**Level:** Confident beginner and above

**Finished Size:** 16" x 12" x 3"

**Description:** Create your own portable, modern masterpiece by turning quilt blocks into a beautiful tote bag. We will make our own Feast block as the featured design, and demystify the bag construction process, even adding features such as boxed corners and a sturdy bottom. These totes are a great size for everyday use as a book or laptop bag, shopping, errands and travel. They also offer a fun way to utilize orphan quilt blocks and make a useful, thoughtful gift.

**Supply list:**

Feast pattern    Pattern is a **DOWNLOADABLE** purchase at [stitchinpost.com](https://www.stitchinpost.com)

(Note: pattern needs to be purchased before class and brought to class)

Basic quilting supplies which include: machine, thread, needle, 6" x 12" acrylic ruler, 6" x 24" acrylic ruler, cutting mat, rotary cutter, pins, sewing clips, basting spray, Hera marker or soluble pen, washi tape)

2 - 25" long straps of choice: up to 2.0 mm thick leather, cotton webbing, or pre-made

1 piece of plastic canvas or similar material at least 3" x 11½" for the sturdy bottom

2 pieces of batting, each measuring about 18" x 20", or a little bigger than your outer pieces

2 pieces of backing fabric, each measuring at least 19" x 21", or a little bigger than your batting pieces (this won't be seen)

2 pieces of lining fabric, each measuring 15¾" x 18¼"

**Fabric:**

- Background + tote back: 1 yd
- Bowl Fill: (1) 3¾" x Width of Fabric strip or (1) Fat Eighth or Fat Quarter
- Bowl Negative Space: (1) 3¾" x Width of Fabric strip or (1) Fat Eighth or Fat Quarter
