In this workshop, we'll focus on my personal technique of assembling improv curves for maximum accuracy and efficiency. This class is suitable for an advanced beginner with curve experience (or the desire to try out curves)

Landscape Quilt Panel Only

or an intermediate quilter.

- 6 Fat Quarters for mountains; an ombre selection is recommended.
- 4 Fat Eighths for the sky and sun; an ombre selection is recommended.
- 1 6" x 6" scrap for the sun
- 1 yard of backing
- 1 yard of batting
- ⁻ 1 large piece of posterboard or paper, approximately 18" x 24" or 20" x 30" (not available at the Stitchin' Post store)

<u>OR</u>

Landscape Quilt Tote Bag

- All materials listed above, plus:
- 1 yard fusible fleece
- 2 yards lining fabric
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ yards of cotton twill straps

Bring basic sewing supplies including a sewing machine and cutting mat, rulers, and cutter
