



## napkin rings and candle ring

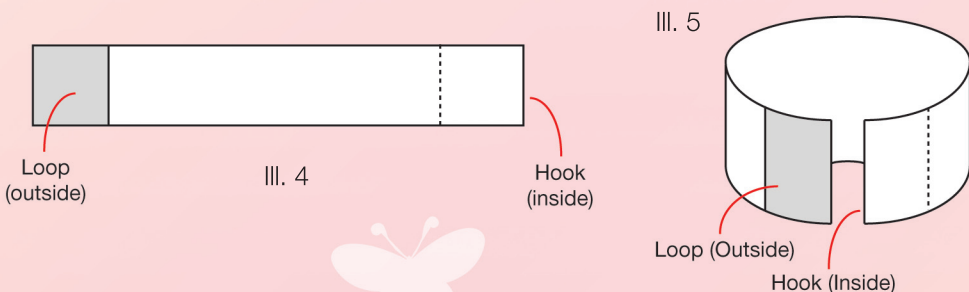


### SUPPLIES REQUIRED

1/4 yd. Fabric  
4-5 assorted prints for Butterflies (Scraps work well here.)  
Create-a-Strap 1" wide Art No. 9502  
1 1/4 yd. of 5/8" wide ribbon  
Butterfly Shape Yoyo Maker Large Art No. 8711/ Small Art No.8710  
1" wide x approx. 5" long hook & loop Sew-On

### DIRECTIONS

- Step 1: Cut 1 strip 2" wide selvage to selvage for napkin & candle rings
  - Step 2: Press fusible 1" Create-a-Strap to the wrong side of fabric strip.
  - Step 3: Fold in sides and press.
  - Step 4: Cover raw edges down the center with ribbon; edge stitch into place.
  - Step 5: Cut the strip into 8" segments for the napkin rings. The leftover piece should measure approx 11 1/2", this will be used for the candle.
  - Step 6: Fold raw ends 1/4" twice on all strips and stitch fold.
  - Step 7: Cut hook & loop into 1" squares and sew to the end of the strips. (Ill. 4 and 5)
- Note: Make sure that when the ring is in a circle that the hook & loop oppose each other.



### EMBELLISHMENT

Make butterflies: 4 large for the Napkin Rings, 2 large and 2 small for the Candle Ring.

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# Spring has Sprung

Create a little quilt as a buffet table centerpiece or wall hanging, make napkin rings and decorate a candle to coordinate your Springtime Theme.

## little quilt

Finished Size: 11 3/4" x 14 3/4"

### SUPPLIES REQUIRED

Butterfly Shape YoYo Maker Small Art No. 8710	Embroidery Needle Art No.235
Butterfly Shape YoYo Maker Large Art No. 8711	Water Soluble Blue Marker (Fine Tip) Art No. 515
1/4 yd (fat qtrs. OK) each of 6 Assorted Prints	Rotary Cutter Art No. 7500
1 fat qtr. Background Fabric	Rotary Mat Art No. 7521
1 rectangle 13" x 16" for Backing	Quilting Thread
1 rectangle 13" x 16" for Batting	Sewing Machine, sewing thread
4-5 assorted colors Embroidery Floss to match fabric colors	Scissors

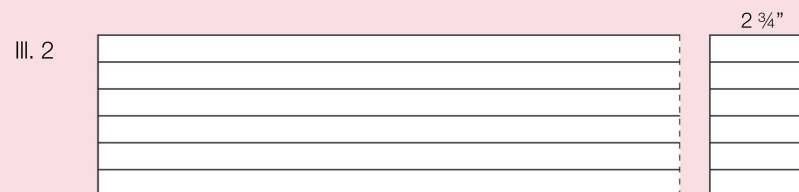
### DIRECTIONS

#### Center

Step 1: Cut the background rectangle 7 1/2" x 10 1/2".  
 Step 2: Trace lettering and underline on to the background rectangle using the water soluble marker. Remember to leave at least 1/4" around the outside of the rectangle for seam allowance. (Ill. 1)  
 Step 3: Use the backstitch and 4 strands each of the assorted floss to embroider the saying.

#### Pieced Border

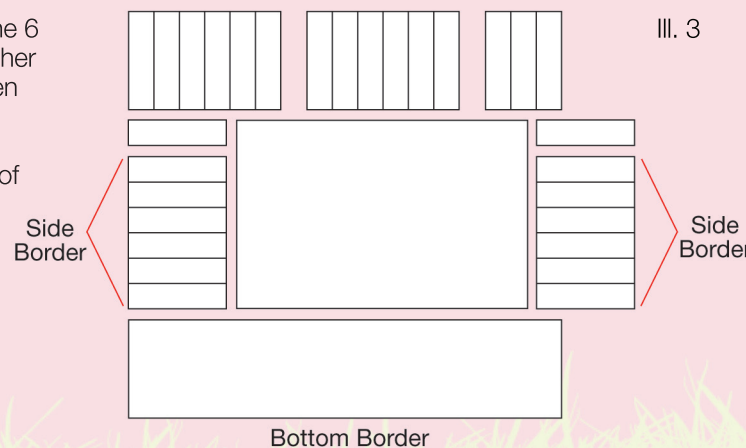
Step 1: Cut 1 1/2" wide strips x 22" (fat qtr.) or selvage to selvage (approx. 40") from each of the 6 assorted prints.  
 Step 2: Sew the strips together along the long edges and press seams in one direction.  
 Step 3: Cut pieced strips into 2 3/4" segments. (Ill. 2)



Step 4: Add one 1 1/2" x 2 3/4" strip to each of the side borders; then sew on to each side of center.

Step 5: Sew 2 1/2 of the 6 piece segments together for the top border; then sew on to top edge.

Step 6: Cut one strip of fabric 2 3/4" x 14 3/4" for the bottom border and sew in place. (Ill. 3)



#### Quilting

Step 1: Use the water soluble maker and draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across the front of the center rectangle; then following the angle mark off the quilting lines in 2" intervals. Repeat going the opposite direction to create a cross hatch.  
 Step 2: Layer the quilt with the back-batting-top and pin into place. Hand or machine quilt on the lines.  
 Step 3: Rinse out the blue lines using a damp wash cloth.  
 Step 4: Trim quilt to approximately 11 3/4" x 14 3/4" (sizing varies due to individual quilters).

#### Binding

Cut binding to 2 1/2"- 2 1/4" wide and make continuous length to go around the quilt with a 2" overlap. Sew into place.

#### Embellishment

Make 4 large & 1 small butterflies following package instructions and apply to quilt. (Note: We tied ribbon around the center of the butterflies and added flower stamen for antennae.)
