Here's a modern, minimalist twist on the traditional "orange peel" or "pumpkin seed" quilt block. The design is clean and fresh. Make it in solids, tone-on-tones, traditional reproductions or use bright, busy prints for the leaves and a spare neutral for the backgrounds. Quilt it by hand or machine, or use a thicker thread and a large utility stitch to add visual texture. Perfect art for a special wall!

## Supplies needed

- leaves - eight $3^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ scraps
- center square - one $10^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ scrap
- borders - 1/2 yard
- backing - 3/4 yard
- binding - 1/4 yard

approximately $20-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 20-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Cut - read all directions before beginning leaves - cut eight strips $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$, one from each fabric center square - cut one square $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders - cut one rectangle $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, piece $A$. cut one rectangle 11-1/2" $\times 9^{\prime \prime}$, piece $B^{\prime}$ cut one rectangle $9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 17^{\prime \prime}$, piece $C$ cut one rectangle $4^{\prime \prime} \times 20-1 / 2$, piece $D$,

## Directions

All seams are $1 / 4$-inch

1. Sew two leaf strips together. Make four - one for each leaf.
2. Use leaf template to cut out four leaves. Note: Template does not include seam allowance.
3. Starting with piece $A$, then $B$, then $C$ and then $D$, sew borders on to the edges of center square. Press seams towards borders.
4. See diagram, right. Place the center junction of the leaves in the center of the center square. The leaf seams are at $90^{\circ}$ angles to each other. The leaves are rotated so each leaf seam is $1-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ from the
 corners of the center block. Use your favorite method to applique the leaves in place.
5. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
