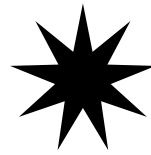


The Gypsy Quilter Jelly Roll Bowl Cozy

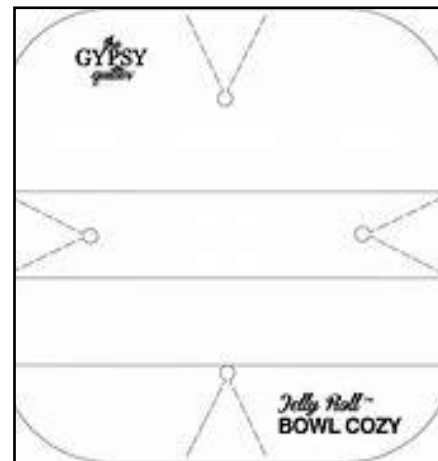
Make bowl cozies using 2 ½” strips or 12” square of focus fabric



Note: you must use 100% cotton, 100% cotton

batting, and 100% cotton fabric, 100% cotton thread for the project. Other fibers may catch fire in the microwave.

- * Please refer to batting instructions for lengths and duration of microwave capabilities.
- * Do not microwave the template.
- * Do not use a batting that contains scrim.



Prepare Batting

1 Prepare the batting or use The Gypsy Bowl Cozy Pre-Cut Batting 8ct (TGQ036) rather than cutting your own batting:

2 Place the Jelly Roll Bowl Cozy template on top of 100% cotton batting.



3 Trace around the outside of the template with a pen. Mark the darts.

4 Cut the batting out on the line you traced.

5 Cut out the darts.

6 Repeat a second time - 2 pieces of batting are required to make on Jelly Roll Bowl Cozy.

7 Set aside.



Optional Pro Tip -once your pieces are cut, fold diagonally from corner to corner and press with a hot iron. Repeat on other side. This will make a crease line from edge to edge to use as a quilting guide to quilt the X.

Prepare the fabric

If you are using a Jelly Roll

1 Sew five Jelly Roll strips together lengthwise using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams. The strip set should measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " in length.

2 Press the seams -open or to the side -the choice is yours.

3 Place the template on top of the right side of the Jelly Roll strip set.



4 Trace around the outside -do NOT mark the darts! You will not cut them here.

5 Cut out. Be sure to remove the selvage.

6 Repeat. If you cut carefully, you can get four units out of a strip set -enough to make two bowl cozies.



Fussy Cutting Motif or Vertical Stripes:

1 Place the template on the right side of the fabric.

2 Use the cross hair in the middle of the template to center your motif or vertical stripes.

3 Trace around the outside -do NOT mark the darts! You will not cut them here.

4 Cut out.

5 Repeat



Construction:



1 Place the wrong side of a piece of fabric on top of a piece of prepared batting. Quilt together as you choose.

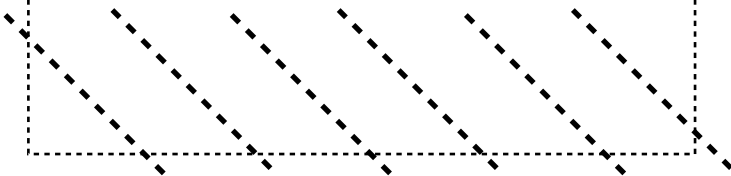


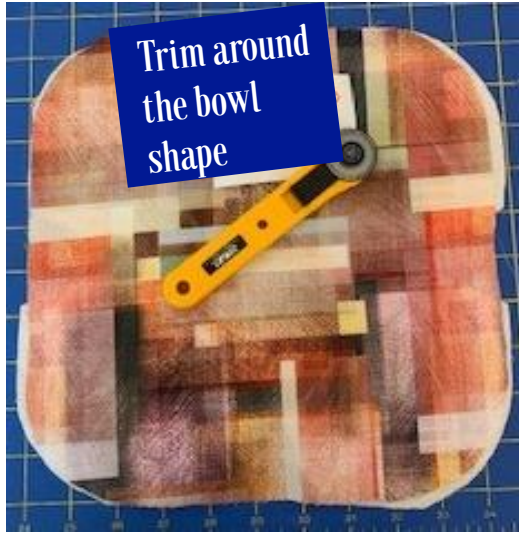
Tip: use 505 basting spray -it keeps the batting and the fabric from shifting as you quilt.

Do it Decorative - use decorative stitches on your machine to sew lines to secure the batting to the fabric.



Or stitch-in-the-ditch on your pieced lines to secure the batting to the fabric.





Tip: trim batting around the bowl - it makes the seams easier to match.

2 Once quilted, fold the fabric right sides together, lining up two angled edges of the V cut in the batting. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " in from edge of batting to the point of the dart.

Sew all four darts.

3 Repeat with the other piece of fabric and batting.

4 Place the right sides of the fabric together - matching up the darts. Sew with the darts positioned in opposite directions.

5 Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " around the cut edge - leaving an opening for turning - 2" or so.

6 Turn and press. Stitch the opening closed. Top stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the seam.
