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St John Henry Newman

Cor ad cor loquitur

Watts & Co. owes a debt of gratitude to St John Henry Newman. It was through an encounter with Newman that George Gilbert Scott Jr converted to Roman Catholicism, a pivotal moment in his life which was to impact him both personally and professionally.

In his *Apologia*, St John Henry wrote about Gilbert Scott Jr's grandfather, the Rev'd Thomas Scott (direct ancestor of our current CEO):


He was 'the writer who made a deeper impression on my mind than any other, and to whom (humanly speaking)

I almost owe my soul...'

When, in 1880, George Jr was introduced to Newman, a similar deep impression was made in reverse. George Jr went to morning Mass celebrated by the Cardinal on his behalf. It was this encounter that changed the course of his life and, as he later recalled, 'all the difficulties, uncertainties and indecision of the years was but a phantom'. Despite the social and professional drawbacks of his decision to convert to Roman Catholicism, George Jr saw this as his duty 'as clear as day'.








Altar Frontals

Clerical Wear





Custom Silver & Silver Restoration

Many of the items we make at Watts are custom, and our metalware is no exception. Recent commissions include chalices, ciboria, patens, and a processional cross. Each is handmade by our silversmith in Birmingham, England. We can work to an existing design or create something new. Engraving is also an option, whether as part of the design or as a discreet thanks to a donor.

For many churches, metalware simply needs restoration rather than replacement. Recent projects include an Edwardian processional cross which had been unused for many years, and damaged vessels.
