Hi everyone! I can't wait to see you back at my favorite quilting event in July.

There is a kit fee of \$40, please bring it to class in cash. The kit contains the pattern for the quilt, including ideas for different layouts, 200 EPP papers for the houses, cardboards for the circle trees and peeper templates for fussy cutting. If you would like to include a glue pen, glue refills, Wonder Clips or milliners needles in your kit please email me AT LEAST a week before class and I can organize to bring them for you.

## Supply List: Things you will need with you for class

- Background fabric. For class you will likely only need one strip of background, cut to 5" x WOF (width of Fabric), but you can bring a couple of different ones if you want options.
- Fabric for your houses. These can be scrap a 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" will fit easily. All my houses have novelty fabrics, such as dogs, people, stars etc. fussy cut onto them, so think about what you might like to feature in your houses for fun! If you don't have a large selection of novelties, maybe bring a few pieces of the ones you do have and swap with other members of the class. We will need a total of 18 house pieces for one strip.
- Fabric for tree trunks and leaves, or for a dog. You will only need small pieces even the dog could be made from a 6" square. All appliqué instruction is for hand needle turn appliqué. If you have never done this before please bring tree fabric not dog fabric!:)
- Milliners needles #10 or #11
- 50 or 80 weight cotton thread to match or blend with your houses, and your appliqué fabrics
- A glue stick, such as a Sewline pen and refills for English Paper Piecing
- Liquid appliqué glue and a silver gel pen for my method of needle turn appliqué this is not essential if you only want to learn a circle tree, but it is if you want to learn a triangle tree or the dog!
- One or two Wonder Clips or similar
- Scissors for fabric and thread snips
- Block book. This is not essential but it's very helpful it will take a while to make all your little houses and strips. Every time I start a new quilt at home, I allocate the project its own block book. All the pieces for that quilt live inside the book until I am done, making sure they are safe, flat and together until I'm ready to use them. When you receive these material requirements, please email me sarah@sarahfielke.com, say hello and I will send you the block book pattern via PDF as a gift for taking my class. Give yourself a few weeks before class if you can so you have time to make one! They're very quick to make and very useful.

## **Before Class:**

• Please mark a length of 35 1/2" onto the WOF strip using a pencil. Then mark a line 1/4" inside each of the two long raw edges of the fabric, inside the 35 1/2" length. This will make it much easier to position the houses, and there isn't a lot of bench space to do this accurately in the classroom.
