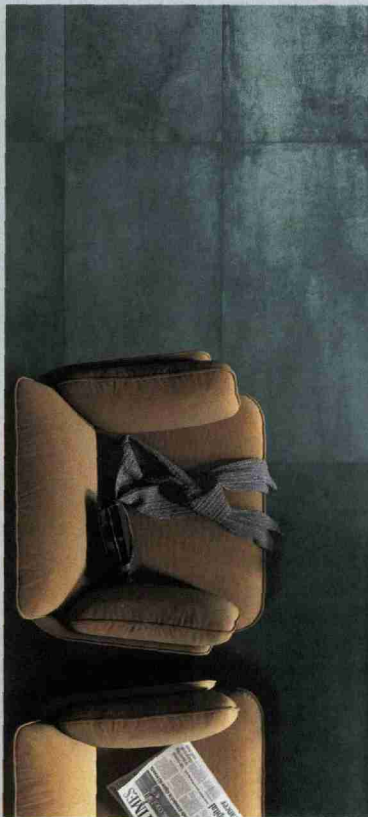
**Atlas Concorde: Blaze Floor Tiles**

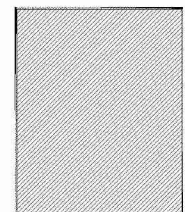


**Caesar: Anima Ever Porcelain Stoneware**

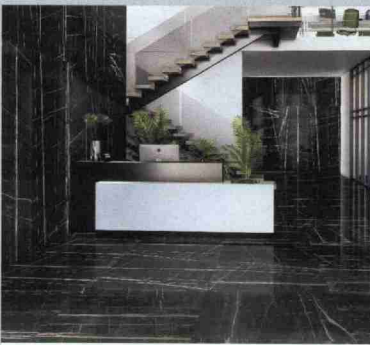
**Emilceramica: Dimora Porcelain Tile**

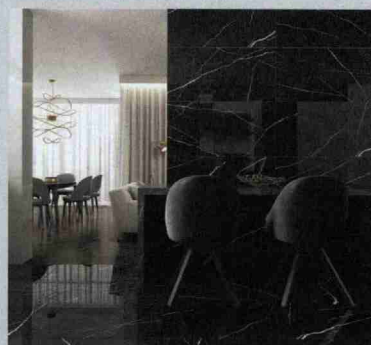
**Azulev: Tanzania Tiles**

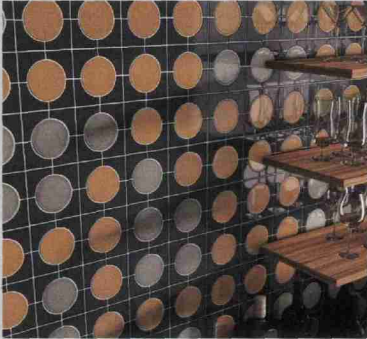


**Marazzi: Arzen Tiles**
