

UNIFORM GUIDELINES

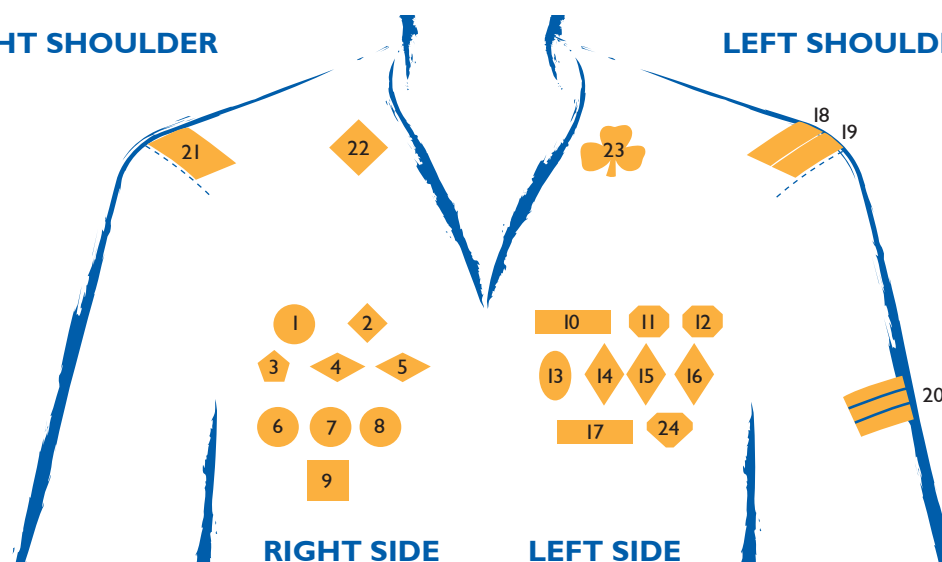
Uniform is to be worn to all Guide activities. A Guide activity is one that is held in the name of Guiding at local, Division/Region, State, Australian or international level. However members may wear casual attire (including non-uniform items with Guide logo) for some activities, such as camping, abseiling, canoeing, as the organisers deem appropriate.

A variety of uniform options is available as outlined in the uniform options table. Guides should decide the best option(s) for their Unit. Girl choice is the fundamental basis for uniform selection, provided it is appropriate for the occasion.

Right side of shirt

- 1 World badge
- 2 State badge
- 3 Queen's Guide Award
- 4 BP Award
- 5 Junior BP Award
- 6 Commonwealth Award
- 7 Irene Fairbairn Challenge
- 8 Scout Membership
- 9 Duke of Edinburgh Award
- 21 Girl Guides Australia Flash (sewn on shoulder seam)
- 22 10 Year Membership badge

Left side of shirt

- 10 Junior Leader badge
- 11 & 12 Special events badge (only worn for 12 months—can wear up to four)
- 13 Gold Endeavour
- 14 – 16 Focus badges (If more than three focus badges are earned they are worn below this row)
- 17 Action Guide badge (metal version only)
- 18 Region Name tape
- 19 Unit tape
- 20 Achieve-a-Challenge tapes (2nd and 3rd trefoils should be sewn directly next to each other with no spaces between and each tape should be sewn directly next to one below; sewn above the sleeve hem line)
- 23 Promise badge
- 24 Opal Discover a Challenge Badge (metal badge)

International badges

For members selected to represent Girl Guides Australia at international events, the Girl Guides Australia Flash (on right shoulder) may be replaced with an Australian flag cloth badge. The Australian flag cloth badge can remain in place on return to Australia. It does not need to be removed. The metal Australia badge may be worn in place of the State badge. (State badges must be removed while the Australia badge is in place.)

The Australia badge can only be worn while overseas – it must be removed on returning to Australia. The Australian “Wattle” metal badge may be worn on the right hand side and next to the Australia badge. This badge can continue to be worn on return to Australia.

Additional notes

- Badges worn on the front of the shirt are metal.
- Explore a Challenge and Create a Challenge badges are not to be worn on the shirt.
