

Kite

MATERIALS:

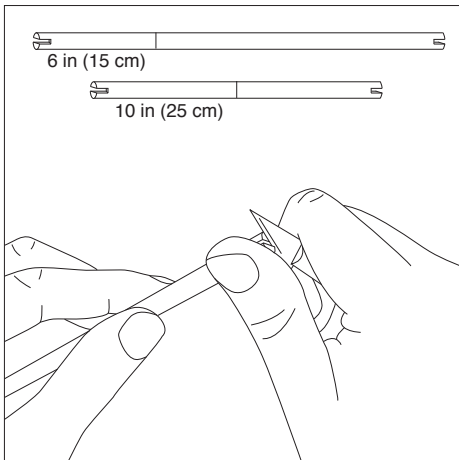
1 yard of Loop (91 cm)
 2 wooden dowels
 24 in (60 cm) and 20 in (50 cm)
 Double sided carpet tape
 String

TOOLS:

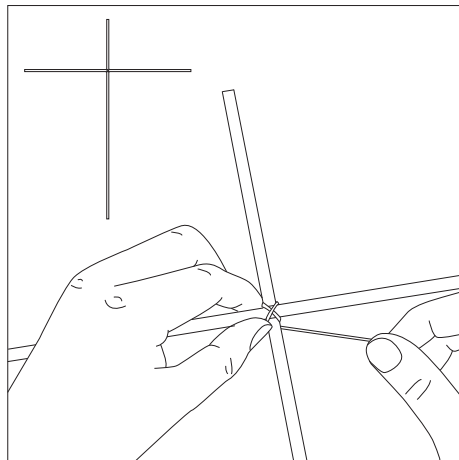
Scissors
 Utility knife
 Sewing needle

DIFFICULTY: Hard

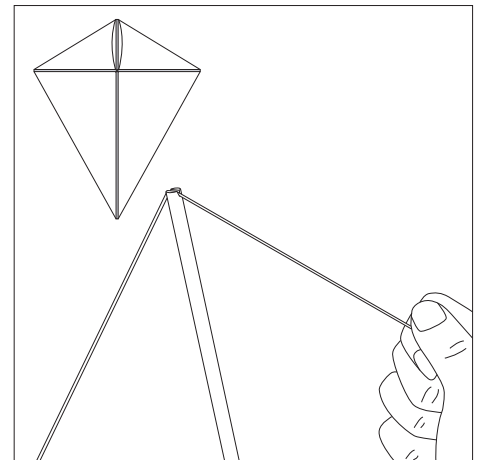
TIME: 1 - 2 hours



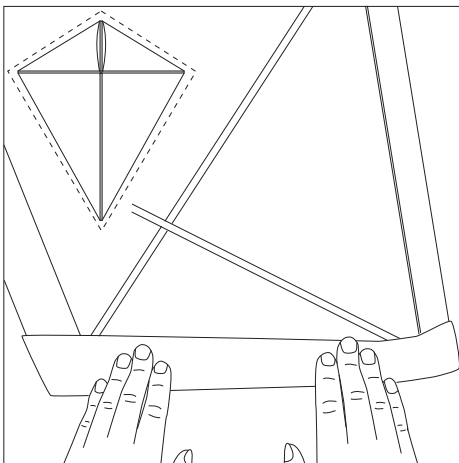
STEP 1 Mark the 24 in (60 cm) dowel 6 in (15 cm) from the end and the 20 in (50 cm) dowel 10 in (25 cm) from the end. CAREFULLY cut notches in the ends of the dowels.



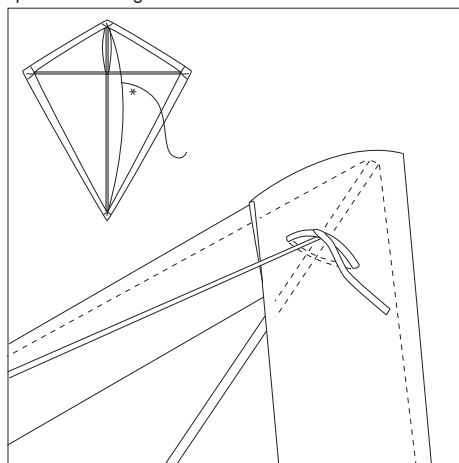
STEP 2 Cris-cross the dowels at the markings you made earlier and wrap the string around them in an X pattern to secure them. The notches should be parallel to the ground.



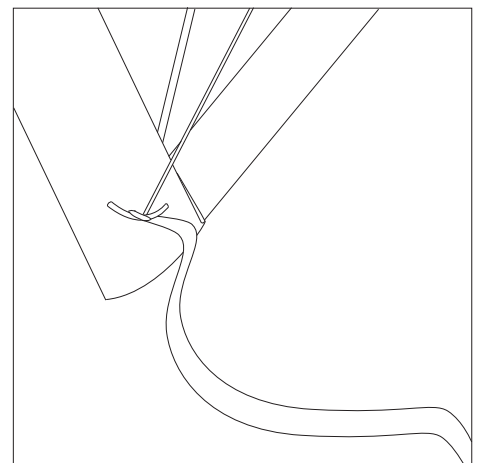
STEP 3 Thread your string through the notches to create a diamond shape. Wrap it around twice making sure to keep the string tight. Bring the end back down to the center to secure.



STEP 4 Lay the frame on top of Loop. Cut the material so that it is 2 in (5 cm) larger than the frame. Fold the edges of Loop over the frame and secure with carpet tape. Fold the corners in and reinforce them with tape.

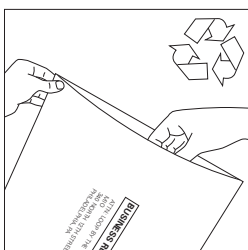


STEP 5 Make holes using a needle to secure a 24 in (60 cm) piece of string from the top corner to the bottom. Tie the remainder of your string to this line (this will be your flying string)*.



STEP 6 You can use your scraps to tie to a string for a tail. Attach your tail and fly.

Send us the scraps left over at the end of your project.
