



**Basic Button Beret**  
Pattern by Haley Waxberg

#### Pattern Notes

If you want to make your hat bigger and floppier just add more rows. you can throw in a couple between each of the increase/decrease rows.

#### Size

S(M, L, XL)

To fit head circumference of: 21(22, 23, 24) inches

#### Materials

- darning needle
- locking stitch markers

#### Gold Beret

(sample made in size XL)

- 2 balls of Lang Lanalux (25g/85m), colour 050
- 3.5mm-16" circular needles
- 4.5mm-16" circular needles
- 4.5mm double pointed needles

#### Black Glitter Beret

(sample made in size S)

- 2 balls of Lang Lanalux (25g/85m), colour 004
- 4mm-16" circular needles
- 5mm-16" circular needles
- 5mm double pointed needles
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#### Pink Cashmere Beret

(sample make in size M)

- 2 balls of Lana Grossa Pashmina (50g/125m), col 037
- 3.5mm-16" circular needles
- 4.5mm-16" circular needles
- 4.5mm double pointed needles

#### Gauge

Gold Beret: 22 sts & 30 rows = 10cm/4"

Black Beret: 20sts & 26 rows = 10cm/4"

Pink Cashmere Beret: 21 sts & 28 rows = 10cm/4"

#### Abbreviations

**K** knit

**K2tog** knit 2 sts together

**m1** make 1 stitch (lifted stitch increase): With left needle tip, lift

strand between needles from front to back. Knit lifted loop

through the back

**P** purl

**rep** repeat

**st/s** stitch/es

#### Instructions

With smaller circular needles cast on 90(96, 102, 108) sts. Join in the round, be careful not to twist the sts. Place marker at join.

\*K1, P1; rep from \* to end of round. Repeat this round until piece measures 1"/2.5cm from cast on.

Change to larger circular needles and knit 1 round.

\*K3, m1; rep from \* to end of rnd. 120(128, 136, 144) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 4(4, 5, 5)cm from the marker you just placed.

\*K8, m1; rep from \* to end of rnd. 135(144, 153, 162) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 5(5, 6.5, 6.5)cm from the marker you just placed.

\*K7, k2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 120(128, 136, 144) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 2(2, 2, 2)cm from the marker you just placed.

\*K2, k2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 90(96, 102, 108) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 2(2, 2, 2)cm from the marker you just placed.

\*K1, k2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 60(64, 68, 72) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 1.5(1.5, 2, 2)cm the marker you just placed.

\*K2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 30(32, 34, 36) sts. Place a locking stitch marker in the first st of the round you just worked. K for 1.5(1.5, 2, 2)cm the marker you just placed.

\*K2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 15(16, 17,18) sts.

\*K2tog; rep from \* to end of rnd. 8(8, 9, 9) sts. Break yarn leaving a 5 inch tail. Using a darning needle pull the tail through the remaining sts. weave in ends.

Block by soaking in cold water with Eucalan, wrap in towel to extract extra water and lay flat to dry.



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
