## Supply List for two 12 -inch squares:

If you choose to create larger or more pieces, adjust accordingly. I always go into a project with approximate sizes.

- Two pieces of cotton flannel, approximately $24 " \times 12$ ". White is a good choice, prewashed. Size includes enough for two squares and sashing.
- Muslin for the size of two squares approximately $24^{\prime \prime} \times 12$ ".
- Although not required, fabric that can be used as a background for each square and sashes that join the squares together. Fabrics that are fairly neutral or that read as solids are a good choice.
- Backing fabric of your choice $1 / 2$ yard that will serve as backing for the two squares plus sashing
- Variety of fabric scraps (such as small prints and large prints, stripes, or polka dots) in colors of your choice. I'm a believer in "more is better."
- Variety of threads that either match/contrast with fabrics
- Perle cotton (size 8 ) or embroidery floss of your choice and embroidery needles for stitching
- Glue stick, something like a white glue stick (I use Elmer's white glue stick)
- Sewing machine
- Scissors
- Basic sewing equipment

Optional

- Scrap or leftover blocks such as half-square triangles, log cabin, or flying geese constructions from unfinished projects.
- Although not required, some focal point fabric prints or constructions. These can be prints or fussy-cuts of everyday objects from fabrics as well as flowers or memory-type prints.
