Do you ever wonder what to do with your scraps after you finish a quilt? Bring them along and in this workshop, we will walk through piecing and creating a quilt from your own scraps. We will look at design concepts that will help you use various scraps to put together a cohesive quilt. We'll also discuss options for storing scraps.

Skill Level - Beginner (with some experience sewing) Handouts provided in class

Supply List:

Students will bring their own sewing machines with a 1/4" foot. Also the following supplies:

- Fabric scraps
 - O Size of scraps: Fat quarters, Fat eighths, or other sizeable scraps (nothing smaller than 10" x 10" or strips smaller than 2" wide)
 - o Recommendation: Solids will work best with a small amount of prints
- ½ yard of a neutral solid or print that reads as a solid
- 50 wt Thread for piecing
- Standard sewing kit items (seam ripper, fabric scissors, pins, etc.)
- Small cutting mat
- Rotary cutter
- Small cutting ruler (at least 12")
