# ORPHAN BLOCK POT HOLDER/TRIVET



### Supplies:

1 orphan block, mine is 10 ½"

1/4 yard, or fat quarter for back

1/4 yard Insul-Bright

Scrap thin cotton batting

### Front and insulating layers:

- Choose an orphan block for the front. If you prefer, you can use your favorite scrappy piecing method to create a block.
- Using the "front pattern, cut the Insulbright, thin cotton batting, and pieced block.



Handy tip: I layer these, pinned the front pattern on top and then cut all at once.

### Back of potholder:



Handy tip: I traced the pattern onto freezer paper, ironed and then cut. This way there was no slippage.

With the fabric right side up, cut

1 Right Back piece (with the straight edge along the selvage)
1 Back Left piece.

On the Back Right side fold and press a 1/2" seam along selvage. No need to stitch this edge.

On the Left Back side, make a narrow hem. Fold and press a 1/2" seam. Then fold and press it into a 1/4". Top stitch as close to the fold as possible.




With right sides up, overlap the back pieces so the sewn narrow hem is on top. Use your front pattern to help you gauge the overlap.


Tack the back pieces together.







Clip curves by making small snips toward (but not through) the stitch line.
This will allow the fabric to sit smoothly once turned right side out.



Turn, smooth seams, and press.

# Orphan Block Pot Holder Front

Use to cut:
Orphan Block
Cotton Batting
Isul-Bright

1/4" seam allowance

Use a walking foot when stitching
