#### • 1 Shuttle and the ball of thread





# **Supplies:**

1 ball size 10 tatting thread 1 Shuttle and the ball of thread

 $\mathbf{R} = \operatorname{Ring} \mathbf{Ch} = \operatorname{Chain} \mathbf{Ds} = \operatorname{double} \operatorname{stitch} -= \operatorname{picot} += \operatorname{join} \mathbf{cl} = \operatorname{close} \operatorname{ring}$ To read a pattern, " $\mathbf{R}$  5-5-5  $\mathbf{cl}$ " means to make a ring of 5 ds, picot, 5 ds, picot, 5 ds, then close the ring.

**NOTE:** After each round, cut and tie off. Bury tails of shuttle and ball ends. You may need to block between rounds.

#### Center:

R 1-2-2-2-2-1 cl.

**NOTE:** After the center, all rings and chains are made with the same stitch counts throughout.

#### **First Round:**

R 3-3 + to any picot on center, 3-3, **cl.** \*Ch 4-2-2-4. R 3 + to side picot of ring just made, 3 + to next picot in center, 3-3, **cl.**\*
Continue around center, repeating between \* and \* around.
End with **Ch** 4-2-2-4. There are 6 rings and 6 chains.

### **Second Round:**

R 3-3 + to the 1st picot of the first chain, 3-3, cl. \*Ch 4-2-2-4. R 3-3 + to 3rd picot of same first round chain, 3-3, cl.\*

Continue around, repeating \* to \*, joining new rings to 1st and 3rd picots of chains from first round, until there are 12 rings and 12 chains. End with **Ch** 4-2-2-4.



## **Third Round:**

In manner established, make and attach rings to 1st and 3rd picot of first chain from 2nd round, chain, then attach next ring to center picot of next chain from 2nd round. Continue around until there are 18 rings and 18 chains.

# Fourth Round:

In manner established, make and attach rings to 1st and 3rd picot of first chain from 3rd round, chain, then attach next 2 rings to center picot of next 2 chains. Continue around until there are 24 rings and 24 chains.

Dampen and block doily to a pin board, using stainless steel pins. Let dry. Starch if desired.

**NOTE:** Where there are two rings attached, they should stack one over the other from the center out to the edge of the doily.
