# Beaded Larks Head knot Friendship Bracelet

## **Materials:**

Clover Bracelet Maker: Art. No. 9943



Clover Wonder Clips: Art. No. 3185

Clover Milliners needle Art. No. 236

Cotton or Bamboo Weaving Cord


two 6 ft lengths

TOHO size 6 E-beads, 9 grams

> Embroidery floss, two 30" lengths

12" sewing thread

#### **Lets Begin:**




Thread a milliner needle with the sewing thread. Tie thread in a loop. Drape one end of the beading cord through the loop and string 35-40 beads. Set aside. Repeat for the other length of beading cord.



**Designer Tip:** Make a slip knot in one end of each beading cord. Place slip knot onto one point of a shuttle before winding cord onto shuttle.

Wind cords onto Shuttles. Hold ends in place with Wonder clips.





Follow directions in Bracelet Maker package for loading cords onto the tool. Use the two strands of embroidery floss as the core threads. Leave an 8" tail for all cords. Add beading cords to center cord with Lark's Head knots. After the cords are added, move a bead up before making each new knot.


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To form the first half of the knot, wrap thread over, under and back up through the loop made.

Tighten loop, positioning bead in place.

#### Step 3

To make the second half of the knot, wrap cord under, over and through the loop made. Tighten to complete knot.






Using the left-hand cord, repeat the same knot as for the right-hand cord. First half of knot. Tighten to hold bead in place.

#### Step 5

Second half of knot. Tighten to complete.





#### **Continue**

Repeat Step 2, and 3 on left side cord.

Move the beads up the cord as needed, clipping the cord end to the shuttle with the Wonder Clip to hold in place.

Repeat knots, alternating left and right-hand cords, moving a bead up before each full knot. Work to desired length.

#### **The End**

When bracelet is desired length, remove from Bracelet Tool. Braid ends to tie together.



# Woven Beaded

Friendship Bracelet

## **Materials:**

Clover Bracelet Maker: Art. No. 9943



Clover Wonder Clips: Art. No. 3185

Clover Milliners needle Art. No. 236

> Cotton or Bamboo Weaving Cord

TOHO size 6 E-beads, 9 grams

Size 10 Lizbeth thread, five 30" lengths

7.5 yards of size 10 Lizbeth thread

12" sewing thread

#### **Lets Begin:**


Thread a milliner needle with the sewing thread. Tie thread in a loop. Drape one end of the center warp cord through the loop and string 40-45 beads. Anchor the threads to the other end of the Bracelet Maker tool. Keep threads taut, and in the same order on the notches as on the other end of the tool.






Make a slip knot at one end of the 7.5-yard length of thread. Slip the loop onto one point of a shuttle and wind the thread onto the shuttle. Set aside.

Working with the five 30" lengths of thread, center them, with the same amount of excess at each end. Anchor 3 of them to one screw anchor, and two to the other. Separate the threads, laying one in each of five notches on the top of the tool, and clip in place with a Wonder Clip to hold while you anchor the ends. These are your warp threads.





Tie on the shuttle thread, leaving 8" of thread tail. Begin weaving over and under with the shuttle, pulling weaving thread (weft) smooth and even. Watch that the warp threads are not compressed and made to lay too closely together.





#### Step 2

Continue weaving back and forth, until you have 10 rows. Move a bead up the center warp thread, and weave below it.

#### **Continue**

Weave 5 rows between each bead, keeping threads smooth and even. Continue weaving the weft thread, moving beads up as established, until bracelet is the desired length.





Weave 10 rows below the last bead. Take bracelet off the tool. Remove any excess beads. Gently separate strands into sets of two. Braid thread tails for four inches.


#### **The End**



Knot the end of the braiding to hold in place. Trim ends. Tie ends together, or do a sliding knot join. If braided ends are too long, you can re-knot them shorter and trim.







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
