Paper Selection:

There are many types of cardstock and scrapbooking paper available. ALWAYS test your paper choice. The more "fabric-like" the paper, the easier it will be to embroider.

Needle Choice:

Use a fine sharp needle. An Organ Embroidery Needle in Size 65/9 is recommended for best results.

Thread Choice:

Isacord Embroidery Thread is ideal for embroidering on paper

Supplies Needed:

- OESD Stabil-Stick Cut-Away Stabilizer or OESD Heavy Weight Tear-Away
- Embroidery Sharp Needles size 65/9
- Isacord Embroidery Thread
- Bobbin Thread
- Permanent Glue
- Cardstock paper
- Paper for inside lining (lighter weight) to cover back side of stitching (optional)

Instructions for Creating Card:

- Cut cardstock paper to 6 ½" x 9". Fold paper in half to measure 6 ½" x 4 ½" for card.
- Hoop piece of stabilizer and place hoop on the embroidery machine. Photo
 1
- Select the design and turn it upside down. Stitch the first color. This is a placement line for the card. Photo 2
- Place the front of the card right side up over the stitched placement line. Be sure the extra half of the card is inside the machine throat. Secure the card using painters tape or a spray adhesive. **Photo 3**
- Stitch the remaining colors to finish the design.
- Remove the hoop from the machine and remove the stabilizer from the hoop.
- Carefully cut away/tear away the stabilizer from the back of the design.
- Option 1: Using a lighter pre-cut weight fabric measuring 4 ½" x 6 ½" to cover up the back of the stitched design.
- Option 2: Cut lighter weight paper for the lining of the inside of the card (and hiding bobbin stitches) to $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 9". Fold in half to measure $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Use glue stick to attach lighter weight fabric to stitched card.
