage you to stay connected and engaged, as your involvement plays a pivotal role in shaping a brighter future for cat welfare in Western Australia.











The risks of house plants to cats

There are several common houseplants that can be toxic to cats if ingested. Here are some examples:

Dieffenbachia (Dumb Cane)

This plant contains calcium oxalate crystals, which can cause oral irritation, intense burning, and swelling of the mouth, tongue, and throat.

Sago Palm

All parts of this plant are toxic, but the seeds contain the highest concentration of toxins. Ingesting sago palm can cause liver failure and potentially be fatal for cats.

Lilies

Several varieties of lilies, including Easter lily, Tiger lily, and Daylily, are highly toxic to cats. Ingesting any part of the plant, including leaves, flowers, or even the pollen, can cause severe kidney damage and are HIGHLY dangerous

Aloe Vera

While aloe vera is typically used for its soothing properties, the gel inside the leaves can be toxic to cats, causing vomiting, diarrhoea, and changes in urine colour.

Philodendron

These popular houseplants contain insoluble calcium oxalate crystals, which can cause oral irritation, swelling, and discomfort in cats.

Pothos (Devil's Ivy)

Pothos contains insoluble calcium oxalate crystals like philodendron and can cause similar symptoms if ingested by cats.

English Ivy

Ingesting English ivy can lead to vomiting, abdominal pain, hypersalivation, and diarrhea

Peace Lily

Peace lilies contain calcium oxalate crystals, which can cause oral irritation, drooling, and difficulty swallowing in cats.

Osteourthritis in cats

Osteoarthritis is one of the most common vet underdiagnosed conditions affecting our cats. This is largely due to cats expertly hiding signs of injury or illness and so realising they are suffering from joint pain can be difficult for owners to appreciate. However, it is crucial owners and vets work together to identify and treat osteoarthritis (OA) as it greatly reduces the quality of life of our cats.

Millie is a 12 year old domestic shorthair cat who presented for her annual vaccination and her owner mentioned that in recent years she has become 'grumpy' and doesn't like to play as much anymore. She also meows irritably when she is picked up. On physical exam Millie showed reluctance and discomfort when her hindlegs were extended but did not show any other obvious signs of lameness. Millie was suffering from osteoarthritis however her signs were all very subtle and many owners attribute such behaviours to simply 'growing old'.

She was prescribed Solensia (frunevetmab). Specifically designed for cats, Solensia is a monoclonal antibody medication that targets 'Nerve Growth Factor' (NGF) which is a key contributor to OA pain in cats. Given as a monthly injection under the skin, it functions like normally occurring antibodies in the body meaning it has minimal side effects on body systems such as kidneys, liver and the gastrointestinal tract so cats with concurrent illnesses can still benefit from this revolutionary OA treatment.

At Millie's revisit a month later her owners happily reported that she seemed back to herself for the first time in a long time. She was running and playing around the house and spending more time with her owners rather than seeming grumpy and wanting to sleep alone all day. The alleviation of her chronic OA pain had led to her being a much happier cat.

This scenario is very common and by learning about the subtle signs to watch out for we can help to ensure our cats don't suffer from unrecognised and untreated OA pain.



Signs your cat may be suffering from OA include:

- Changes in activity: reluctance or hesitation to jump or use stairs, increased time sleeping/resting, less interest in playing
- Temperament changes: reduced interaction with people or other animals, irritable or grumpy often when being picked up
- Grooming: overgrooming painful areas, difficulty grooming some areas causing matted or scruffy coats

Whilst multiple medications and supplements exist to help reduce joint pain, Solensia is the first targeted medication toward NGF which explains the great response many cats have to it. Whilst many of our senior cats are being managed solely on Solensia, we can still utilise other medications concurrently for more severe cases. Whatever the scenario, our cats are fortunate to have many options available so that no cat suffers through unmanaged OA pain.





Understanding Cat Behaviours
From Fear to Bliss

Cats exhibit a variety of behaviours that reflect their emotions. Here are some key cat behaviours and the corresponding emotions they convey:

Startled Scamper:

- Sudden noise or movement triggers fear.
- · Wide eyes, perked ears, and puffed-up tail.
- Create a safe environment to help them regain confidence.

Curious Observer:

- Dilated pupils and forward ears indicate curiosity.
- Relaxed body language and swaying tail.
- Encourage exploration with stimulating toys and interactive play.

Contented Purr:

- Purring signifies relaxation and happiness.
- Relaxed body, half-closed eyes, and vibrating body.
- Strengthen your bond by giving gentle strokes and attention.

Playful Pounce:

- Energetic behaviour with crouching and wiggling.
- Indicates playfulness and mental stimulation.
- Engage in interactive play sessions for entertainment and exercise.

Cuddly Companion:

- Seeking close physical contact expresses affection and trust.
- Rubbing against legs, kneading paws, or curling up next to you.
- Reciprocate their affection with gentle petting and quality time.

Understanding these cat behaviours allows you to interpret their emotions accurately. By providing a secure and enriching environment, along with love and attention, you can ensure your cat's well-being and contentment.

Cat Haven's Animal Support Program

Gilli came to Cat Haven back in 2019 after being seized from her previous home. She wasn't in the best of shape having a very matted coat, eye infection, bad teeth and obvious signs of arthritis. She was also suffering from early renal disease and hypertension. All in all Gilli had a lot going on.

She was put onto medications and a specialised diet to help manage her conditions, however at 15 years old and with numerous health conditions we thought Gilli would have a hard time finding someone to take all of that on.

Under the Animal Support Program, from a generous donor designed to help older cats get adopted, Gilli was put forward as a Palliative Adoption. This meant that as long as she was pain free and enjoying life, our program would continue to support her, covering the costs of her vet visits and medications.

It didn't take long for that special someone to fall in love with her! Dani adopted Gilli within a month of her arriving at Cat Haven.

"When I adopted her years ago I knew it would have been not for long because of her conditions, but surprisingly, and after a bit of roller coaster during the hot weather, she is still with us and ready to become a Highlander!"

Gilli has surprised us all with her continued love for life! And she definitely got a second chance at it with Dani. 4 years later and numerous check ups, she is still enjoying being a senior citizen. This is why the Animal Support Program is so important, to enable cats like Gilli the opportunity to not be overlooked. Owing a cat with health issues can be expensive but we believe it is worth every penny.

This program has now helped over 400 cats by sponsoring their needs in old age with conditions like hyperthyroidism, chronic renal failure, arthritis and skin allergies.

We thank our amazing benefactor for this ongoing generous contribution to this program.

Sadly Gilli's brother, Colonel Cuddles passed away recently which has been a big loss for the family.






We are so grateful to Dani for giving Gilli the life that she deserves. We couldn't have wished for a more loving home for her and Gilli obviously agrees!

Sunshine 317 days in care!







Cat Haven's Emergency Boarding Program is a lifeline for individuals facing challenging circumstances such as domestic violence, homelessness, hospital stays, or personal crisis. Recognising the deep bond between humans and their feline companions, Cat Haven goes above and beyond to provide a safe and nurturing environment for these cats during their owners' difficult times. With the program, individuals can rest assured knowing that their beloved cats will be well taken care of.

The Emergency Boarding Program at Cat Haven offers a unique support system by providing three weeks of fee-free temporary housing for cats in need. This initial period allows owners to focus on resolving their immediate situations without the added worry of their pet's well-being. Following the initial three weeks, a small fee is charged to cover the continued care of the cats.






In addition to the enhanced facilities, the shelter has also expanded its retail space, which is expected to generate more funds for the cats in care. Responsible Ownership and Cat containment

Did you know, cats that are allowed to roam outside only have a life expectancy of 3-5 years?

Cat Haven advocates for and supports responsible cat ownership in the form of:

- Desexing of all cats by no later than the age of 4 months to prevent the oversupply of cats
- Cats kept indoors for the duration of their lives
- Escape proof cat enclosures being constructed adjacent to the family home
- Free standing cat enclosures placed outside, preferably on grass and taking into consideration weather conditions
- Escape proof fencing improvements (such as Oscillat) which prevents cats from escaping their own backyards

If any of these methods are used, physical and psychological enrichment must be proved to ensure best welfare practices.

Roaming usually occurs when cats are undesexed and are seeking mates. The risks to cats which wander include, but are not limited to:

- Serious injury or death from motor vehicle accidents. In the event of serious injury, this may lead to owners electing to euthanize their cat due to financial constraints
- Cat fights which can lead to costly abscess treatment by a vet, FIV and FeLK. As above, this may lead to euthanasia or surrender to a shelter
- Skin cancer on ears and nose of cats with white faces. White cats themselves are 5 times more prone to skin cancer than the general cat population.
- Trapping/baiting of cats by disgruntled neighbours or cat haters
- Poisoning from plants toxic to cats found in gardens
- Cats trapped in lethal traps
- Mishaps such as getting into roof cavities of buildings or between houses and fences – where rescue is very difficult or near impossible

Solutions for Cat Allergies at Home

Love cats but suffer from allergies? Don't worry! We often find that pet allergies reactions reduce over time and with frequent exposure to the cat in mild to moderate allergies.

Cat Allergies are primarily triggered by a cat's saliva, skin, and urine. When cats groom themselves, this protein becomes airborne and can cause allergic reactions in sensitive individuals. Symptoms may include sneezing, itchy or watery eyes, nasal congestion, coughing, and skin rashes.

Things to consider when adopting:

- Female cats are usually more hypoallergenic than males
- Light coloured male cats create less allergens than dark coloured cats
- Long haired cats can be more hypoallergenic as their fur 'holds' the allergens close to their skin
- Washing cats doesn't help, but cleaning your house does

The joy that having a pet is very worth the time and effort in researching and finding ways to have a cat in your home.

My all-time favorite movie is:


My favourite movie is From Up On Poppy Hill.
